#### WHITECOURT-STE. ANNE GETS MORE THAN \$100,000 IN PROVINCIAL COMMUNITY GRANTS

Community groups in Whitecourt-Ste. Anne have received \$107,280 in provincial grant funding to support projects making life better in the constituency.

Oneil Carlier, MLA for Whitecourt-Ste. Anne, distributed the four cheques from the Community Facilities Enhancement Program (CFEP) over the past few weeks. The CFEP grants are administered by Alberta Culture and Tourism, with the goal of fostering healthy, vibrant communities across Alberta

The Onoway and District Agricultural Society was awarded \$59,437 for upgrades to the Onoway Arena.

The Ravine Community Association near Wildwood has received \$22,219 for upgrades to the Ravine Community Hall.

The Onoway and District Historical Society will have \$18,076 for upgrades to the Onoway Museum.

The Town of Mayerthorpe Library Board was awarded \$7,548 for upgrades to the Mayerthorpe Public Library.

Please plan ahead and prepare for re-routing of Whitecourt Transit the night of Friday, November 24. The bus route in the downtown area between 6:00 p.m. and 8:44 p.m. will be detoured due to the Whitecourt & District Chamber of Commerce's annual Santa Claus Parade.

- Between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 8:44 p.m., the bus will travel its regular route and schedule except for in the downtown core.
- From Bus Stop #3 (located at the IGA), the bus will be re-routed east along 49 Avenue, and then

north onto 47 Street to Bus Stop #7. It will then proceed directly to Bus Stop #8.

- From Bus Stop #22 the bus will turn right on 49 Avenue and drop off passengers at Bus Stop #3 (at the Whitecourt IGA) and then will proceed to Bus Stop #26 as scheduled.
- There will be no drop off or pick up at the following stops after 6:00 p.m. on Friday, November 24 due to road closures:
- Bus Stop #4 located at the corner of 51 Street and 51 Avenue;
- Bus Stop #6 located at the corner of 49 Street and 52 Avenue (across from the Whitecourt Public Library):
  - Bus Stop # 23 located at the

corner of 48 Street and 50 Avenue;

- Bus Stop #24 located at the corner of 50 Street and 50 Avenue; and
- Bus Stop #25 located on 51 Street near the 7-11.

Motorists are advised that streets in the downtown area will be closed temporarily for the Santa Claus Parade. Please refer to the Town's standard parade route map for information. # CALL FOR APPLICATIONS - SMALL AND MEDIUM SIZED BUSINESSES

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform constituents of a funding opportunity for small and medium sized businesses in his riding.

On October 31, 2017, Western Economic Diversification (WED) announced that it is accepting applications under the Western Innovation (WINN) Initiative.

Created by the previous Conservative Government in 2013, WINN is a program that offers repayable contributions to western Canadian businesses with less than 500 employees, to commercialize and bring to market innovative technology-based products, processes or services. To date, WINN has invested over \$97 million in 85 projects.

Under the current Liberal Government, the program is prioritizing clean technology, clean resources, digital technology, advanced manufacturing, value added agriculture, and health biological sciences.

Repayable contributions cover up to 50% of total eligible costs for each project, to a maximum of \$3.5 million per project. As long as the recipient is in good standing, interest will not be charged.

The deadline to apply is November 29, 2017.

"I encourage all eligible business leaders in Yellowhead to consider applying to this worthwhile opportunity," concluded MP Eglinski.



### LIQUOR BAG PROGRAM INVITES STUDENTS TO DESIGN MESSAGES ON IMPAIRED DRIVING

This holiday season, Alberta's youth are creating impactful and creative messages to remind Albertans on the dangers of drinking and driving.

Since 2012, Students Against Drinking and Driving (SADD) Alberta, in partnership with the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission (AGLC), has coordinated their liquor bag campaign, whereby Alberta students from grade 1 to grade 12 can personalize a message to raise awareness on the impact of impaired driving on a paper liquor bag.

Alberta teachers and community supporters are encouraged to order their free liquor paper bags, which will serve as a blank canvas for students' designs, from now until December 15. The completed bags are then dropped off at local liquor stores by school staff as a visual reminder to customers not to drink and drive this holiday season. Last year, more than 65,000 bags were ordered and distributed to 282 schools.

Students can also enter the Liquor Bag Design Contest through their school, with a chance to win 1 of 10 prizes, ranging in value from \$100-500. The overall winner will also have their design printed on one million bags, which will be distributed to Alberta liquor stores for use beginning the May 2018 long weekend. Students are encouraged to share their bag design on Instagram using the hashtag #SADDbag.

A mammogram is an X-ray of the breast and has proven to be the most effective way to detect breast cancer. Early detection allows for a greater number of options for treatment and a better chance of survival.

# FATALITY STRUCTURE FIRE IN THE VILLAGE OF ALBERTA BEACH

Alberta Beach, AB – November 15, 2017

At 2136 last evening, North West Fire Rescue – Onoway (Operating as Onoway Regional Fire Services) was paged out to a two-story structure fire – unknown injuries – unknown entrapment on 47 Street in the Village of Alberta Beach. The first units were rolling within 2-minutes of the page out and the first arriving unit on scene in

less than 5-minutes from time of page. As units arrived on scene the main floor appeared heavily involved with fire. Flames were seen shooting from the second-floor windows. Bystanders were not sure if the home was occupied at the time.

Water was flowing within minutes of arrival as crews forced entry into the structure to darken-down the fire and commence search-and-rescue operations. Shortly thereafter, a single occupant was found unconscious. Firefighters performed rapid extrication and commenced CPR then transported the individual to ambulance crews. Unfortunately, the occupant never regained consciousness.

Members then turned their focus back to completing the search and battling the blaze. While crews fought the fire, one feline was retrieved alive and another deceased. The fire was brought under control by 2245 and loss was stopped by 2311.

The cause of the fire is under investigation by the Office of the Fire Commissioner and the identity of the victim is with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. North West Fire Rescue – Onoway would like to thank Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services, AC Purewater, and Extreme Water Hauling for additional water resources as well as Alberta Health Services, RCMP, and Fortis for their assistance as well

The thoughts and prayers of the North West Fire Rescue staff goes out to the victim and family.

Stony Plain, AB- Two people have died has a result of a collision which occurred on November 10, 2017 on highway 633 approximately 37 km northwest of Stony Plain. At approximately 6:22pm, Stony Plain RCMP, EMS, Fire and Capital West Traffic Services were called to a two vehicle motor vehicle collision on highway 37 at Range Road 31.

A sedan travelling east on highway 633 collided with a westbound SUV. The lone occupant of the sedan, a 61 year old male was pronounced dead at the scene. The three occupants of the SUV were transported to hospital, where a 32 year old woman succumbed to her injuries. The remaining two occupants are being treated for non life threatening injuries. The two deceased were both from the Stony Plain area. Names of the deceased are not being released at this time.

The highway was impassable for several hours, but normal traffic has now resumed. The RCMP, with the assistance of the RCMP Collision Analyst are continuing with the investigation.

The Municipal Centre Concept Plan will be discussed at Whitecourt Town Council's upcoming planning session, and a copy of the report is available online at www.whitecourt.


