# SCHOOL TRUSTEESHIP MATTERS!

In 2017, preserving the community voice of locally-elected school board trustees on education in Alberta is more important than ever before. That's why preparations are well under way at Grande Yellowhead Public School Division for this fall's school board trustee elections.

"School board trustees are elected to be the voice of their local communities, and education is one of the most important issues in every community," said GYPSD Board Chair Brenda Rosadiuk.

Across the province, there are 61 public, separate and francophone

school boards – all represented by the Alberta School Boards' Association – with a total of more than 400 locally-elected school board trustees. These trustees collectively make decisions on behalf of about 600,000 students in kindergarten to Grade 12, and decide the best ways to allocate a total of \$6 billion in taxpayer dollars on local education priorities. Grande Yellowhead's seven trustee board manages a \$62 million budget with the responsibility of educating over 4,100 students.


Alberta school communities continue to benefit from the local representation of the trustees they elect every four years, along with their municipal elected officials.

"We know our communities are knowledgeable, engaged, and care



seasonal shut-down is due to concerns with the contractor not being able to complete the Highway 748 road tie-in before winter.

conditions and is required to meet strict environmental requirements during all phases of the building of the new bridge.

The project remains on track and is scheduled to be completed by the 2018 contract completion date.

(FCSS) grants available for 2017. The grants enable County communities to develop or enhance their own programs and services. These programs are usually about improving the social well-being of individuals, families, and the community.

FCSS Supervisor Wendy Robinson shares: "The County has a lot of distinct communities and we can't provide services and programs in all of the areas. Grants are a way for communities to create their own resources and also maintain ownership and responsibility, they truly reflect the needs and strengths of individual communities."

Grants are available for groups that want to offer workshops, programs or services that are socially preventive in nature. As a result, the FCSS Advisory Board has identified specific areas for grants, including intergenerational programs, social seniors, multicultural activities and child and youth projects. As well, a "NeighbourLinking" grant is available for individuals that would like to hold an event for neighbours to get to know each other, similar to a block party in a town.

FCSS has been providing grants to communities and programs for many years. An example of a grant project that has been locally run and highly successful over the years is the Grandparent Program run by the Wildwood Seniors, in partnership with the Wildwood School.

FCSS grant applications are reviewed and approved through the FCSS Advisory Board. The board meets bi-monthly and will be accepting grant applications until October 18th, for the November 1st FCSS Board Meeting. Grant requests in excess of \$10,000 must be approved by Council.

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
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


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

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# YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Redistrict in Niton Public Hearing – A Public Hearing was held for Bylaw 11.17 that would allow staff accommodation on a property in Niton Junction. The current zoning does not allow for staff accommodation. The bylaw will be brought back for additional readings to a future council meeting. No input from the general public was brought forward during the hearing.

Peers ASP Public Hearing – A Public Hearing was held for the Peers Area Structure Plan (ASP). The Peers ASP (Bylaw 2.17) provides a framework for the long-term growth and development in the Hamlet of Peers. Public engagement for the new Peers ASP has included public meetings and engagement with individual hamlet landowners. The Peers ASP will be brought to a future council meeting for final adoption.

Edson IDP Public Hearing – A Public Hearing Council was held for the Edson IDP (Bylaw 3.17). The updated Edson IDP is an agreement between Yellowhead County and the Town of Edson and defines what will be allowed for future development where the two municipalities' borders meet (the Edson Fringe Area). This updated plan is considerably more concise, easier to understand and is organized to enhance its use. The Edson IDP will be brought to a future council meeting for final adoption. Public engagement for this plan has included two well attended public meetings.

Continuation of Grazing Lease - Based on a Council decision, Yellowhead County will enter into a lease agreement with Gloria Lowey for Pt. SE 11-54-16-W5M at a rate of \$138.60 per year for a five year term. This will allow Lowey to take over the grazing lease which was previously leased to her husband.

The next scheduled Council Meeting is September 26, 2017. The September 19, 2017 Committee of the Whole Council Meeting is cancelled. Meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.

# PREVENT STAIRWAY INJURIES

Stairs are a necessity in many homes. While stairs serve a practical purpose, they also have the potential to be dangerous.

According to the National Safety Council, more than one million injuries result each year from stairway falls. Staircase and stairway accidents constitute the second leading cause of accidental injury, second only to motor vehicle accidents. Each year, there are 12,000 stairway accident deaths. The Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation states that a large portion of Canadians who visit hospitals after a fall on or from stairs or steps in their homes are seniors (men and women age 65 years or older).



However, many stairway falls can be prevented with some simple planning.

· Install sturdy handrails. A common contributor to stairway falls is a failure to use handrails. Sturdy handrails can decrease fall rates. Even if a person slips, he or she may be able to prevent the fall by grabbing on to the handrails and regaining some of his or her balance.

· Rely on highlighters or friction strips. According to a study titled "Safety on stairs: Influence of a tread edge highlighter and its position," by Richard J. Foster, fall risk may be reduced by using a highlighter positioned flush with the tread edge. This helps make stairs more visible, particularly for those with impaired vision.

Improve lighting on staircases. Failure to see steps may contribute to falls as well. Staircases should be well lit so that residents and guests know where to step. Subtle foot-level lighting can be installed to make it easier for people who frequently use steps at night.

Use slip-resistant materials. Slip-resistant surface material acceptable for normal floors should work on stair treads. Loose rugs should not be placed at the top or bottom of the landing. Outdoors, rough finishes are recommended, particularly on stairs that are subject to getting wet.

· Improve step geometry. If slips and falls frequently occur on a particular staircase, consider the relationship between the rise and the run, advises the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety. The National Building Code of Canada says that, within a staircase, treads should have a uniform run and tread depth that does not vary more than 0.5 to 1 cm. Steep steps with high risers and/or short treads can increase the risk of falls.

· Clear away clutter. One easy way to prevent falls is to keep stairs free of clutter. This means removing shoes, toys and other belongings that may be left on stairs or landings.

Many falls on stairs can be prevented by being mindful of certain risk factors.

Young parents living in cities face difficult decisions regarding their living arrangements. The suburbs versus city debate is one many young married couples have had, and that discussion is often prompted by the arrival of children.

the door, making a daily effort to keep kitchen counters and tables, coffee tables and other areas that tend to accumulate clutter clear of clutter. Reducing clutter also makes homes safer for young children, making it easier for them to navigate a home while reducing choking hazards.

· Keep hosting duties to a minimum. Many men and women love to host friends and family, and that desire to host won't subside simply because you live in a city. But even if you love to host, host more intimate gatherings so you are not forced to use your already limited storage space to store items, such as extra plates, utensils and drinking glasses, that you will only use every so often. Fewer guests means fewer items you need to

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· Go easy on the tots' toys. · Think vertically. Single-family home owners may not need to make much use of the vertical

space in their homes, but such is not often the case with apartment dwellers. Utilizing vertical space in an apartment can be as simple as buying some shelving units or bookcases. To be safe, keep items the kids will use on


lower shelves so they are not tempted to do some climbing to reach their toys or books.


