stations provide high-quality drinking water. To protect the water quality and ensure that bulk water remains contaminant free, customers must provide their own clean connection hose. Water hauling containers should not be used for other purposes.

RCMP RESPOND TO TRAIN DERAILMENT IN WABAMUN

The Stony Plain RCMP is asking for the public's assistance in solving a crime in which an unknown suspect set fire to a residence near highway 633 and Onoway.

On January 23, 2018 at approximately 6:30 p.m., a passing motorist saw the flame coming from an unoccupied residence and managed to put the fire out with fire extinguishers. No one

was injured and the house was unoccupied at the time of the fire. The fire caused minimal damage to the exterior wall of the home. Investigators believe that the fire was intentionally set and are asking for the public's help in solving this crime.

New Truck Fill Station in Wildwood!

This bulk water dispensing station is turn-key, self-contained, insulated, and maintenance friendly. The stations cannot be accessed by credit card or cash and will require users to apply for a bulk water credit application.

The Wildwood bulk water station, operated by Yellowhead County Utilities, serves residential, commercial, and industrial water haulers. The water provided is the same water as the Hamlet of Wildwood. The Wildwood Bulk Water truck fill station was commissioned on Jan 9, 2018.

This new bulk water fill station will provide the following benefits

to truck fill users:

- Upgraded infrastructure to prevent pump breakdowns and maintenance issues
- Sufficient storage capacity to prevent pump shutdowns from high usage
- Site security to:
 - Deter vandalism
 - Protect water quality
 - Prevent rate increases

The fill station is accessible 24/7 and the connections are 4" female camlock with a delivery rate of 15 l/sec. or a 2" female camlock at 6 l/sec.

The water station is located behind the Yellowhead County East Services Building at 53404 Range Road 92A (south of Highway 16)

in Wildwood. Visit our website for rates and bulk water credit application form at www.bit.ly/YCwater-utility or www.yellowheadcounty.ab.ca. You can also call Yellowhead County at 1-800-665-6030 or 780-723-4800 between 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM for credit application information.

Yellowhead County operates four truck-fill stations in Yellowhead County for customers who may not receive serviced water, including:

- Commercial water haulers,
- Construction companies,
- Agriculture,
- Acreage and business owners.

The other County sites for bulk water stations are:

Peers Water Treatment Plant, Marlboro Water Treatment Plant, and Brule Fire Hall.

The new system can be:

- heated,
- and features:
 - reduced pressure backflow prevention device,
 - stainless steel piping,
 - meter,
 - drain valve on overhead fill point
- access terminal, and includes:
 - a low volume fill point (barrel fill), and
 - an overhead fill support.

RCMP COLLABORATION RESULTS IN TWO ARRESTS

Kinsella, Alberta – A male and female have been arrested and charged after they were allegedly involved in a brazen residential break and enter.

On February 5, 2018 Viking RCMP responded to an address on 110 Range Road in response to a break and enter in progress. The home owner found a male suspect breaking into his garage in attempts to steal his truck. The victim attempted to intervene when he was threatened by the suspect. The victim was not injured.

The male suspect picked up the female suspect in the stolen truck and departed the residence. The suspects then abandoned that vehicle in a ditch and got into a previously abandoned stolen truck. RCMP spotted the pair in the area but due to public safety concerns a pursuit was not initiated.

At approximately 1:00 p.m., the suspects stole another truck from a gas station in Viking and was last seen headed westbound on Highway 14.

A collaborative investigation between Stony Plain RCMP and Viking RCMP lead to both suspects being identified a short time later.

Information sharing and cooperation from the public was integral in locating the suspects who were wanted on previous Criminal Code charges out of Edmonton. On February 7, 2018 both suspects were arrested without incident by Stony Plain RCMP.

Abray Wayne Isaac (35) of Spruce Grove is facing several Criminal Code charges including Break and Enter, Uttering Threats, Possession

of Stolen Property, Theft of Motor Vehicle, Drive while disqualified, and Breach of Probation. He has been remanded into custody for a court appearance on February 26, 2018 in Vegreville.

Alicia Christine Silva (23) of Spruce Grove is facing several Criminal Code charges including: Possession of Stolen Property and two counts of Theft of Motor Vehicle. She was released on bail and is

due in Vegreville Provincial Court on February 26, 2018.

The relationship between the RCMP and the members of our communities is a partnership. We need residents to be the eyes and ears of their communities and to report suspicious activity as soon as they are aware.

As this matter is now before the courts, no further information will be provided.



• Trustees approved an amendment to Policy 7 - Board Operations, to reflect the current costs associated with the technology and telecommunication fees that are required to fulfill the role of the trustee.

• Ken Baluch, Director of Facility Services, updated the

Always wanted to try ice fishing but just don't have the know-how? This event is for you! How does it work?

Step 1: Register at albertakidscatch.com. Registration opens February 1. **Step 2:** Read the FAQs at albertakidscatch.com to prepare for a day on the ice. **Step 3:** Park at Waterfront Park located at the end of 50th Street in the Village of Wabamun. Load up your toboggan with folding chairs and snacks and walk to the event site on the ice. **Step 4:** Sign in at the TransAlta Kids Can Catch registration tent. **Step 5:** Borrow an ice fishing rod from the Cabela's tent on the ice (or bring your own rod if you have one). **Step 6:** Find a pre-drilled hole and drop a line. Fishing mentors are on the ice with fishing tips and to help you safely catch and release fish.



Important info: • Wabamun Lake Kids Can Catch takes place on Alberta's Family Fishing Weekend, so no fishing licences are required • Free hotdogs and hot chocolate (while supplies last) • This event will be cancelled if the temperatures dips below -20 (with or without wind chill) or the ice is assessed as unsafe. YOUR DIY WEDDING GUIDE

ute addition to the guest list.

- **Favors:** Create favors that work with the theme of your wedding and make them yourself. These can be candles, fruit preserves, soaps, baked goods, or anything else that appeals to you. The cost of making them in bulk may turn out to be less than purchasing manufactured items.

Plus, guests get to take home something that came directly from you.

- **Video:** Enlist a friend or family member to capture the wedding and after-party on video for you. You can use video-editing software available through popular apps to piece together your own wedding video memem-

to.

Couples about to tie the knot can become more hands-on in wedding planning and execution. By handling some of the work themselves, couples can save a considerable amount of money. A do-it-yourself approach also may foster feelings of pride in a job well done.

Food can make or break a wedding reception. Couples researching potential reception sites for their parties should be sure to schedule tastings and confirm how the foods will look upon being served. In addition to the taste of the food, couples may want to consider which menu items are offered - particularly those that align with the latest trends in wedding reception catering.
