## YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

January 9, 2018

Public Hearing 17.17 – A Public Hearing was held for Bylaw 17.17 that would rezone a property from Rural District (RD) to Country Residential District (CR). The rezoning is required before the property can be subdivided into five CR parcels. No concerns from the public were brought forward. The bylaw will be brought back for additional readings at a future council meeting.

Council Code of Conduct – Council gave third reading to the Council Code of Conduct, Bylaw 02.18. Changes to the MGA states that a municipality must establish a council code of conduct bylaw that governs the conduct of municipal councillors. The code of conduct covers such topics as conflicts of interest, dealing with confidential information, and other terms that council members must conduct themselves under. The bylaw must also, as required by the province, have a formal complaint system and process in place.

Assessment Modifier Impact Non-residential assessment modifiers issued by the provincial government are resulting in significant losses of assessment income to Yellowhead County. These losses have a detrimental impact to services and projects that impact both local industry and residents, but also neighbouring municipalities and organizations who stand to lose funding through local revenue sharing initiatives offered by Yellowhead County. Council endorsed a letter to the Minister of Municipal Affairs voicing these concerns.

YCFD Water Tanker – Council approved the purchase of a new water tanker to replace its aging, 26 year-old tanker, at a cost of \$712,617.00. This new tanker will be built by Rosenbauer/Rocky Mountain Phoenix, and will provide protection to the whole of the county. This new tanker will have a 1,500 gallon per minute rear mounted pump, front bumper mounted attack lines, a remote controlled monitor system and foam system, and will hold 3,600 gallons of water.

RCMP Presentation - Council received an RCMP presentation from Staff Sergeant Chris Murphy, who reviewed crime trends, and RCMP priorities and objectives. Notably, the RCMP is increasingly dealing with citizens having mental health and addiction issues and members do receive some training on handling these calls. Members are also receiving training pertinent to offences related to marijuana legalization. Going forward, the RCMP's priorities will include police visibility, dealing with property crime, and a habitual offender program, which aims to find social resources and help for reoffenders to aid them in breaking the pattern of criminal re-offense.

The next scheduled Council Meeting is January 23, 2018 next scheduled Goals & Priorities Meeting is January 16, 2018. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.

Yellowhead County FCSS will be hosting COMPASS for the Caregiver, a course specifically created for caregivers of parents, spouses, an elderly friend, family member, or children.

According to Caregivers Alberta: "Caregiving can be a stressful, isolating, and overwhelming experience. It can have a negative impact on the caregiver's physical and mental health. COMPASS helps caregivers balance their own well-being with the challenges of caregiving."

During the sessions, the facilitator will be going through a Compass for Caregiver book that is provided by the Alberta Caregivers Association. This multistage course will help caregivers with learning resilience and give them strategies to cope with the stress of caregiving during their journey.
