The RCMP is asking to respect the family's privacy during their time of grief, the boy's name will not be released.

TWO ARRESTS WITHIN FOUR DAYS IN LOCAL BUSINESS BREAK AND ENTER

File: 2017-1024621 & 2017-1007188 - Two men have been charged in connection with two separate break and enters at Ron Hodgson dealership that took place on August 1st and August 4th, 2017.

St. Albert RCMP responded to a break and enter in progress complaint at Ron Hodgson dealership at around 1:15 am on Tuesday, August 1st, 2017. St. Albert RCMP members quickly attended the location and a male was located in the secure compound and was subsequently arrested. Timothy John MAMMEN, age 43 of Edmonton was charged with break and enter, possession of break in instruments and breach of conditions. MAMMEN was remanded in custody and is scheduled

to appear in St. Albert Provincial Court on August 14th, 2017.

At approximately 1:10 am on August 4th, 2017, St. Albert RCMP responded to a break and enter in progress complaint at Ron Hodgson dealership. On arrival, one male was observed in the secured compound. The man fled the scene on foot but was quickly apprehended after a foot chase by a St. Albert RCMP officer. Mason LANDRY, age 19 of St. Albert was charged with break and enter. LANDRY was remanded in custody and is scheduled to appear in St. Albert Provincial Court on August 14th, 2017.

I enjoy being in the riding during the summer where I can reconnect with my constituents. After Parliament adjourned for the summer, I began my travels throughout the region.

At the end of June, I hosted a roundtable discussion with local officials regarding freshwater lakes in Yellowhead. I also attended the Hinton Beaver Boardwalk, as well as a geothermal energy information session.

While in Ottawa for the first

week of July, I met with nine constituents who were visiting the capital. Also that week, I participated in events at Parliament Hill and the United States Embassy. I was back in the riding at the end of the week to attend Edson's Great Canadian BBQ in the Park, as well as plant a commemorative tree at the George Pegg Historical Garden in Glenevis.

For the week of July 10, I spent time in my Edson office meeting with constituents regarding various issues such as veterans and softwood lumber. I also participated in the Edson Summer Festival, handing out flags and conversing with local residents.

The following week, I attended Edson's Rotary Club meeting and later participated in a conference call. Midweek, I made a trip up to Grande Cache to attend several meetings regarding local issues and later attended the Town Council meeting. On Thursday, I was in my Rocky Mountain House office where I met with constituents and walked around the Market on Main in the evening. On the weekend, I visited Bench Creek Brewery in Edson before going to the "Got Your Six" shooting

competition, which was a local fundraiser to raise awareness of PTSD.

For the last week of July, I met with constituents in my Edson office. I also met with a local radio station and recorded two messages. On the Thursday, I participated in TransAlta's tour of their Brazeau Hydro Plant and coal facilities in Wabamun.

August promises to be another good month where I can meet up with many of my constituents before heading back to Ottawa in September.

PRO-ACTIVE FOOT PATROL LEADS TO ARREST OF 4 YOUTH

ed and have been charged with Breaking and Entering. Court has been set for August 18th, 2017.







RCMP INVESTIGATE PERSONATION OF PEACE OFFICER

Westlock, Alberta – Westlock RCMP has charged a St. Albert man with two counts of personation of a peace officer while the St. Albert RCMP Detachment continues to investigate the same man for related offences.

On Thursday, July 27, 2017, the Westlock RCMP Detachment received a report from the driver of a vehicle which had been involved in an alleged "traffic stop" conducted by a man who presented himself as a police officer. The complainant told police that they had been followed by a light-coloured sport utility vehicle (SUV) from Westlock which activated red and blue lights as the two vehicles neared Fawcett, Alberta. The complainant pulled over to the side of the road, as did the SUV. A man got out of the SUV and presented himself as

a police officer advising the complainant he had pulled them over for an alleged traffic violation and requested to see their driver's license, vehicle registration and insurance. The man was described as being Caucasian, with short dark hair, wearing dark blue clothing and a hat. The documentation was returned to the complainant, who was then asked to have their thumb "scanned" by a device presented by the man in question. Afterward, the complainant was allowed to leave.

A second complaint was received by Westlock RCMP on Saturday, July 29, wherein a truck and trailer had been pulled over by a SUV similar in appearance to the one described in the incident reported to the detachment two days previously. Again, it involved a lone man driving a light-coloured SUV who conducted a similar "traffic stop" with the driver of the truck



near Fawcett, Alberta.

In both cases, the complainants were unharmed.

The investigation of these two occurrences has resulted in 36-yearold St. Albert resident, Mark Andrew Capowski*, being charged with two counts of personating a peace officer. He is to appear in provincial court in Westlock on Wednesday, August 23, 2017.


Members of the St. Albert RCMP Detachment assisted Westlock RCMP in their investigation by executing a search warrant at Mr. Capowski's residence in St. Albert which resulted in the seizure of evidence which has prompted continued investigation by the St. Albert RCMP General Investigation Section (GIS).

Police are requesting the public's assistance in locating a grey 2015 Chevrolet Suburban, with black push-bars on the front bumper, tinted windows, and black rims,



bearing Alberta license plate, BWL 2384. It is believed that this vehicle may have been involved in the two incidents investigated by Westlock RCMP and may be connected to additional information gathered by investigators at the St. Albert RCMP Detachment who are conducting an ongoing investigation of their own.

Anyone who may have information relating to the whereabouts of the vehicle of interest or who may have had an experience similar to those described above is asked to call the St. Albert RCMP Detachment. Please take note. The fire stations of Onoway and Alberta Beach are **NOT** operated by Lac Ste. Anne County. They are operated by North West Fire Rescue-Onoway Ltd. Operating as Onoway Regional Fire Services.

If you are a county property owner and your insurer is using the Alberta Beach or Onoway Fire Halls as your primary fire station; Be advised that Lac Ste. Anne County does not support automatic aid with Onoway Regional Fire Services and as such Onoway Regional Fire Services cannot guarantee response.

RAMIFICATIONS:

This may be of particular concern to the residents of Aspen Hills, Hillview Estates, Bilby Heights, Gunn, Corsair Cove, Water's Edge, Lakeside Estates, Lakeshore Cove, Windmill Harbour, Lake Ste. Anne Settlement, Thibault Settlement, Paradise Estates, Johnson Park, Diamond Country Estates along with the motoring public in the area. As these areas are notably closer to Alberta Beach and Onoway Stations.

North West Fire Rescue – Onoway Ltd (Operating as Onoway Regional Fire Services) operates composite fire stations consisting of full time, part time, casual and paid on call first responders. This allows Onoway Regional Fire to boast average roll out times of less than three minutes and ensures all members are professionally accredited within their scopes. North West Fire Rescue – Onoway favors "Automatic Aid" (both fire services) to all locations within 25KM of Onoway and Alberta Beach. Lac Ste. County does not.





I was listening to the talk radio station and heard an interview that was absolutely incredible. The person being interviewed was author and journalist Ted Barris and the subject was regarding his newest book "Breaking the Silence - Veterans Untold Stories". I was so impressed that I searched the subject and found the following Commendation: "On July 27, 2011, the Minister of Veteran Affairs for Canada awarded 19 citizens his annual commendation. Traditionally, the award is "presented to those veterans...who, in an exemplary way, have contributed either to the care and well-being of veterans or to the remembrance of the sacrifices and achievements of Canadians in armed conflict." Most of the 2011 recipients are veterans. Ted Barris, a civilian, also received the commendation. His citation read, in part: "Ted Barris has made such exemplary contributions by generously giving of himself and so both benefiting veterans and making manifest the principle that Canada's obligation to all who have served in the cause of Peace and Freedom, must not be forgotten. SOLAR ECLIPSES AND ONOWAY SCHOOL DAYS

Submitted by Yvonne Slemko | Onoway and District Historical Guild

The solar eclipse which will occur in this part of the world on August 21 will not be the spectacle that was anticipated. As the total eclipse crosses the U.S. from Oregon to South Carolina, coverage of the sun in Edmonton on that day will be 70%. Detect-

able dimming in daylight hours starts to happen at around 90% coverage.

The imminent eclipse brings to mind two incidents that occurred in County of Lac Ste. Anne schools in the 1970s and early 90s. On February 26, 1979, students were confined to their classrooms during the eclipse, blinds were closed shut and students were not allowed

to venture outside. The Board's legal team had suggested that action for fear that students would damage their eyes by looking at the sun and litigation would result. During the other eclipse in 1991 (an 11:00 a.m. eclipse), buses did not do the morning run until the eclipse was over – again a precaution in case inquisitive students wanted to view the eclipse. Once more, an

insurance concern.

That said, an eclipse, no matter how "total", was a teachable moment. With #14 welding glass provided by local welders, students were marched outside, four to six at a time, to view the eclipse. Excitement was rampant and oohs and ahs were the order of the day.

The 2017 version of the eclipse will begin at 10:24 a.m., peak at 11:35 a.m. and end at 12:49 p.m. The Telus World of Science will host free activities from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on that day. Under no circumstance should anyone view the eclipse with the naked eye.

The good news is that if you can hang around for 27 years, Edmonton will witness at total solar eclipse on August 22, 2044. A solar eclipse occurs when the moon passes between the earth and the sun.

NEW DAIRY INVESTMENT PROGRAMS

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform local farmers of two new investment programs aimed at dairy producers and processors.

The programs will help the sector increase productivity and competitiveness and prepare for the implementation of the Canada-European Union Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA), which was negotiated by the previous Conservative Government and will establish greater access for European cheeses into Canada.

The first is a five-year, \$250 million Dairy Farm Investment Program to help Canadian cow's milk producers improve productivity through upgrades to their equipment. All producers of cow's milk - irrespective of the size of their operations - are welcome to apply. This program will cover up to 50% of

approved project costs, up to a maximum of \$250,000. Applications will be accepted as of August 22.

The second is a four-year, \$100 million Dairy Processing Investment Fund that will provide funding to help the Canadian dairy processing sector make investments to improve productivity and prepare for increased competition in the domestic market as a result of CETA. Notfor-profit organizations involved in the dairy sector can also apply. Applications are now being accepted.

"Local farmers are key contributors to and important members of our communities. I encourage all eligible producers to take advantage of this investment opportunity," concluded MP Eglinski.
