### SENIOR BENEFITS WORKSHOPS WARMLY RECEIVED

There are numerous programs available to support seniors financially—through both the federal and provincial government. Access to these support programs firstly requires knowledge, and this past September, Yellowhead County's seniors were able to ask questions and get the information they need to be informed of services available to them.

Yellowhead County's Fam-

ily and Community Support Services (FCSS) brought these educational workshops to four County communities: Marlboro, Peers, Carrot Creek and Evansburg.

The two-day, four-community workshops saw presentations from Isabelle Fleury-Hache and Nancy Kelly of Service Canada, and Laura Pawlechko from Alberta Seniors and Housing. Topics covered included: Old Age Security, the Canada Pension Plan, Guaranteed Income Supplement, Allowance for the Survivor, Seniors Financial Assis-

tance, Special Needs Assistance, the Seniors Home Adaptation Repair Program (SHARP), at the Carrot Creek Hall.

The facilitators additionally offered information regarding senior's coverage with Blue Cross, Dental and Optical assistance for senior's programs, the Seniors Property Tax Deferral Program as well as information regarding the Alberta Seniors Benefit program.

The assistant was in charge of the Chiefs responsibilities if he had tasks to attend to. The assistant's main duty though was being the transit man. He was in charge of turning angles and making them into straight lines. Another important team member was the Teamster his duty was to take care of the two teams of horses that were used for obtaining general supplies and moving Surveying Camps.

Four men shared the same tent, except for the chief who slept in his own tent and the cook who slept in the cooking tent. Most men missed their families and had very little contact with them. The main communication they had was through snail mail, which was only received once

a month. Twelve hard working men needed a well home cooked meal and that meant, good cook was vital. The cook prepared three meals a day seven day a week, he used a tin horn to announce it was meal time.

Times where changing and so was Alberta. More roads where put in to place along with residential homes, parks and industry. Land Surveyors played a big part in developing Alberta, the wonderful place we call home.

Come down to Tipple Park Museum Wednesday to Saturday from 10am to 5pm, and enjoy the Making Their Mark exhibit! We have a survey tent set up in the lobby along with panels, virtual stories and tools that Surveys used in the 1900s. Looking forward to seeing you!

# 60,000 STUDENTS WILL VOICE THEIR POLITICAL OPINIONS IN FIRST-EVER STUDENT VOTE PROGRAM FOR ALBERTA LOCAL ELECTIONS

Even though they are under the voting age, more than 60,000 elementary and high school students from throughout Alberta will have an opportunity to consider the future direction of their community and vote for candidates running for municipal council and school board trustee.

The Student Vote program is a hands-on learning program that enables teachers to bring democracy alive in the classroom, and empowers students to experience the voting process firsthand and practice the habits of active and engaged citizenship.

Participating schools are supplied with free learning materials and election supplies to help them engage in the campaign and organize a parallel vote.

Students learn about local government and democracy, and research the issues and candidates through classroom activities, family discussion and campaign events. In the culminating activity, students take on the roles of election officials and coordinate the election process for their peers. On Student Vote Day, students cast ballots for the candidates running for mayor/reeve, councillor and school board trustee. The results are tabulated and released publicly following the closing of the official polls.

A total of 934 schools have registered to participate in the Student Vote program for the 2017 local elections, representing 158 Alberta municipalities. This is the first Student Vote program to be held for municipal and school board elections in Alberta.

With support from the Government of Alberta, Edmonton Community Foundation, Alberta Teachers' Association, Galvin Family Trust, Elections Alberta and the Government of Canada, the Student Vote program was offered free to schools.

"CIVIX is striving towards the expansion of Student Vote to more jurisdictional levels across Canada, so that students have an opportunity to cast a ballot every time there is an election," said Taylor Gunn, President and Chief Election Officer of CIVIX. "We are delighted to be offering our first local elections program to Alberta schools and we would like to thank our partners for making this project possible."

The Student Vote election results will be released at the close of polls on Monday, October 16 (8:00 p.m. MT).

strengthen property rights and make life better for rural Albertans, but the United Conservative Party MLAs opposed it.

At a recent meeting of the Standing Committee on Re-

source Stewardship, we put forward a motion to work towards providing Albertans with cost-effective access to fairness and equity in settling property-rights disputes.

This motion was what the Property Rights Advocate was asking for. We listened and acted on the recommendations from the advocate, who hears directly from rural Albertans.

This is an important issue all across this province—from Peace River to Cypress-Medicine Hat. Whether it is orphan wells or other property disputes, rural Albertans deserve protection.

But the UCP MLAs seem to believe otherwise.

The UCP MLAs in the committee voted against it—every single one of them. The UCP MLAs voted against fairness and equity in settling property rights disputes.

This is not a partisan issue. This is common sense. But the UCP MLAs let politics get in the way of making life better for rural Albertans.

I know from speaking with my own rural constituents in Yellowhead County that they take great pride in their stewardship of their land – land that in some cases has been in their family for more than a century.

We all understand the importance of resource development in this province. In fact it's fair to say we owe much of our prosperity to Alberta's energy, mining and forestry industries.

But for far too long, previous governments ignored the concerns of landowners, making life harder for them and their families. The vote this week underlines that the UCP MLAs, like those in previous governments, would rather play politics than work to find solutions.

I know how important this issue is for rural Albertans, and I'm proud our government is standing up for property rights all across the province.

And we'll keep standing up for rural Albertans.





# CALL FOR PROPOSALS – SUPPORTING WOMEN

OTTAWA: In recognition of October as Women's History Month, MP Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is encouraging organizations to apply for funding to support the economic security of women in the riding.

Status of Women Canada has

issued two new calls for proposals that will award funding to organizations for projects that address institutional barriers that limit women's economic security. Projects at the national level can receive up to \$500,000 in funding, and projects at the regional level can receive up to \$350,000 in funding.

The first call for proposals is entitled Support for Women's

Economic Security. It will fund projects under two themes:

- Building Partnerships to Address Systemic Barriers encourages collaboration between organizations to address the systemic barriers that prevent women from attaining economic security. These barriers could include issues such as the accessibility of childcare, the wage gap, and pay inequity. The deadline to apply is November 27, 2017.
- Increasing Private Sector Leadership and Investments in Women urges organizations to partner with the private sector to work together to implement solutions that advance women's economic security. Through these partnerships, the private sector can play a leading role in helping advance gender equality. The deadline to apply is January 11, 2018.


The second call for proposals is entitled Addressing Indigenous Women's Economic Security and Prosperity. It invites project proposals from Indigenous organizations that will support the economic security and prosperity of Indigenous women. Projects selected will involve the collaboration of the organizations, women, their communities, and the private sector.

The goal is to build on the strengths of Indigenous women, identify opportunities for their economic success, and address issues limiting these opportunities. The projects should also expand community understanding of these issues, and take actions to implement the identified solutions. The deadline to apply is January 11, 2018.

"Supporting women's economic security is essential to building a better future and benefits everyone. I encourage all eligible organizations in Yellowhead to apply," concluded MP Eglinski.



# Auto TUNE-UP

### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Vehicle identification number etching, or "VIN etching," is a theft deterrent in which an automobile's VIN, a 17-character code consisting of letters and numbers unique to each vehicle, is etched onto the vehicle's windows. Some manufac-

turers may etch the VIN onto the windows of all of their vehicles, while others may not. Dealerships may charge VIN etching fees to buyers of new vehicles, but buyers should always consult their insurance companies before agreeing to

pay such fees. Some insurance providers do not discount premiums for vehicles with VIN etching, while others might. Drivers may not want to pay VIN etching fees if their insurance providers will not discount their premiums, so it pays to consult

with providers before purchasing a new vehicle. In addition, drivers who want to save money on etching fees but still do all they can to deter prospective car thieves may want to purchase their own VIN etching kits, which typically cost around \$20.

### **PHARMACARE**

OTTAWA: On October 5th, Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, took part in debate on a motion by the NDP. The motion calls on the Government of Canada to commence negotiations with the Provinces in order to implement a universal pharmacare program.

While MP Eglinski recognized that 8% of low-income Canadi-

ans have had to choose to skip prescriptions because of the cost, he argued that the Federal Government should not go ahead with the NDP's motion until a study could be completed on implementing a national pharmacare program. His concerns included the massive cost the government would incur (\$22.6 billion annually), bureaucratic red-tape, and applying a one-size-fits-all solution to each province. In fact, 88% of Ca-

nadians are already covered by adequate prescription drug coverage under the current health care system.

"Socializing a larger part of drug spending through a single-payer pharmacare plan would give more power to government and its bureaucrats to make decisions on behalf of the insured," stated MP Eglinski in the House of Commons. "Policies that restrict access to new medicines would be applied across the board..."

The Health Committee is currently studying the potentials of a national pharmacare program and requested a feasibility report from the Parliamentary Budget Officer (PBO). MP Eglinski argued the Health Committee should be allowed to continue

its study before the Federal Government takes action.

"[Our] party believes health care should be available for everybody, but it does not have to be done through a motion forcing the government to meet with the provinces. We have a committee that is studying the program, looking at the best ways to make recommendations to the current government. . . We should not have a motion before the House, forcing us to start those negotiations before the committee has reasonable time to study all parameters around it," concluded MP Eglinski.



# NEW SERVICES AND SUPPORTS FOR PARKLAND FAMILIES

A new Parent Link Centre in Spruce Grove, together with a school and a child care program, will support child development and prepare children for bright futures.

Beaverbrook Wellness Centre includes the newly-opened Spruce Grove Parent Link Centre, in addition to a YMCA child-care program and the Prescott Learning Centre, in a single location. Bringing these services and programs together, in a place where

families come together, is helping to build a stronger, more connected community.

"Every family does better surrounded by strong, supportive communities, and that's exactly what we hope for from our Parent Link Centres. I'm thrilled to see that families in Spruce Grove will have access to these free, community-based supports, like drop-in play time and parenting classes. Our continued support for Parent Link Centres, like this one, show our government's commitment to making life better for families in communities right across Alberta." - Danielle Larivee, Minister of Children's Services The inclusion of a Parent Link Centre in this location is an important part of a collaborative approach to early child-hood program delivery. Funded by the Government of Alberta and operated by the Alberta Parenting for the Future Association, the Parent Link Centre will support the increasing needs of a growing population.

The Parent Link Centre's support is open to any parent or caregiver of children up to six years old, and includes free parenting and early childhood development programs, such as:

• Early Childhood Development: programs where parents and children can play and interact

• Parent Education: offers the evidence-based Triple P- Positive Parenting Program

• Family Support: social, educational and recreational programs and activities that promote family strength and resiliency, including opportunities for parents to meet each other and build networks of support

• Developmental screening: resources where parents can access an Ages and Stages questionnaire to learn more about their child's development and get necessary support

• Information and referrals: parents can access information or get referrals to other programs or resources to support needs identified by the family

The Beaverbrook Wellness Centre was developed in partnership with the Government of Alberta, Parkland School Division, the City of Spruce Grove and Beaverbrook communities.
