YELLOWHEAD REGIONAL 9-1-1 DISPATCHERS RECEIVE GRANT

The Pembina Pipeline Corporation has been supporting local fire departments with various Fire Safety Grants for 7 years. This latest grant was awarded to the Yellowhead Regional Emergency Communication Centre (YRECC) based out of the Yellowhead County head office. Pembina Pipeline aims to promote safety throughout local communities and is committed to helping fire departments procure the resources they need to respond effectively.

YRECC's latest project, Tactical/Incident Dispatching, will

give dispatchers the mobility to be present at large-scale emergencies. Dispatchers can then liaise with the primary YRECC office, emergency responders on scene, dispatchers from other communities, and any other third parties such as industry, agriculture, forestry, etc. The program will help keep all communications concise, clear and recorded in a professional and timely fashion.

The grant money will be used to purchase mobile equipment that is crucial to the implementation of the Tactical/Incident Dispatching program. Dispatchers will also receive new training relevant to the program. In short, the programs benefits include:

- Procurement of radio equipment compatible with multiple channels;
- On-site record keeping and incident tracking;
- Equipment, apparatus, and operator tracking;
- Increased focus on safety of emergency responders;
- Reduced strain on main call centers; and
- Better coordination among emergency responders and third parties.

The grant was awarded to Yellowhead County's Albert Bahri, Fire Chief/Director of Emergency Services, and Sharon DeVries, Deputy Fire Chief, at the grand opening of the Evansburg Fire Hall.

AHS INFLUENZA IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM BEGINS OCTOBER 23

Starting Monday (Oct. 23), Albertans have the opportunity to protect themselves and others against influenza through Alberta's annual influenza immunization program.

Offering influenza immunization, free of charge, to all Albertans six months of age and older, the vaccine will be available at hundreds of Alberta Health Services (AHS) public influenza immunization clinics, as well as at many pharmacists and physician offices around

the province.

"We have seen cases and outbreaks of influenza already," says Dr. Albert de Villiers, AHS Medical Officer of Health, North Zone. "You may be healthy now but, without immunization, everyone is at risk. Prevention is your only protection."

Immunization is the most effective means of protecting against the strains of influenza virus circulating each season. Because those strains change from season to season, Albertans are reminded they cannot rely on having been immu-

nized in years past.

"Last season, influenza immunization cut Albertans' risk for influenza by just more than 40 per cent. That's great, but last year's immunization won't protect you this season. You need this season's immunization to be protected this season."

Over a six-month period last season, more than 1,600 Albertans were hospitalized and 64 Albertans died with influenza. Influenza causes more emergency department visits than heart attacks and strokes, not to mention significant

downtime from work and leisure activities.

"Influenza does not discriminate," says Dr. de Villiers. "Though some Albertans are at greater risk of severe complications, no one is naturally immune to influenza. Please don't take the risk. Influenza can be one less thing we battle this winter. For yourself, and your loved ones, get immunized."


County's Zone Six candidates for the upcoming municipal election.

INFLUENZA SEASON

It happens every fall: influenza arrives in Alberta, and takes a serious toll on our communities.

Influenza is a real threat. It's also preventable.

Influenza immunization will be made available, starting October 23, free of charge, to all Albertans six months of age and older

It's the single most effective means of reducing your risk of influenza, particularly when you receive it as early in the season as possible. By getting immunized early, you will give your body the opportunity to respond to immunization, and produce antibodies that will arm you against the influenza viruses you'll be exposed to again throughout the season.

Each year, influenza vaccine is developed to protect us against the strains of virus likely to circulate in our community. Though vaccine effectiveness may vary, know this: last season, influenza vaccine cut Albertan's risk of influenza by about 40%. Without immunization, Albertans were completely at risk.

And we do mean all Albertans. Although some individuals (pregnant women, seniors, children, and individuals with underlying health conditions or compromised immune systems) are at greater risk for severe complications, without immunization, even healthy Albertans are at risk of severe illness and even death.

64 Albertans died with influenza last season, and more than 1,600 Albertans were hospitalized.

Let's do better this year.

SOFTWOOD LUMBER, THE PINE BEETLE, AND CARIBOU

OTTAWA: On October 19th, Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, took part in debate on a Conservative motion which calls on the federal government to support forestry workers.

On October 12, 2015, the Softwood Lumber Agreement between Canada and the United States expired. Despite declaring "a real breakthrough on softwood lumber" with the previous U.S. administration, the Federal Government has yet to negotiate a new deal. Instead, the Liberals announced an aid package to compensate for the 370,000 jobs jeopardized across the country when they let the Softwood Lumber Agreement expire and the United States subsequently announced countervailing duties in April as high as 24.12%.

MP Eglinski also expressed frustration with the Federal Government's lack of response to the mountain pine beetle infestation, which is quickly spreading through the riding.

"I am concerned even further when it comes to softwood lumber, because the Liberal government is failing in other areas," stated MP Eglinski. "I have been working for two years with the Minister of Environment and Climate Change, to take some serious action with respect to the pine beetle in Jasper National Park. It has destroyed the forest there. It has now moved into the province of Alberta and, in one year—if the members across would listen—it has increased tenfold."

MP Eglinski also criticized the way the government has dealt with protecting the woodland caribou.

"The government needs to take a look at our caribou, which is now an endangered species. The government is doing nothing to work with the provinces to ensure that these animals are protected. If the Species at Risk Act goes into play, and if the Province of Alberta gets its way, it will close down close to 4.9 million acres of our forestry land due to the caribon.

The government needs to take some action to support Alberta's forest industry," concluded MP Eglinski

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Cell Coverage in Cadomin and Wildwood – Council approved a partnership with TELUS to pay a 50/50 capital split of cell equipment for the Cadomin and Wildwood towers at the cost of \$829,000. The addition of this coverage will significantly enhance cell phone service for residents, visitors, and

people working in the area.

Community Services Strategic Plan – The Community Services Strategic Plan takes a comprehensive look at the existing community service amenities and programming in the Edson area and evaluates and suggests future development based on needs and best practices. This report - which focused on parks and recreation, arts and culture, museums and archives, and library services - will be considered in the development of future community


services buildings and services.

Wildwood Ag Society Parking Lot – Yellowhead County will take over the ownership and maintenance of the Wildwood and District Agricultural Society's parking lot for a continued use as a parks and recreation asset. Paving for the parking lot will be considered in the 2018 municipal budget and is estimated to be \$350,000-\$400,000.

First Municipal Historic Resource Designations – Council approved the Bylaw for Municipal

Historic Resource Designation for the Mathews United Church and the Cooper Barn. These are the first municipally designated Yellowhead County historical resources under Yellowhead County's new Historic Resource Act.

The Tuesday, October 31, 2017 Council Meeting will include the swearing-in of the 2017-2021 Yellowhead County Council beginning at 9:30 A.M.

For example, a routine examination of vehicle tires can indicate if those tires are properly inflated. Poorly inflated tires can decrease fuel efficiency and affect the overall safety of a vehicle. If tires appear flat, check their pressure and inflate them to the levels listed in your owner's manual.

· Look for fluid leaks. Another telltale and easily identifiable sign that a vehicle needs some maintenance is the sight of fluids beneath the car. If you notice puddles or stains beneath where you normally park your car, your vehicle may be leaking fluids. Note the color and consistency of the fluid and then call your mechanic to determine which fluid is leaking and how to fix the problem.

· Stick to manufacturer-recommended maintenance schedules.

Whether your vehicle is brand new or has some tread on its tire, consult the owner's manual for manufacturer recommendations with regard to changing fluids and replacing filters. Many recent models can now be driven roughly 5,000 miles before they need an oil change, but check your owner's manual for the guidelines established by your vehicle's manufacturer, and adhere to that schedule religiously. If you drive an older car, recognize that the vehicle may benefit from more frequent oil changes and tuneups.

In addition, read the manual for additional guidelines, such as how often to replace the air filter, headlight, turn signal and brake lamps, windshield wipers, and other vehicle parts that can wear down over time.

· Look under the hood as well. While many drivers feel that the area beneath their vehicles' hoods is best left to the professionals, you can still lift up the hood every so often to see if there are any glaring problems that demand attention. Inspect rubber belts for signs of wear and tear, and know that such belts may need to be replaced every 50,000 miles or even more frequently depending on your driving habits. Lifting the hood is also necessary when checking fluid levels, which you should check periodically and before and after any long trips.

Drivers who notice or suspect damage when performing simple vehicle maintenance should bring these concerns to the attention of their mechanics as soon as possible.







Auto TUNE-UP

ITEMS TO INCLUDE IN YOUR AUTOMOTIVE EMERGENCY KIT

Road trips can make for great weekend getaways or even more lengthy vacations for those who can't get enough of the open road. But before embarking on any road trips, motorists should replenish their automotive emergency kits with the following items so they are fully prepared in the event of an accident or an injury.

• First-aid kit: A first-aid kit can treat cuts and abrasions suffered while you are out of the car and even some minor injuries that may result if you are in a car accident. Include essential items like adhesive tape, antibiotic ointment, antiseptic wipes, aspirin, bandages, a cold compress, gauze, and scissors. Visit www.redcross.org for a

more extensive list of items to include in your first-aid kit, which should be kept in your car at all times.

Tools: It's important to include tools in your automotive emergency kit. While a full toolbox might be unnecessary, bring along an adjustable wrench, a flat head and Phillips screwdriver, a pair of pliers, a tire jack and crow bar, an ice scraper, and a flashlight. Extra roadside flares and reflectors also should be packed should you need to pull over and address an automotive problem, such as a flat tire. Keep a tire pressure gauge in your glove compartment or with your other tools so you can check tire pressure if you feel your car is not operating as smoothly as it normally does

- Fluids: While it's best to check all of your vehicle's fluids before beginning a road trip, it does not hurt to bring along some extra fluids just in case you start to run low while out on the road. Fluids to pack include motor oil, antifreeze, brake fluid, and windshield washer fluid. Include a funnel with these items so you can easily pour them in should you be running low. Pack an empty spray bottle as well so you have something to spray washer fluid from if a problem arises with your wiper blades.
- Wiper blades: Include an extra set of wiper blades in your automotive emergency kit. Maintaining wiper blades is an oft-overlooked component of

vehicle maintenance, so bring along an extra set of blades should your existing blades succumb to wear and tear while you're on the road.

Miscellaneous items: Some items that may not seem synonymous with road trips can come in handy should you find yourself in an emergency. Pack a blanket so you and your passengers can stay warm should your car break down at night. In addition, pack some energy bars and bottled water so no one gets too hungry or thirsty while waiting for help to arrive. It's also good to keep a pair of work gloves in your car so you can still use your tools or change a tire when the temperatures dip or your hands get sweaty on hot days.

EDSON RCMP LAY CHARGES AFTER 4 SUSPECTS FLEE FROM VEHICLE

Edson, Alberta – Edson RCMP have charged an adult female, an adult male, and 2 youths after a speeding vehicle failed to stop for police on October 14, 2017.

At approximately 2:30 a.m., a white sedan was observed by Edson RCMP travelling

through the town of Edson nearing speeds of 200 km/h. RCMP members attempted to pull the vehicle over when it was abandoned at the Sundance Campground and four occupants fled the vehicle on foot.

An adult female was located quickly and resisted arrest by assaulting the RCMP member who

attempted to get her in custody. The struggle continued for several minutes and the suspect was finally subdued and secured in a police vehicle.

Search of the female suspect's belongings recovered a homemade firearm, ammunition, and a quantity of methamphetamine.

Edson RCMP continued to

search for the other three suspects and all were arrested without incident later that day.

- 4) Assault with intent to resist arrest
 - 5) Resist/obstruct peace officer
- 6) Unlawful possession of Canadian currency
- 7) Possession of a controlled substance
- 8) Failure to comply with condition of recognizance (x3)

Hayman is due in Edson Provincial Court on October 17, 2017.


Cody Joseph Mcintosh, age 33, of Hinton has been remanded into custody and has been charged with obstructing a peace officer contrary to the Criminal Code.

CHARGES LAID IN ARMED ROBBERIES

Alberta Beach, Alberta: Rosaline POTTS was located in the Alberta Beach area this afternoon by Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP. She was arrested without incident and is currently in police custody awaiting a Judicial interim release hearing.

UPDATE #1:

Alberta Beach, Alberta – The RCMP have laid charges, and obtained an arrest warrant, after an investigation into three armed robberies that occurred on October 16, 2017 in Alberta Beach and Gunn.

21-year-old Tyrell Dennis House is facing 11 criminal code charges include robbery, possession of property obtained by crime and several weapons offences.

18-year-old Bailey Rain is facing seven criminal code including robbery and weapons offences.

Both House and Rain remain in custody. They are scheduled to appear in court on October 25, 2017 in the Stony Plain Provincial Court.

Two other suspects have been charged and arrest warrants have been issued for 29-year-old Rosaline Potts of Alexis First Nation Reserve, and a youth, who cannot be named.

Three other subjects were arrested at the residence on October 16, 2017 on outstanding warrants that were not associated to these robberies

Rosaline Potts' whereabouts are unknown. Anyone with information as to where she may be located is asked to call the Stony Plain RCMP Detachment at 780-968-7267 or if you wish to remain anonymous, you can contact Crime Stoppers by calling 1-800-222-8477.

BACKGROUND:

Paul Band First Nation, Alberta – The RCMP have four suspects in custody following an investigation into three different armed robberies which occurred on the afternoon of October 16, 2017.

At 4:50 p.m. the RCMP received a report of an armed robbery at both the Alberta Beach Esso and Liquor Cottage. Two males entered the Esso with what appeared to be a rifle and pointed it at the cashier. The male carrying the rifle took cash from the till while the second male put items into a duffel bag.

While this robbery was occurring, two other suspects, a male and female, went into the neighbouring Liquor Cottage. Both suspects are alleged to have taken liquor from the store. Prior to departing the store, the male suspect sprayed a substance, believed to be bear

spray, at the clerk.

All suspects fled in a white Buick Riviera, which was confirmed by the RCMP to be a stolen vehicle.

The clerk who was sprayed by bear spray received minor injuries in this incident and was treated on scene by EMS.

While investigating this robbery, the RCMP received information that an earlier armed robbery had occurred at the Gunn Esso and Liquor Store at approximately 3:30 p.m. Video footage from this robbery shows that two males entered the store and took liquor without paying. As they were leaving the liquor store, one male pointed what appears to be bear spray at the clerk, but did not deploy it. More liquor was stolen at the till, and the males departed.

Witnesses reported that the suspect Buick Riviera was seen fleeing southbound from Alberta Beach. Additional information was provided to the RCMP by members of the public as the vehicle drove at high speeds.

Following extensive patrols, the Buick was located by the RCMP, abandoned, on the Paul Band First Nation. The area was secured and with the assistance of the RCMP Police Dog Services and RCMP Air Services, the suspects were tracked to two residences. At 6:25 p.m., and 7:00 p.m., RCMP members ef-

fected arrests, without incident, of several subjects within those two residences.


The Stony Plain GIS Unit is actively investigating these robberies. Charges are pending for the four individuals, for numerous offences.

At this time, a connection has not been made between these robberies and earlier robberies in Calmar and Millet, however the various RCMP detachments are coordinating their investigations.

"The RCMP can credit the swift outcome to this investigation in part to the valuable information and assistance provided by the public in locating the suspect vehicle" says Sergeant Randy Guinchard of the Stony Plain / Spruce Grove / Enoch RCMP. "This is a great example of the collaboration between different RCMP Units such as Police Dog Services, Air Services, General Investigation Section and the General Duty watch members".

As charges have not been sworn yet, the names of the arrested suspects cannot be released. An update will be provided when available.
