

Cold Lake RCMP Recover boats stolen in Calmar

Cold Lake, Alberta - During the afternoon of September 23, 2017,

Cold Lake RCMP recovered 3 of 4 boats stolen from Wizard Lake Marine during the night of September 13, 2017.

The three boats, with trailers, valued at approximately \$600,000.00 were located at a rural property near Cold Lake.

During the search of the property, an additional \$250,000.00 worth of stolen property was recovered by Cold Lake RCMP.

Two adult males are in custody with charges pending. The investigation is continuing by Cold Lake and Leduc RCMP detach-



Leduc RCMP investigate thefts of boats

Calmar, Alberta – Leduc RCMP are investigating the theft of four boats and trailers worth a total estimated value of \$800,000.

On September 13, 2017 Leduc RCMP responded to a complaint of a break and enter at a boat dealership. It occurred sometime in the early morning, after 01:00 a.m. The boats are all 23' Nautique Super Air G23, and each boat and trailer combination is worth approximately \$200,000.

Investigation thus far indicates that four pick-ups were used and they left the dealership eastbound on Highway 39. A description of the suspects is not currently available.

These boats are very recognizable and Leduc RCMP are seeking public assistance in locating these boats and identifying the culprits involved.

COUNTY HOSTING PUBLIC HEALTH INSPECTOR INFORMATION SESSION

Yellowhead County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) will be hosting two information sessions with the local Public Health Inspectors; one in Marlboro, one in Mackay; this October. Do you know when, or if, you need to get a permit for your event that is serving food? Do you know if you require the Safe Food Handling course for your activities?

The Public Health Inspector will be able to clarify the rules and regulations relating to serving food at a public gathering, permits that may, or may not, be necessary, and clarify any misinformation that may be circulating about serving/offering food to the public. This information session is geared towards people that are working with community groups or markets, and non-profits serving/selling food in a public setting. It will also include a Q&A session for any unanswered questions, and pamphlets and information will be made available regarding rules, regulations and permits.

• Marlboro Community Hall, 7:30-9:00 PM + Q&A, October 19th.



YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Community Services Strategic Plan - The Community Services Strategic Plan was presented to Council by the consultancy firm that was hired to evaluate and make recommendations on the current level of services and facilities available to residents in Edson and area. The report highlighted the opportunities and needs for parks and recreation, arts and culture, museums and archives, and library services. The report, which is intended for future decision-making by the upcoming council after the election, will be brought back to Council on October 10, 2017 for final adoption and is available to view in the September 26 Council agenda.

Edson Rec Complex - A letter will be sent to Edson Council letting them know Council's views on the potential sale of the Edson Recreation Complex. The letter will address concerns that council has regarding the short timeframe available for input from the general public and what affect the sale of the complex could have on county residents. Another concern is that the offer on the complex is below market value. The County contributes approximately \$55,000 to \$80,000 per year towards the facility and funded half a million towards paving the road that leads to this facility.

2017 Ag Bursary – Two \$500 Agricultural Services bursaries were awarded to two students from Yellowhead County who are currently studying at a post-secondary institution in fields related to agricultural, environmental, or animal sciences. Each year the Yellowhead County Agricultural Services Board, on behalf of Yellowhead County, awards two \$500 bursaries.

Peers ASP – Council adopted the Peers Area Structure Plan (ASP). The Peers ASP (Bylaw 2.17) provides a framework for the long-term growth and development in the Hamlet of Peers. Public engagement for the creation of the new Peers ASP included public meetings, a public hearing, a survey, and one-on-one engagement with individual landowners.

Edson IDP – The updated Edson Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) (Bylaw 3.17), which defines future development opportunities and restrictions where

the two municipalities' borders meet, was adopted by Council. This updated plan, considered to be more concise and easier to understand than the previous version, is an agreement between Yellowhead County and the Town of Edson and represents the area known as the Edson Fringe Area.

Redistrict in Niton –Bylaw 11.17 was adopted by Council and will allow for the property owner to apply for a development permit for staff accommodation on this property. A Public Hearing was held for Bylaw 11.17 on September 12, 2017.

The Yellowhead County Municipal Election is Monday, October 16, 2017.

The next Council Meetings is October 10, 2017 at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.


We ask that you please be cautious when you see farm equip-

get their work completed—we thank you for your patience and attention when sharing the road with them. Remember: we all share the responsibility of keeping our roadways safe.





- Bill C-58 An Act to amend the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Second Reading)
- Bill C-325 An Act to amend the Canadian Bill of Rights (right to housing) (Second reading)
- Bill C-345 An Act to amend the Canada Labour Code (pregnant and nursing employees) (Second Reading)
- Bill S-231 An Act to amend the Canada Evidence Act and the Criminal Code (protection of journalistic sources) (Second Reading)

- Emergency Debate Situation of the Rohingyas





RCMP IDENTIFY BATTERY THEFT SUSPECTS

Submitted by Stony Plain / Spruce Grove / Enoch RCMP

UPDATE:

Enoch, Alberta – The RCMP have arrested and charged two males identified as the suspects in a battery theft investigation.

As a result of assistance by the Strathcona County RCMP in identifying the suspect photos released on September 15, 2017, two males have been charged in relation to a break-in and battery theft which occurred in Enoch between September 1 and September 5, 2017.

32-year-old Cody Henrikson of Edmonton and 35-year-old Christopher McColman of Mossbank, Saskatchewan are both facing one criminal charge of break and enter and commit theft over \$5,000.

Henrikson has been released from custody and is on several conditions. He is scheduled to appear in Provincial Court of Alberta in Stony Plain on October 4, 2017.

McColman remains in custody and has a hearing scheduled for today at the Provincial Court of Alberta in Edmonton.

The media and general public is thanked for their assistance in this investigation. The RCMP continue to investigate other battery thefts.

ORIGINAL RELEASE:

Enoch, Alberta – The Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP have received nine complaints of battery thefts since August 24, 2017 and, led by the Serious Crimes Unit, are investigating all incidents. The batteries have been stolen from cell towers in various locations, and it is possible are being sold to scrap metal businesses.

Complaints have also been received by several other RCMP detachments surrounding the Edmonton hub area. RCMP

members from all detachments are collaborating on investigating these incidents.

Culprits are accessing locked compounds and breaking into cell tower sites in order to remove the batteries. The batteries vary in value but are all deemed to be valuable. The cell tower sites are owned by different agencies. Some of the batteries stolen are described as 12 volt deep cycle batteries. Brands; Deka Unigy, C&D Technologies Long Duration Series, Northstar NSB 170FT.

While it is not established that these thefts are all related, RCMP are diligently working to solve individual investigations with a hope to solving all.

MAKE LIGHTS SPARKLE

As days get shorter and natural light is less abundant, interior lighting becomes ever more important. Chandeliers, pendant lamps, recessed lighting, and tableside lamps are most effective when they are clean. HGTV experts say dirty lights can give off up to 20 percent

less light than clean ones. Dirty fixtures also waste energy.

Lighting fixtures that are within reach are easy to tackle, but what about those fixtures that hang or have multiple crystals, globes or bulbs? These tips can cut down on the time needed to give lights a

thorough cleaning.

- Stock up on the right cleaning supplies. Microfiber dusting cloths are smart choices because they can help trap grime and tend to be machine-washable and reusable. Extendable static-charged dusters are another handy item to have around, particularly for fixtures that are hard to reach.
- Dust regularly. Dusting regularly can prevent the buildup of grime that's difficult to wash off. Try to dust light fixtures weekly or biweekly. The more frequent the fixtures are dusted, the less time each cleaning session will take. Soft cloths can remove the dust from most bulbs and exterior surfaces. Lamp shades may need more attention. Use a lamb's-wool duster to attract dirt so it doesn't leave a residue on the lampshade.
- Deep-clean at table level. Deep-cleaning at table level is more manageable. Remove any glass ac-

cents and set them out on a cushioned surface so they do not break. Soft cloths dampened with a vinegar solution should remove most of the dirt on chandelier crystals and the globes or outer glass coverings of other types of fixtures. Take a photo of the lighting fixture prior to cleaning so you'll know how to replace removed parts correctly once everything is clean and dry.

If you cannot remove a fixture for cleaning, use a sturdy stool, a spray bottle with your cleaning mixture and a soft cloth to wipe away the dirt. Remember to place something absorbent beneath the light to catch any drips. Do not spray liquids directly onto light bulbs; otherwise, you can damage the bulb and the electrical components.

It's best to exercise caution when cleaning lighting fixtures. Turn off the light itself and shut off the circuit breaker to avoid the risk of shock or burns from hot bulbs.
