NATURE ALBERTA ON LAKE ISLE: SEEKING VOLUNTEERS WITH BOATS

Nature Alberta is thrilled to announce that we are bringing the Love Your Lake shoreline assessment and stewardship initiative to Lake Isle this summer through our Living by Water Program. Love Your Lake is Canada's most comprehensive shoreline assessment and stewardship education initiative available to lake communities. It provides entire lakes with property-specific shoreline stewardship information and voluntary recommendations for improved lake health.

The data collected about each

shoreline property will be summarized into shoreline property reports available to each shoreline property owner. Reports will be complete with a photo of the shoreline property. The reports provide friendly information and recommendations for voluntary actions to improve the shoreline and ultimately the lake. Each report is unique to the individual property. Landowner privacy is important to the program – you can access the program's complete Privacy Policy online at LoveYour-Lake.ca.

Starting in August, you may see trained staff from Nature Alberta in a boat along the shoreline, looking at properties and taking notes. Unless invited, we will not access your property or inconvenience you at all. We will be taking photos but will not take photos with people in the field of view. We will be more than happy to tell you about the program, answer your questions, or talk with you about shoreline and lake health

We are still looking for volunteers to drive their boat on Lake Isle! HAVE YOUR SAY ON CANNABIS LEGALIZATION

Albertans are invited to participate in an online survey to provide feedback on how the province will adapt to cannabis legalization.

The survey, along with a series of stakeholder engagements, will help guide how Alberta will adapt to proposed federal legislation that would legalize cannabis by July 2018. Albertans are asked to visit alberta.ca/cannabis to learn more about cannabis legalization and participate in the survey, which will run until July 31, 2017.

"I encourage everyone to share

their views on this issue as we develop a Cannabis Framework that works for our province. Feedback from Albertans is an important part of the process. Our priorities are to keep profits away from criminals, keep cannabis out of the hands of children and protect Alberta's roads and workplaces."

In April, the federal government tabled proposed legislation which would legalize, regulate and restrict access to cannabis. The Government of Alberta has committed to engaging with Albertans. The online survey is designed to gather input on:

- · Alberta's cannabis goals
- purchasing cannabis

- using cannabis in public
- setting the legal age
- protecting roads and workplaces
- economic implications and opportunities

The government will also be conducting stakeholder roundtable meetings, sector-specific meetings and surveys at public events across Alberta.

Once the public and stakeholder engagement is complete, the input will be used to help form a Cannabis Framework, which will outline proposed next steps for Alberta. Albertans will have another opportunity to provide their feedback on the framework and the direction government will take.

HELPING MAKE ENERGY EFFICIENCY ACHIEVABLE

The Government of Alberta, through Growing Forward 2 (GF2) a federal, provincial, territorial initiative, offers two incentive-based programs aimed at helping Alberta farmers and ranchers reduce energy consumption and associated costs.

The GF2 On-Farm Energy Management Program (OFEMP) and the GF2 On-Farm Solar Photovoltaic (OFSPV) Program offer farmers and ranchers the opportunity to become energy efficient by sharing the cost to purchase energy efficient or renewable technologies. These initatives are intended to make energy efficient technology as affordable as current technology, making the environmentally friendly choice also the economically sensible choice.

There are many technologies and practices farmers and ranchers can implement on their operations to reduce their energy footprint and protect (and possibly even increase) profit margins. Carbon emission reduction and energy sustainability can both be practiced while also running an economically sustainable farm.

Eligible projects of OFEMP include:

• Construction projects that install high-efficiency equipment from the

- Retrofit projects that improve operation energy usage per unit of production; and

Eligible OFSPV systems must be:

- Grid-tied, not off-grid;
- Approved under Alberta's Micro-Generation Legislation;
- Positioned to optimize sunshine and minimize shading;
- Have manufacturer-warranties on: Solar modules, Racking, Inverters and/or Micro-inverters; and

• Producing power that is used in the production of a primary commodity.

The Government has partnered with three grassroots organizations staffed with Energy Outreach Officers whose role is to promote the OFEMP and the OFSPV Program to Alberta communities. Energy Outreach Officers are available to attend community events, talk about energy efficient technologies, answer questions about the OFEMP and OFSPV Program, and explain the benefits of these programs. The Outreach Officers are also more

than happy to meet one-on-one with you to help you find potential energy efficiency solutions for your operation.

CONTROLLED DRUGS & SUBSTANCES SEARCH WARRANT EXECUTED

St. Albert, AB – On July 6, 2017, the St. Albert RCMP Drug Unit, St. Albert RCMP General Duty, St. Albert RCMP General Investigation Section, St. Albert RCMP Crime Reduction Unit and RCMP Police Dog Services executed two Controlled Drugs and Substanc-

es (CDSA) search warrants in the sub-divisions of Patterson and Northridge.

Police located and seized a number of Controlled Substances in various forms and other items indicative of drug trafficking. Samples of the various drugs seized have been sent to Health Canada for analysis.

Items seized by police include:

• Quantities of white powder to-

talling over 3 ounces (preliminary tests are positive for Cocaine with the presence of Opiate - Fentanyl and Heroine additives).

- 115 round pink tablets (preliminary tests are positive for the presence of Cocaine).
- 4 x 12mg and 1 x 30mg Hydromorph Contin capsule
- Small quantities of Methamphetamine, Cannabis Marihuana, Hash and Hash Oil
- \$810 Canadian Currency cash seized as Proceeds of Crime

St. Albert resident Steven Scott WELLER, age 36, was arrested and charged with Possession of Cocaine - Section 4(1) CDSA, and is scheduled to appear in St. Albert Provincial Court on August 21, 2017.

St. Albert residents, Ryan MUIR, age 35, and Reina McMANUS, age 27, were arrested and charged with:

- 3 counts of Possession of a Controlled Substance for the Purpose of Trafficking Section 5(2) CDSA
- 4 counts of Possession of a Controlled Substance Section 4(1)

CDSA

• 1 count of Possession of Proceeds of Crime Under \$5000 - Section 354 C.C.

McMANUS was also charged with Disobeying a Court Order - Section 127 C.C.

McMANUS was released from police custody on a \$1000 cash bail Recognizance with several strict conditions to abide by. MUIR is presently being held in custody at the Edmonton Remand Center. MUIR and McMANUS are both scheduled to make their second appearance in St. Albert Provincial Court on July 24, 2017.



HOW TO AVOID INJURIES ON THE GOLF COURSE THIS SUMMER

(NC) For even the best of us golf can be a frustrating sport. The precision, patience, resiliency, and mental strength required challenges even the most talented and level-headed participants. With that being said golf is one of the most popular Canadian summer past times and is enjoyed by Canadians of all skill levels. While golf will undoubtedly test our mental strength, it can be even more taxing on our bodies. The constant bending over, repetitive swing motion, and hot weather conditions take a physical toll.

Here are some tips to help prepare your body for a round of golf and avoid injury:

Find your swing: It is very easy for amateur golfers to injure themselves by repeatedly doing an incorrect swing. Everyone's swing is different, but it is important to work with a swing that benefits our game and body. Consulting with a professional before hitting the links will help develop our game and avoid injury.

The right equipment: Wearing proper golf attire goes beyond simply looking the part. Your playing partners will be intimidated when they see you strut to the tee box looking like Jordan Spieth; that is until you flub your first drive 20 yards right into the water. Wearing soft spike golf shoes gives you

greater shock absorption and cushioning. This helps your back in both the short and long term.

Preparation: Always make sure to stretch your muscles prior to and after a round of golf. We may be in a rush to reach the 19th hole, but it is important to cool our muscles down after a strenuous round.

Carrying your bag: Lugging your golf bag around the course adds a lot of unnecessary stress to your body. Elect to either drive a golf cart or else push your pull your bag using a golf bag cart.

Hydrate: Hydration is fundamental to success and safety in any sport. This is magnified when we are playing an outdoor sport during the summer. Drinking water helps decrease your risk of injury and fatigue when on the golf course.

Play with this person if... you're an active calorie calculator who wants to tone up while having a good time on the greens.

9 WAYS TO IMPROVE YOUR GOLF GAME

Warmer weather sends scores of golfers to their favorite courses each and every day. Golf is a challenging pastime, but a few pointers can help golfers hone their short games, long games and everything in between.

- Choose the right clubs. There is more to selecting clubs than pulling any old iron out of your golf bag and whacking away. Wind, hazards and obstructions in landing areas should influence your decision of which club to use. Novice golfers may want to rely on their caddies to make club recommendations, and as they become more confident in their abilities they can start to make their own choices.
- Anchor your feet. Anchor your foot behind the ball to drive the ball further. Right-handed players will keep the right foot anchored, and lefties will do the opposite. Do not lift your foot prematurely; otherwise, you can lose power and distance.

- Identify your weaknesses. As with any hobby, identifying those areas that need the most work can help you become a better golfer. Keep track of each shot you take, and then look at the results to see which areas of your game need the most work.
- Fix your alignment. Align your shots by assessing the target from behind the ball. Then set the clubface behind the golf ball and align it with the target before you enter your stance.
- Use your torso for power. The torso is essential to a solid swing. Practice rotating from your core to control your backswing and then maintain the same spine angle and posture on the downswing.
- Use the wind. Not every golf game will be played in perfect weather. A good player knows how to make adjustments for the wind depending on the shot. Use the wind to your advantage when you can,

and adjust your swing when hitting into the wind.

• Become a better chipper. Many players put so much emphasis on their backswings and putt shots that they fail to devote any practice to chips. All shots are important for golfers trying to shed strokes off of their scores.

• Keep fit. Maintaining or improving your physical strength and overall health can help your golf game. Exercise and eat right, and you will have more endurance on the links.

STRUCTURE FIRE IN THE VILLAGE OF ALBERTA BEACH

Submitted by David Ives, Fire Chief | Onoway Regional Fire Service

At 2359 Tuesday July 18, 2017 Onoway Regional Fire Services – Canada's first Hybrid Fire Service was paged out to a confirmed structure fire – unknown injuries – unknown entrapment on 58A Avenue, Alberta Beach. Onoway Regional Fire had units rolling within 2-minutes of the call with the first unit arriving on scene within five-minutes of the initial page out.

Upon their arrival, fire crews observed a large fire whereas a detached garage was fully engulfed in flames and the roof fully burned off. The heat had ignited a nearby automobile and was threatening many more as well as two residences. Within four minutes of arrival on scene water was being applied to adjacent structures and vehicles to protect exposures.

Because of the quick response and hard work of the men and women of Onoway Regional Fire, the "All

Clear" was given within seven-minutes of arrival. The situation was considered contained with no fire spread and no injuries by 0033 – 29 minutes after the arrival of the first fire unit. During the firefight Onoway Regional Fire Services mobilized three firefighting units, sixteen members, and applied over 32,000 liters of water. We are very proud of our firefighter's skills and dedication.

Onoway Regional Fire would also like to thank Parkland Emergency Communications Center for their expert dispatch assistance and Lac Ste Anne County Fire Services for providing two additional loads of water for fire suppression activities. We'd also like to remind all residents to be carful with storage of flammable substances, ensure all heat sources are properly maintained, and keep your garages / outbuildings / storage facilities secured.
