FIRE PREVENTION WEEK: PLAN TWO WAYS OUT

Fire Prevention Week 2017 reminds Albertans to practice a home escape plan with a second way out of rooms and their home.

While a door is the most obvious evacuation route from a room, home or apartment, this year's Fire Prevention Week theme, "Every second counts: Plan two ways out" urges Albertans to think carefully about having another way out.

- Practice your fire escape plan
- draw a map of your home,

including all doors and windows

- find two ways out of every room

- make sure doors and windows are not blocked
- choose an outside meeting place

- push the test button to sound the smoke alarm (test smoke alarm monthly)

- practice your fire drill with everyone in the home
- get outside to your meeting place

"Families that have a home fire escape plan and practice it are much more likely to get out of their homes safely. I've made it a priority in my home to have a plan in place to protect my fam-

ily, and I think it's important for all Albertans to do the same. Knowing what to do and where to go, especially if your doors are blocked, can save lives." - Shaye Anderson, Minister of Municipal Affairs

"A fire escape plan needs to be practical and easy for your family to follow. This also means having a complete plan for safely using an alternate escape such as a window. If you have questions about using a second escape route when making your plan, contact your local fire department for advice." - Kevan Jess, Acting Alberta Fire Commissioner

“During an emergency, there is no time to stop and think about an escape route. Edmonton Fire Rescue Services encourages everyone to prepare an escape plan and practice the escape plan in

order to spare valuable seconds in a real emergency. It is especially important to determine a meeting place close by that everyone is familiar with and is easy to remember so that every family member can be accounted for in the event you are sepa-

rated.” - Ken Block, Fire Chief, Edmonton Fire Rescue Services
 During Fire Prevention Week, kindergarten to Grade 6 students from across Alberta complete the “Fire Safety Starts With You” activity book, which teaches early elementary students important

life-saving steps they can take to protect themselves, their families and their homes from fire. The Government of Alberta’s Office of the Fire Commissioner and ATCO distributed more than 270,000 activity books across the province this year.

“Fires can be deadly and devastating. That’s why we’re pleased to work with fire departments across Alberta, participate in Alberta Fire Prevention Week and support the Fire Prevention Week Children’s Program. Fire prevention should be a part of our everyday lives. Let’s keep everyone safe by making sure there are two ways out of every room in our house in case of fire, smoke or carbon monoxide alarm. Every second counts.” - Dean Reeve, senior vice president & general manager, ATCO Gas Distribution

Quick facts

- Fire Prevention Week 2017 runs from Oct. 8 to 14, which marks the anniversary of the Great Chicago Fire in 1871.
- In 2016, there were 4,324 fires in Alberta resulting in 29 deaths and 166 injuries.
- Cooking fires, fires caused by smokers’ materials and fires involving electrical wiring in the home accounted for 68 per cent of all home fires from 2007 to 2016. Other common fire causes include arson and deliberately set fires, heating equipment and appliances.
- Properly maintained smoke alarms provide reliable, early notification allowing your family to escape and call the fire department.
- From 2012 to 2016, the smoke alarm did not activate due to power failure (no battery, dead battery or disconnection from home wiring) in 27 per cent of the fires where a smoke alarm was present.

With the help from a grant provided by Alberta Prevents Cancer, the Thrive Wellness committee chose to focus on healthy eating and worked on creating a community garden this summer.

Local junior high school students were tasked with building raised planters. 9 planters were

completed and placed by volunteers in the old Lion's Park located across from the new fire hall. Local gardeners signed up to tend to their own plots over the summer. The county provided garbage bins and picnic tables. The Lutheran church supplied water. Volunteers maintained two planters and the produce was donated to the local WEE

food bank to provide healthy options for the hampers.

A facebook page was created for the "Thrive Community Garden". Photos and events were posted throughout the year to engage members to getting involved. More planters will be built over the winter and a grand opening will take place in the spring of 2018.

Supports for Students

Karen Shipka, Assistant Superintendent, Learning Services, provided a detailed report on the inclusive learning

supports for students in kindergarten to Grade 12 and information on the Program Unit Funding Report (PUF). Grande Yellowhead supports an Inclusive Learning model "Success For All x All Kids Are Our Kids = One Year's Growth" through a variety of means:

- A School Linked Team comprising of speech-language pathologists, occupational therapist, mental health capacity building coordinator, technology lead/literacy lead teachers, PUF coordinator, assessment and mentorship supervisor and divisional psychologists;
- Family School Liaison Counselors

in each of our schools in four zones, and a Community Outreach worker in Jasper;

- Mental Health Capacity Building Project which provides universal mental health programming in four communities;
- Program Unit Funding supports a variety of resources for our early childhood services programs;
- Implementation of Individual School Action Plans based the identification of a school's greatest areas of need as per data analysis of various assessments, survey results and other

sources; and

- Specific Zone Meetings which are scheduled on a six week rotation for school-based teams to collaborate on a regular basis with the divisional School Linked Team to ensure supports are in place for every student to achieve 'one year's growth'.

Carra Aschenmeier from Learning Services also provided an update on the creation of this year's Superintendent Youth Council which will be comprised of five high school students per high school, who will meet up to three times a year with senior division administration including the Superintendent of Schools, Ms. Lewis.

21st Century Learning involves access to up-to-date technology and trustees were pleased to hear about the exciting new projects and initiatives in place at GYPSD schools. These include the addition of makerspaces, a digital lending library, g:/suite migration and increased infrastructure including an increase in security measures and upgrades. The technology department will also be hosting a world class Google training event for all GYPSD staff in both Hinton and Jasper in October.

Other News in Brief

Trustees approved their 2016-17 Board Self-Evaluation Report completed during a recent Board workshop. The report outlined the Board's performance over the past year and defines areas of significant emphasis for them to focus on during the upcoming year.

As per a request from Grande Yellowhead's Board, the Province agreed to fully cover the expense of the re-installation of the playground from Evergreen School to Mary Bergeron Elementary, the division's new replacement school in Edson.

The approval of the use of special ballots for this year's election process was approved today. The Division recognizes the need to provide electors with the opportunity to vote, even though they are temporarily away from their residence, or unable to utilize either the regular, or advance polls.

In accordance with Policy 7 - Board Operations, trustee honoraria were reviewed for the 2017-18 school year and the Board moved that amounts would not increase for the upcoming year.

Representatives from the Hinton Geothermal Project presented to the Board on the current status of the project in the town and the possible partnership opportunities with Grande Yellowhead for the facilities themselves as well as future career pathways for students.

TAXATION OF PRIVATE CORPORATIONS

Submitted by Jim Eglinski, MP -- Yellowhead

On July 18, the Minister of Finance released a white paper outlining the government's plan to tax private corporations. Since that tax plan was released, my office has been receiving emails and phone calls from small-business owners, nurses, farmers, insurance brokers, and accountants – all deeply concerned about the proposed changes. And they should be. For decades, tax planning measures for private corporations have been recognized as legitimate by the government,

and for good reason. They help mitigate personal risk assumed when starting a small business.

The fact is that business owners must risk their own capital, often securing borrowed funds against personal assets, such as the family home. They do not have many benefits that are often available to employees, such as pension plans and extended health coverage. Business owners often establish pension plans and benefit packages for their own employees, at their own expense. They pay into CPP as both the owner and the employee, while also contributing the employer's

share of CPP and EI for their other employees. These Canadians put in endless hours of hard work and take on a lot of risk to make sure their businesses are running smoothly and their employees are paid.

Most local business owners are middle class Canadians — the people who put their time, effort, and sweat into paying the bills and paying their employees before they pay themselves. They're not big multinational corporations. Now the government is targeting them with a massive tax hike, threatening jobs and the communities that are sustained by our local businesses. To

borrow from the Liberal Party platform: That's sure "real change", but not for a "stronger middle class".

The Liberal government held a consultation period over the summer on the proposed changes. For many small businesses, summer is a very busy time and they are questioning why the Liberals chose this time for these consultations. Such permanent changes should not be rushed. The government should take an adequate amount of time to properly analyze the implications of the proposed tax legislation.

The government says that they are not going after middle-class business people. They say they are going after the wealthiest Canadians. Does the government realize that the proposed changes target the very middle-class business owners they claim to protect? Why are small-business owners being singled out while the biggest abusers of our tax system are being ignored?

A tax professional from my riding wrote in to me. She said, "If these changes go through they will end up hurting not only small business, but our economy as a whole." She went on to say, "The Liberals have it wrong, equal doesn't always mean fair. These changes will drastically reduce the incentives for people to start small businesses and provide jobs to others."

How ridiculous it is that a farmer puts in years of labour and building his farm, years of planning for retirement, and years of saving – and now the Federal government wants to tax him again?

Why does the government insist on taking more money from hard-working Canadians? I have an answer to that one – to pay for the Liberal Government's spending problem.

Businesses thrive on stability, and all they see from this government is fiscal uncertainty. They worry for their employees and their families. What choices will they have to make? Will they have to let people go or just close up shop altogether? These are all legitimate questions my constituents are asking, and questions that the Liberals still have to answer. This is why we should not cut the consultations short. We need to listen to Canadians and we need answers from this government. The consultation period needs to be extended to ensure local businesses get the respect they deserve.

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUPLE'S LOTTERY WIN AIN'T JUST CHICKEN FEED

Alberta's biggest-ever lottery prize has landed in Yellowhead County. Brett McCoy and Robin Walker won \$60 million on the September 22 LOTTO MAX draw.

Walker and McCoy officially received their prize on October 4, 2017 at a cheque presentation in St. Albert.

The couple said they were together when they bought the winning ticket from McLeod Trading Post in the hamlet of Peers. McCoy laughed when he remembered cashing in another lottery ticket at the same time they bought the winning ticket for September 22.

"I won \$100, and I was pretty excited," he said. "I remember thinking that I never win anything."

The couple stopped back in at McLeod Trading Post the afternoon of September 23 – the day after the big draw. This time, Walker went in to buy a couple of items while McCoy waited outside.

"I ran into the store to buy chicken feed and some treats for my kids," said Walker. "I grabbed all our lottery tickets out of the glove compartment."

"A whole bunch of numbers came up on the screen when I scanned the ticket. I thought, 'That can't be right.' So, I scanned the ticket again – then I ran outside and told Brett we won \$60,000."

"The store clerk came after me and said, 'Robin – count the zeroes.'"

In fact, McCoy and Walker's ticket was the only one sold across Canada to match all seven LOTTO MAX winning numbers drawn on September 22. They won the entire \$60 million jackpot that evening, setting a new record for the biggest lottery prize ever won in Alberta.

The winning LOTTO MAX numbers on September 22 were 2, 10, 37, 38, 43 and 47. McCoy and Walker's ticket was an \$11

quick pick, with six selections and the add-on game EXTRA entered.

As you'd expect, the couple are feeling overwhelmed as they consider the magnitude of the win.

"It's surreal," Walker said.

"I was pretty excited when I thought it was \$60,000," McCoy added. "That would have taken

care of a big chunk of our mortgage."

With \$60 million to consider, the couple said they don't plan to make any big decisions right away.

"We'll get a few things we need, but we're going to sit tight for now," Walker said. "There's so much to think about."

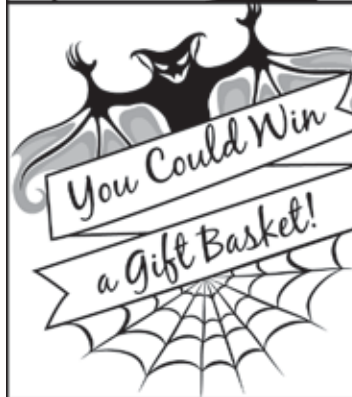


