YELLOWHEAD 911 ACCEPTING EMERGENCY TEXT MESSAGES

Submitted by Stefan Felsing, Communications Coordinator | Yellowhead County

(November 29, 2017) – Yellowhead Regional Emergency Communication Centre (YRECC) incorporates a T911 feature, which allows persons who are deaf, deafened, hard-of-hearing or speech impaired (DHHSI)

to use their mobile phones for emergency text communication.

The service is meant for DH-HSI persons, though it is available to all family and friends of DHHSI persons, who are also encouraged to register for T911 to keep emergency services accessible. This service will not work without prior registration with your carrier.

Before using this service, you must register for T911 through your wireless carrier and ensure that your device is compatible with the service. Users of T911 still must dial 9-1-1 to reach an operator; however, after dialing through, their mobile device will then prompt messages via text. Keep in mind that the service is still limited by the range of your network, and does require a messaging plan to work.



RCMP REMIND PUBLIC OF PASSING EMERGENCY VEHICLES PROCEDURES

Grande Prairie and Beaverlodge, Alberta – On November 23, 2017, Beaverlodge RCMP were called to assist with directing traffic while a vehicle was being removed from the ditch on highway 43 near Demmitt Alberta.

At approximately 9:30 PM a motorist approached the scene but

failed to observe the emergency lights, attempted to go around the police vehicle thus striking the rear driver side corner of the police vehicle. Both the police vehicle and the offending vehicle sustained damages. None of the parties involved suffered any injuries.

The 30-year-old female driver from Dawson Creek will be facing charges of Careless Driving.

When driving, incidents may

cause the lanes of the roadway to be blocked or narrowed. Some examples of this are traffic collisions, disabled vehicles, spilled cargo, and highway maintenance or construction.

The RCMP would like to remind motorist that flashing lights from emergency vehicles will warn you of a problem ahead. Reduce speed, carefully change lanes if necessary and be prepared to stop. Follow directions given by emergency personnel directing traffic. Be aware that the vehicle ahead of you may stop or reduce speed unexpectedly to view the scene.

Not only is it common sense to slow down past emergency vehicles, it's also the law.

Fines are double in Alberta if you speed past stopped police vehicles, ambulances, fire and tow trucks with their lights flashing.

PRIVATE DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL

Parkland County has a program that provides funding to physically challenged residents for snow removal from their private driveways.

Criteria:

- Person applying must be the owner or renter of the residence where the driveway is being plowed, and it must be their primary residence.
- Residence must be located within Parkland County.
- Person must be physically challenged either by age or infirmity and must provide a Doctor's certificate or note verifying that they are physically unable to remove snow from their driveway.
- All persons 18 years or older living in the residence must be physically challenged.

Residents can apply by submitting a letter stating their name, address and phone number along with the required Doctor's Certificate to:

Applications will be reviewed and residents contacted regarding their application. If approved, the resident will be responsible for hiring a private contractor to remove the snow. Residents then submit proof of work completed, via paid invoice, to the County for reimbursement. The current maximum reimbursement per approved resident per year is \$300. PARLIAMENT UPDATE - WEEK OF NOVEMBER 27, 2017

We are now two weeks into the final stretch before the winter break. We covered topics including the budget, national security, de-radicalization, and distracted driving.

The House of Commons debated the following:

- Bill C-59 An Act respecting national security matters (Second Reading and Committee Stage)
- Bill C-63 Budget Implementation Act, 2017, No. 2 (Report Stage)
- Bill C-354 An Act to amend the Department of Public Works

and Government Services Act (use of wood) (Second Reading)

- Bill C-371 Prevention of Radicalization through Foreign Funding Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-373 Federal Framework on Distracted Driving Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-378 An Act to amend the Department of Veterans Affairs Act (fairness principles) (Second Reading)
- Bill S-3 An Act to amend the Indian Act (elimination of sex-based inequities in registration) (Consideration of Messages between the Senate and the House of

Commons)
