PUBLIC'S ASSISTANCE REQUESTED IN IDENTIFYING A PERSON OF INTEREST

On December 31, 2017 at approximately 7:00 pm, Drayton

Valley RCMP were called to an incident where a person had been shot at from a vehicle by an unknown male on Highway 624. The victim was not seriously injured in the incident. The suspect vehicle, a white 2010 or newer Ford F150, 4 door truck with possible BC plates, left in an easterly direction on Highway 624. There were 4 occupants in the vehicle, 2 males in the front and 2 females in the back.

The one male suspect was described as follows:

- Caucasian male, approximately 45 years old
- rough complexion, brown eyes, dirty blond/light brown hair
- Hair was longer, stuck out the

sides of the hat

- · round glasses
- green hat with yellow mesh on the back
- stubble on face
- scar on lower right chin
- 5'9" 6' tall, slender build

The attached composite sketch was developed from the description provided by the victim.

Drayton Valley RCMP are being assisted by the Drayton Valley General Investigative Section.

72 HOUR EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS KITS

Are you and your family prepared for an emergency? How about one that may last more than a day and require you to evacuate—or stay at home without power or water?

Yellowhead County residents are encouraged to have emergency kits in place that would allow their households to manage for up to 72 hours without aid. Many lists are available

online detailing the best items to have in a 72 hour emergency preparedness kit, but the county also has kits for purchase (designed for 2 or 4 person households).

These kits contain: Emergency rations (3 days' worth for 2 or 4 people), first aid kit, water purification tablets, 10 liter water container, flashlight with AM/FM radio (solar powered or hand crank), ponchos, reflective vests, Mylar sleeping bags, 40 hour candle, multi-function tool, waterproof matches and much

more

A limited number of kits are being sold and are available for pick up at the Yellowhead County Wildwood Office. Kit prices are as follows: \$160.00 for a 2 person kit, or \$185 for a 4 person kit. You can stop in at the office in Wildwood to purchase a kit, or arrange to pick one up from the County office in Edson.

CANADA SUMMER JOBS 2018 NOW OPEN

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is encouraging organizations in his riding to apply for the 2018 Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ) Program. This unique funding initiative helps employers create summer job opportunities for students between the ages of 15 and 30. The application process starts December 19, 2017.

CSJ provides funding for notfor-profit organizations, public-sector employers and small



businesses with 50 or fewer employees. Not-for-profit organizations can receive up to 100 percent of the provincial/territorial minimum hourly wage, as well as employment-related costs. Public-sector employers and small businesses can receive up to 50 percent of the provincial/territorial minimum hourly

Employers are invited to submit applications that complement this year's national prior-

- Employers who intend to hire youth who are in underrepresented groups, including new immigrant youth/refugees, Indigenous youth, youth with disabilities and visible minorities;
- · Small businesses, in recognition of their contribution to the creation of jobs;
- · Organizations that support opportunities for official language minority communities;
- · Organizations that provide services and/or supports the LGBTQ2 community; and

· Organizations that provide opportunities in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) and Information and Communications Technology (ICT), particularly for women.

"Canada Summer Jobs helps employers create summer job opportunities for students in their communities," said Eglins-ki. "It is designed to focus on local priorities, while achieving tangible results for both students and our communities."

"This is a worthwhile investment into our local businesses, as well as our students and I know it will benefit many," concluded MP Eglinski.

The application period for employers will run from December 19, 2017 to February 2, 2018, which will allow for students to be hired beginning in April 2018. Applications will be available at Service Canada Centres and online at www.canada.ca/ Canada-summer-jobs

PRO-ACTIVE PATROLS RESULT IN CRIME REDUCTION

Duffield, Alberta - On January 15th, 2018, RCMP members were making pro-active patrols in the areas of Alberta Beach and Duffield. As a result of their patrols members made 4 arrests.

While on patrol in the area of Duffield, RCMP members

observed a vehicle parked in a driveway that matched the description of a vehicle involved in a previous assault investigation. Members approached the vehicle and located 4 long barrel firearms in plain view. The vehicle had been reported as stolen. A suspect was located and arrested for possession of stolen property.

Continued patrols resulted in 3 persons being arrested and charged for a multitude of offences and various outstanding warrants.

CRIME REDUCTION RESULTS IN ARRESTS

Submitted by Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove / Enoch RCMP

Spruce Grove, Alberta - On January 12th, 2018, members of the Spruce Grove/ Stony Plain Drug Section and the Spruce Grove / Stony Plain Crime Reduction Unit arrested two males at a residence in the city of Spruce Grove, AB. During the course of the investigation, members found cocaine, Canadian currency and drug trafficking paraphernalia in the residence.

Chaz FELSTAD of Spruce Grove is charged with possession of cocaine for the purpose of trafficking and possession of property obtained by crime under \$5000. Dylan MCLEAN of Spruce Grove is charged with possession of cocaine for the purpose of trafficking, possession of property obtained by crime under \$5000 and drive while suspended.

FELSTAD and MCLEAN are both scheduled to appear at the Stony Plain Provincial Courthouse on February 7th, 2018.

Spruce Grove, Alberta - On January 5th, 2018 members of the Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove Drug Section and the Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove Crime Reduction Unit executed a search warrant at a residence in the City of Spruce Grove. During the execution of the warrant members found cocaine packaged for individual sale, a small amount of methamphetamine and Ca-

nadian currency.

Jody MONGEON of Spruce Grove has been charged with possession of cocaine for the purpose of trafficking, possession of methamphetamine, possession of property obtained by crime and failure to comply with a probation order. MONGEON was remanded into custody, and is next scheduled to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on January 10th, 2018.

Parkland County, Alberta - During the early morning hours of December 7th, 2017, Stony Plain RCMP responded to a complaint of a suspicious vehicle at a rural business. Entry had been gained to one of the buildings. RCMP members took two male suspects into custody after they emerged from the surrounding forested area. A third male suspect was taken into custody after being located by Police Dog Services. Members conducted a search of their vehicle, in which they located a rifle, ammunition, a quantity of methamphetamine and other narcotics. Stolen property was also located at the scene.

Jessy Ranch age 27, Joseph Jones age 22 and Steven Beneke age 31 of the Glenevis and Stony Plain area are facing numerous charges including break and enter, possession of stolen property, possession of controlled substances and charges in relation to the firearm.

Spruce Grove, Alberta – For the past

few months the Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP have been investigating several files in relation to property crimes in the Spruce Grove, Stony Plain and Parkland County areas. The investigation lead to the arrest of Mitch Sydlowski, on December 19, 2017.

On Friday December 15th, 2017 the Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP worked with the Edmonton Police Service on a stolen motor vehicle investigation. A search for Sydlowski was conducted in the Spruce Grove/Stony Plain area. Although both the Police helicopter and Police Dog Services were deployed, police were unable to locate the suspect at this time. On Tuesday December 19, 2017 the Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/ Enoch RCMP Serious Crimes Unit, focusing on Crime Reduction in the detachment area, located Sydlowski at a residence in Spruce Grove. Sydlowski fled from police, however with the assistance of Police Dog Services, he was taken into police custody.

Mitch Sydlowski, age 26, of Parkland County is now facing 19 charges including;

- Possession of stolen property x 10
- Fail to Comply x 6
- Resist Arrest
- Possession of Break and Enter tools
- Possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine)

Sydlowski is set to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on January 3, 2018.

Parkland County, Alberta – Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP have been investigating several files in relation to theft from mailboxes. The thefts have been an ongoing and increasing, as such we have been working in partnership with Canadian Postal Inspectors to explore and maximize crime reduction efforts.

On Thursday December 21th, 2017 the Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP with the assistance of Canadian Postal Inspectors, identified and arrested two suspects in connection to area mailbox thefts.

Jeffrey Gilbert, age 37 and Leah Bantle, age 34 are now facing charges several charges which include:

- Theft of Mail
- · Possession of break in instruments
- Mischief
- Possession of property obtained by Crime.

Both are set to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on January 3, 2018.


Working with our community partners we are dedicated to the continued efforts to reduce these types of property crimes in our area.

FREE ADMISSION TO PARKS FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH STARTING IN 2018

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents of a recent announcement by Parks Canada. Beginning in 2018, admission for youth 17 and under will be free for all national parks, historic sites, and marine conservation areas.

In celebration of Canada's 150th anniversary, the federal government offered free admission for everyone visiting national parks in 2017. Starting in 2018, admission fees will return, but only for visitors over 18 years of age. The change is intended to encourage Canadian families and their children, youth, and school groups to experience the outdoors and learn more about our environment and history.

Fees for campsites and other amenities offered by Parks Canada are not included in the exemption.

"By making our national parks more accessible to our youth and families, they will have more opportunities to learn about the environment and how to protect it for future generations," stated MP Eglinski. "Our youth can also see first-hand the local issues facing Jasper National Park, such as the ongoing pine beetle infestation, as well as gain an appreciation for the outdoors through activities such as hiking at Edith Cavell or skiing at Marmot Basin".

When the federal government announced free admission in 2017, many constituents in Yellowhead expressed concern over the impact that an increase in visitors could have on the Parks. With the government now permanently waiving fees for children and youth, the same concern remains.

"It is up to Parks Canada to man-

age and maintain the quality of the parks. Even with a record number of visitors in 2017, the impact by these visitors on the ecological integrity of Jasper National Park was minimal," concluded MP Eglinski.
