Winfield, Alberta - Breton RCMP are asking for the public's help to locate and return six horses to their owners after they were stolen from a Winfield area farm. Sometime during the night of December 6th, unknown person(s) entered a property along Highway 13 between Buck Lake and Winfield. Tire tracks at the scene indicate that a truck and trailer were brought in and six horses were loaded. The animals were discovered to have been taken the

following morning by the owners. The animals are described as:

1. Socorro - 2006 all grey Hanoverian gelding, 16.3 hands high (hh), Hanoverian brand on back left hip, scar on back right leg

AIRCRAFT ENDANGERMENT - STURGEON COUNTY, AB

On the evening of December 6th, 2017 Nav Canada informed Morinville RCMP of an incident near the Villeneuve Airport in Sturgeon County wherein an approaching aircraft was struck with a green laser. Fortunately, the pilot was able to land the aircraft safely. Morinville RCMP

want to remind the public of the dangers of a laser strike on an aircraft. The laser can temporarily blind the pilot, create intense glare that affect's the pilots vision, and distract the pilot putting all people aboard the aircraft at serious risk. As per Transport Canada's website there were over 500 reported laser strikes in 2016. It's a disturbing statistic - it means the safety of pilots,

crew and passengers were put at risk 500 times that year. Pointing a laser at an aircraft is illegal and a criminal offence. Under the Aeronautics Act, if you are convicted of pointing a laser at an aircraft, you could face up to \$100 000 in fines, 5 years in jail or both.

Week of December 4, 2017

This week was busy in the House of Commons as we prepare for the winter break. We covered topics including ISIS fighters, indigenous rights and education, the salaries of Ministers, and access to information.

The House of Commons debated the following:

- Bill C-24 An Act to amend the Salaries Act and to make a consequential amendment to the Financial Administration Act (Report Stage)
- Bill C-58 An Act to amend the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Third Reading)
- Bill C-61 Anishinabek Nation Education Agreement Act (Third Reading)
- Bill C-66 Expungement of Historically Unjust Convictions Act (Second Reading)
- Bill S-236 Recognition of Charlottetown as the Birthplace

of Confederation Act (Report Stage)

- CPC Motion ISIS Fighters Returning to Canada
- Bill C-262 United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-352 An Act to amend the Canada Shipping Act, 2001 and to provide for the development of a national strategy (abandonment of vessels) (Second Reading/deemed nonvotable)
- Bill C-364 An Act to amend the Canada Elections Act and to make a consequential amendment to another Act (political financing) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-375 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (presentence report) (Second Reading)
- Bill C-377 An Act to change the name of the electoral district of Châteauguay—Lacolle (Second Reading)
- I participated in debate on the Conservative Motion (ISIS Fighters Returning to Canada) by asking a question. You can



CHARGES LAID IN RELATION TO STOLEN SKY SHUTTLE BUS

Leduc, Alberta – Charges have been sworn against an Edmonton woman following the theft of a Sky Shuttle bus from the Edmonton International Airport.

On December 3 at approximately 4:00 pm, a female entered an empty Sky Shuttle bus that was parked, running, at the

airport. The woman stole the bus and drove into the Beaumont and Wetaskiwin RCMP detachment areas before heading North on Hwy 2 into the city of Edmonton. Officers from the RCMP and Edmonton Police were able to track the bus location through the on-board GPS. The bus was driven to West Edmonton Mall where it became immobilized after trying to drive into a park-

ade and striking the roof.

The driver, 22-year-old Nila Isabelle Cacapit, of Edmonton was taken into custody by Edmonton Police and turned over to the Edmonton International Airport RCMP for processing. Cacapit faces seven criminal code charges as a result of these events:

- Theft over \$5000
- Flight from police

- Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle
- Driving while disqualified
- Obstruct peace officer
- Possession of stolen property
- Fail to comply with probation

Cacapit has been remanded into custody and is scheduled to make her first court appearance on December 7th in Leduc Provincial Court.



RCMP REMIND PUBLIC OF PASSING **EMERGENCY VEHICLES PROCEDURES**



Grande Prairie and Beaverlodge, Alberta - On November 23, 2017, Beaverlodge RCMP were called to assist with directing traffic while a vehicle was being removed from the ditch on highway 43 near Demmitt Alberta.

At approximately 9:30 PM a motorist approached the scene but failed to observe the emergency lights, attempted to go around the police vehicle thus striking the rear driver side corner of the police vehicle. Both the police vehicle and the offending vehicle sustained damages. None of the parties involved suffered any injuries.

The 30-year-old female driver from Dawson Creek will be facing charges of Careless Driving.

When driving, incidents may cause the lanes of the roadway to be blocked or narrowed. Some examples of this are traffic collisions, disabled vehicles, spilled cargo, and highway maintenance or construction.

The RCMP would like to remind motorist that flashing lights from emergency vehicles will warn you of a problem ahead. Reduce speed, carefully change lanes if necessary and be prepared to stop. Follow directions given by emergency personnel directing traffic. Be aware that the vehicle ahead of you may stop or reduce speed unexpectedly to view the scene.

Not only is it common sense to slow down past emergency vehicles, it's also the law.

Fines are double in Alberta if you speed past stopped police vehicles, ambulances, fire and tow trucks with their lights flashing.

The Town of Mayerthorpe has the following grants available.

Family & Community Support Services (FCSS) grants must be of a preventative nature that enhances the social well-being of individuals and families through promotion or intervention strategies provided at the earliest opportunity, and do one or more of the following:

• Help people to develop independence, strengthen copies skills and become more resistant to crisis;

- Help people to develop an awareness of social needs;
- Help people to develop interpersonal and group skills, which enhance constructive relationships among people;
- Help people and communities to assume responsibility for decisions and actions, which affect them;
- Provide supports that help sustain people as active participants in the community.

Recreation grants are available for Societies within the Town corporate limits that are developing and maintaining the business aspect of recreation, recreation facilities, parks, and programs for the benefit of residents of Mayerthorpe and area, and registered under the Societies Act of Alberta.

Culture grants are available for cultural Societies within the Town corporate limits that are hosting new cultural events for the benefit of residents of Mayerthorpe and area, and registered under the Societies Act of Alberta.

Tourism grants are available for societies who are developing a tourism-related project that would benefit Mayerthorpe and area, and registered under the Societies Act of Alberta.

Vitalization grants are available for local businesses located in the Town's commercial districts who wish to vitalize the exterior appearance of their building.

Historical Residential Home Rehabilitation grants are available to help support the preservation of historical homes. To encourage rehabilitation of historical residential home exteriors to preserve the past while enhancing the home for the benefit of present and future generations.

Brownfield Redevelopment grants are available to provide funding tools to assist owners of Brownfield sites in revitalizing under-utilized brownfield sites for other uses such as economically viable business opportunities.




