

This week we entered the final stretch before the winter break. We covered topics including the legalization of marijuana, national security, impaired driving, and homelessness.

• Bill C-45 — An Act respecting cannabis and to amend the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act, the Criminal Code and other Acts (Third Reading) • Bill C-59 – An Act respecting national security matters (Referral to Committee Before Second Reading) • Bill C-348 – An Act to Amend

the Department of Employment and Social Development Act (persons with disabilities) (Second Reading)

• Bill C-365 – An Act to amend the Criminal Code (firefighting equipment) (Second Reading)

• Bill S-211 – National Sickle Cell Awareness Day Act (Third Reading) • Conservative Motion – Finance Minister's assets

• Motion No. 133 – British Home Child Day

Motion No. 147 - Special Com-

mittee on Homelessness

• Motion No. 148 – National Impaired Driving Prevention Week

On Monday, I spoke on Bill C-59, which makes several changes to Canada's national security agencies, including the Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS) and the Communications Security Establishment (CSE). You can find my questions and comments in the House on the corresponding day's Hansard on the House Publications page at www.ourcommons.ca/en.

In the Standing Committee on Industry, Science and Technology (INDU), we heard witnesses for a potential study on broadband connectivity in rural areas. We also began the consideration of a draft report on Canada's Anti-Spam Laws (CASL). This week, I attended ¬¬six meetings and six events, as well as recorded one message. Look for my update next Friday on the happenings of Parliament as the House will continue to sit next week.







## **STAY ON YOUR FEET AND STAY ACTIVE:** NOVEMBER IS SENIORS' FALLS PREVENTION MONTH

Let's face it; falls can happen to anyone at any time but the reality is, as we get older our risk of falling increases. Falls are the leading cause of injury among older adults over the age of 65, and one in three Alberta seniors will fall once a year. With or without an injury, seniors who experience a fall may develop a fear of falling. This can lead to restricting activity, which can increase their risk for another fall.

"It is important to encourage seniors to get out and stay active in their communities," says Emily Post, Provincial Continuing Care. "It is easy to think that restricting activity may reduce your risk of falling, but it can negatively affect your quality of life, contribute to physical inactivity and decreased muscle mass and lead to social isolation."

November is Falls Prevention Month. This year's theme is Finding Balance – Stay Independent. Prevent Falls. "Falls risk management and prevention is everyone's responsibility. I challenge you to look around your environment and find something that could increase someone's risk of falling – this might be in your home, at work or in your community – and make a change. We all have a role to play to help prevent a fall before it happens."

While Fall Prevention Month is geared to seniors, it's a good opportunity to remind all Albertans about the risk of falling. As temperatures drop, the risk of snow and ice increases. Every year, thousands of Albertans are hurt falling on icy roads and walkways.

Injury prevention experts say the best way to avoid falls on ice and snow is to walk like a penguin.

- -Stay low
- -Feet pointed out
- -Walk flat footed
- -Use your arms for balance

It's not the fastest or most graceful

way to walk, but it will help keep you on your feet.

Onoway Museum was the site of a stirring celebration – recognition of the strong Indigenous history in this area, the belief that working together will be beneficial to all and that the arts provide a powerful means to this end.

The opening of an art exhibit at the museum brought together Chief Tony Alexis and members of Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation with representatives and community members of Onoway and area.

"Daguciyami" art exhibit will be shown in the Onoway Museum through November to the end of January. The goal of this kinship exhibit is to restore relationships through indigenous perspectives and features work by two Alexis Nakota Sioux Nation members who are both attended school in Onoway.

Eugene Alexis graduated from OHS in 1985, studied art at Alberta College of Art, pursuing a lifelong interest in art. The works on display include mixed media on canvas and paintings on "slices" of trees. After graduation, Chloe Buebird Mustooch studied visual arts at Emily Carr University in Vancouver and is back at Alexis where she is working in the Heritage and Language Department. Her current focus is graphic arts, using creative banners to send a message in this exhibit.

Chief Tony Alexis noted that this type of coming together provides true hope and recognizes the need to work together. Eugene Alexis observed that this gathering shows that the culture is still intact although the language needs revitalization. Ronald Potts, an Alexis elder, reminded those present that local native people helped farmers and had a lot to do with development of agricultural land.

Terry Slemko, representing Onoway and District Historical Guild, welcomed this unique exhibit as a move forward in the Guild's goal of helping to present a more complete picture of local history. Onoway Mayor Judy Tracy welcomed the opportunity that this exhibit brings to facilitate greater understanding. To MLA Oneil Carlier, art is an ideal way to learn about and enjoy culture. Reeve Joe Blakeman's long family history in this area recognizes that working with Alexis was part of it.

A prayer led by elders was followed by drumming and a round dance with all present participating. To top it off, everyone joined in a feast featuring bannock, moose soup, and berries provided by Alexis First Nation and snacks offered by Historical Guild members.




