Alberta Beach, Alberta: Rosaline POTTS was located in the Alberta Beach area this afternoon by Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP. She was arrested without incident and is currently in police custody awaiting a Judicial interim re-

lease hearing.

UPDATE #1:

Alberta Beach, Alberta – The RCMP have laid charges, and obtained an arrest warrant, after an investigation into three armed robberies that occurred on October 16, 2017 in Alberta Beach and Gunn.

21-year-old Tyrell Dennis House is facing 11 criminal code charges include robbery, possession of property obtained by crime and several weapons offences.

18-year-old Bailey Rain is facing seven criminal code including robbery and weapons offences.

Both House and Rain remain in custody. They are scheduled to appear in court on October 25, 2017 in the Stony Plain Provincial Court.

CALL FOR PROPOSALS - SUPPORTING WOMEN

OTTAWA: In recognition of October as Women's History Month, MP Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is encouraging organizations to apply for funding to support the economic security of women in the riding.

Status of Women Canada has issued two new calls for pro-

posals that will award funding to organizations for projects that address institutional barriers that limit women's economic security. Projects at the national level can receive up to \$500,000 in funding, and projects at the regional level can receive up to \$350,000 in funding.

The first call for proposals is entitled Support for Women's Economic Security. It will fund projects under two themes: • Building Partnerships to Address Systemic Barriers - encourages collaboration between organizations to address the systemic barriers that prevent women from attaining economic security. These barriers could include issues such as the accessibility of childcare, the wage gap, and pay inequity. The deadline to apply is November 27, 2017.

• Increasing Private Sector Leadership and Investments in Women - urges organizations to partner with the private sector to work together to implement solutions that advance women's economic security. Through these partnerships, the private sector can play a leading role in helping advance gender equality. The deadline to apply is January 11, 2018.

The second call for proposals is entitled Addressing Indigenous Women's Economic Security and Prosperity. It invites project proposals from Indigenous organizations that will support the economic security and prosperity of Indigenous women. Projects selected will involve the collaboration of the organizations, women, their communities, and the private sector.

The goal is to build on the strengths of Indigenous women,

identify opportunities for their economic success, and address issues limiting these opportunities. The projects should also expand community understanding of these issues, and take actions to implement the identified solutions. The deadline to apply is January 11, 2018.

"Supporting women's economic security is essential to building a better future and benefits everyone. I encourage all eligible organizations in Yellowhead to apply," concluded MP Eglinski.

AHS INFLUENZA IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM BEGINS OCTOBER 23

NORTH ZONE – Starting Monday (Oct. 23), Albertans have the opportunity to protect themselves and others against influenza through Alberta's annual influenza immunization program.

Offering influenza immunization, free of charge, to all Albertans six months of age and older, the vaccine will be available at hundreds of Alberta Health Services (AHS) public influenza immunization clinics, as well as at many pharmacists and physician offices around the province.

"We have seen cases and outbreaks of influenza already," says Dr. Albert de Villiers, AHS Medical Officer of Health, North Zone. "You may be healthy now but, without immunization, everyone is at risk. Prevention is

your only protection."

Immunization is the most effective means of protecting against the strains of influenza virus circulating each season. Because those strains change from season to season, Albertans are reminded they cannot rely on having been immunized in years past.

"Last season, influenza immunization cut Albertans' risk for influenza by just more than 40 per cent. That's great, but last year's immunization won't protect you this season. You need this season's immunization to be protected this season."

Over a six-month period last season, more than 1,600 Albertans were hospitalized and 64 Albertans died with influenza. Influenza causes more emergency department visits than heart attacks and strokes, not to mention significant downtime from

work and leisure activities.

"Influenza does not discriminate," says Dr. de Villiers. "Though some Albertans are at greater risk of severe complications, no one is naturally immune to influenza. Please don't take the risk. Influenza can be one less thing we battle this winter. For yourself, and your loved ones, get immunized."

Charges Laid In Armed Robberies

Two other suspects have been charged and arrest warrants have been issued for 29-year-old Rosaline Potts of Alexis First Nation Reserve, and a youth, who cannot be named.

Three other subjects were arrested at the residence on October 16, 2017 on outstanding warrants that were not associated to these robberies.

Rosaline Potts' whereabouts are unknown. Anyone with information as to where she may be located is asked to call the Stony Plain RCMP Detachment at 780-968-7267 or if you wish to remain anonymous, you

BACKGROUND:

Paul Band First Nation, Alberta - The RCMP have four suspects in custody following an investigation into three different armed robberies which occurred on the afternoon of October 16, 2017.

At 4:50 p.m. the RCMP received a report of an armed robbery at both the Alberta Beach Esso and Liquor Cottage. Two males entered the Esso with what appeared to be a rifle and pointed it at the cashier. The male carrying the rifle took cash from the till while the second male put items into a duffel bag.

While this robbery was occurring,

two other suspects, a male and female, went into the neighbouring Liquor Cottage. Both suspects are alleged to have taken liquor from the store. Prior to departing the store, the male suspect sprayed a substance, believed to be bear spray, at the clerk.

All suspects fled in a white Buick Riviera, which was confirmed by the RCMP to be a stolen vehicle.

The clerk who was sprayed by bear spray received minor injuries in this incident and was treated on scene by EMS.

While investigating this robbery, the RCMP received information that an earlier armed robbery had occurred at the Gunn Esso and Liquor Store at approximately 3:30 p.m. Video footage from this robbery shows that two males entered the store and took liquor without paying. As they were leaving the liquor store, one male pointed what appears to be bear spray at the clerk, but did not deploy it. More liquor was stolen at the till, and the males departed.

Witnesses reported that the suspect Buick Riviera was seen fleeing southbound from Alberta Beach. Additional information was provided to the RCMP by members of the public as the vehicle drove at high

Following extensive patrols, the Buick was located by the RCMP, abandoned, on the Paul Band First Nation. The area was secured and with the assistance of the RCMP Police Dog Services and RCMP Air Services, the suspects were tracked to two residences. At 6:25 p.m., and 7:00 p.m., RCMP members effected arrests, without incident, of several subjects within those two residenc-

The Stony Plain GIS Unit is actively investigating these robberies. Charges are pending for the four individuals, for numerous offences.

At this time, a connection has not been made between these robberies and earlier robberies in Calmar and Millet, however the various RCMP detachments are coordinating their investigations.

"The RCMP can credit the swift outcome to this investigation in part to the valuable information and assistance provided by the public in locating the suspect vehicle" says Sergeant Randy Guinchard of the Stony Plain / Spruce Grove / Enoch RCMP. "This is a great example of the collaboration between different RCMP Units such as Police Dog Services, Air Services, General Investigation Section and the General Duty watch members".

As charges have not been sworn yet, the names of the arrested suspects cannot be released. An update will be provided when available.







SIMPLE MAINTENANCE TIPS TO KEEP YOUR RIDE RUNNING STRONG

But visual inspections can help drivers find problems that, though minor, may impact their vehicles' performance. For example, a routine examination of vehicle tires can indicate if those tires are properly inflated. Poorly inflated tires can decrease fuel efficiency and affect the overall safety of a vehicle. If tires appear flat, check their pressure and inflate them to the levels listed in your owner's manual.

· Look for fluid leaks. Another telltale and easily identifiable sign that a vehicle needs some maintenance is the sight of fluids beneath the car. If you notice puddles or stains beneath where you normally park your car, your vehicle may be leaking fluids. Note the color and consistency of the fluid and then call your mechanic to determine which fluid is leaking and how to fix the problem.

· Stick to manufacturer-recommended maintenance schedules. Whether your vehicle is brand new or has some tread on its tire, consult the owner's manual for manufacturer recommendations with regard to changing fluids and replacing filters. Many recent models can now be driven roughly 5,000 miles before they need an oil change, but check your owner's manual for the guidelines established by your vehicle's manufacturer, and adhere to that schedule religiously. If you drive an older car, recognize that the vehicle may benefit from more frequent oil changes and tuneups.

In addition, read the manual for additional guidelines, such as how often to replace the air filter, headlight, turn signal and brake lamps, windshield wipers, and other vehicle parts that can wear down over

· Look under the hood as well. While many drivers feel that the area beneath their vehicles' hoods is best left to the professionals, you can still lift up the hood every so often to see if there are any glaring problems that demand attention. Inspect rubber belts for signs of wear and tear, and know that such belts may need to be replaced every 50,000 miles or even more frequently depending on your driving habits. Lifting the hood is also necessary when checking fluid levels, which you should check periodically and before and after any long trips.

Drivers who notice or suspect damage when performing simple vehicle maintenance should bring these concerns to the attention of their mechanics as soon as possible.









Auto TUNE-UP

ITEMS TO INCLUDE IN YOUR AUTOMOTIVE EMERGENCY KIT

Road trips can make for great weekend getaways or even more lengthy vacations for those who can't get enough of the open road. But before embarking on any road trips, motorists should replenish their automotive emergency kits with the following items so they are fully prepared in the event of an accident or an injury.

• First-aid kit: A first-aid kit can treat cuts and abrasions suffered while you are out of the car and even some minor injuries that may result if you are in a car accident. Include essential items like adhesive tape, antibiotic ointment, antiseptic wipes, aspirin, bandages, a cold compress, gauze, and scissors. Visit www.redcross.org for a

more extensive list of items to include in your first-aid kit, which should be kept in your car at all times.

Tools: It's important to include tools in your automotive emergency kit. While a full toolbox might be unnecessary, bring along an adjustable wrench, a flat head and Phillips screwdriver, a pair of pliers, a tire jack and crow bar, an ice scraper, and a flashlight. Extra roadside flares and reflectors also should be packed should you need to pull over and address an automotive problem, such as a flat tire. Keep a tire pressure gauge in your glove compartment or with your other tools so you can check tire pressure if you feel your car is not operating as smoothly as it

normally does.

- Fluids: While it's best to check all of your vehicle's fluids before beginning a road trip, it does not hurt to bring along some extra fluids just in case you start to run low while out on the road. Fluids to pack include motor oil, antifreeze, brake fluid, and windshield washer fluid. Include a funnel with these items so you can easily pour them in should you be running low. Pack an empty spray bottle as well so you have something to spray washer fluid from if a problem arises with your wiper blades.
- Wiper blades: Include an extra set of wiper blades in your automotive emergency kit. Maintaining wiper blades is an oft-overlooked component of

vehicle maintenance, so bring along an extra set of blades should your existing blades succumb to wear and tear while you're on the road.

Miscellaneous items: Some items that may not seem synonymous with road trips can come in handy should you find yourself in an emergency. Pack a blanket so you and your passengers can stay warm should your car break down at night. In addition, pack some energy bars and bottled water so no one gets too hungry or thirsty while waiting for help to arrive. It's also good to keep a pair of work gloves in your car so you can still use your tools or change a tire when the temperatures dip or your hands get sweaty on hot days.
