MLA CARLIER AND RCMP WILL ATTEND APRIL 5 RURAL CRIME WATCH MEETING IN ONOWAY

Unfortunately, Onoway and area is no stranger to the recent rash of property theft/damage in rural Alberta. Individual responses to date involve erecting gates, putting up security cameras, and installing security systems. But a community response is wholly more effective. For efficacious and long-standing change, we need to come together to influence public pol-

icy at the provincial and federal levels. Thankfully, Onoway and the surrounding community has a pre-existing grassroots mechanism for channeling local concerns to Edmonton and Ottawa: The Lac Ste. Anne North East Chapter of the Rural Crime Watch Board.

Provincially, the government recently announced \$10 million to be spent on hiring more RCMP officers, civilian staff and Crown prosecutors to deal with rural crime. At the provincial level, we are pleased to advise that Honourable Oneil Carlier,

MLA for Whitecourt-Lac Ste. Anne, will be in attendance at our next Rural Crime Watch board public meeting, April 5, 2018 at 7 p.m. in Room 3 at the Heritage Centre, in Onoway, to speak to the Government of Alberta's seven-part strategy.

Federally, MP Dane Lloyd, Sturgeon River-Parkland, won the October 23, 2017 by election, and promptly reached out to our board for feedback on rural crime.

A highlight of the year was achieving Recognized Museum status for the second consecutive term. This means that the Onoway Museum meets the exacting standards set by the Alberta Museums Association – not an easy task!

Thanks to several grants, major changes were made to the build-

ing that is the Onoway Museum/ Heritage Centre. The very vital re-shingling of the museum roof and replacement of flooring in the museum hallway mean that artifacts and exhibits are now securely sheltered from leaks in the roof of the 1921 building. Installation of automatic door openers, thanks to a Rick Hansen Grant, has made building access much easier for those with mobility problems.

The Guild hosted a couple of major exhibits, both art oriented. An art showcase in spring made the community aware that Onoway is home to many talented artists who work in different media. A unique exhibit, "Da-

guciyami", featured artworks by Alexis Sioux Nation members Eugene Alexis and Chloe Bluebird Mustooch who both attended school at Onoway. It was kicked off with a cultural celebration to be remembered!

The Museum/Heritage Centre continues to be busy – 38,943 people visited the facility in 2017 to participate in club/organization activities, attend Play-School, visit Onoway Public Library, take music lessons or be part of many different activities sponsored by groups and individuals.

As one of a dozen rural MPs looking to launch a rural crime task force, Lloyd indicated he was interested in stakeholder input. He posed pointed questions around crime prevention, investigation, prosecution and punishment, such as "what measures are currently being taken to prevent rural crime," and "what efforts and best practices are working?"

Mrs. Lisa Johnson, Treasurer, Rural Crime Watch Board, Lac Ste. Anne North East Chapter, took Lloyd up on his invitation, and had a candid conversation with the MP about her concerns specific to our region, such as RCMP response times, lack of communication between local detachments, and the need to establish meaningful relationships between the RCMP and local residents. To weigh in with

PARLIAMENT UPDATE **WEEK OF MARCH 19, 2018**

This week, debate was largely focused on Budget 2018. We also covered topics including distracted driving, Latin American heritage, and the invitation of an attempted assassin to a state dinner with the Prime Minister

The following was debated in the House:

Budget 2018

- Bill C-373, an act respecting a federal framework on distracted driving (Second Reading)
- Bill S-218, an act respecting Latin American heritage month (Second Reading)
- Opposition Motion-National Security Advisor to the Prime Minister

On Tuesday, I participated in debate on Bill C-373, which would implement a national framework on distracted driving. You can read all debates in the House on the corresponding day's Hansard at www.ourcom-

Also on Tuesday, the Liberals introduced new firearms legislation, Bill C-71. I believe that the safety of Canadians should be the number one priority of any government. This issue is especially important to our riding due to the increase in rural crime in the region. Unfortunately, this legislation has no new measures to combat escalating crime rates in our rural communities, or to reduce gang violence in Surrey and Toronto. Bill C-71 will be debated next week and I expect to speak on the legislation on Tuesday.

I was unable to attend two events in the riding this weekend as we had a marathon voting session that began on Thursday evening and continued well into Friday. The Liberals were given the choice to be transparent with Canadians and allow the National Security Advisor to brief Parliamentarians about the Prime Minister's trip to India, or face up to 40 hours of voting in the House of Commons.

The Prime Minister failed to be honest with Canadians about the Atwal affair. He embarrassingly continues to support a conspiracy theory that the Indian Government tried to sabotage his

It is imperative that the National Security Advisor provide Members of Parliament with the same information provided to journalists on February 23, 2018. This will help Canadians understand if the Prime Minister is telling the truth.

In the Standing Committee on Canadian Heritage (CHPC), we continued our study on the state of Canadian museums. For more information on these meetings, visit the CHPC Committee website at www.ourcommons.ca/ Committees/en/CHPC.

This week, I attended nine meetings, three events, and taped one video message. Next week, the House will sit from Monday through Thursday before the Easter holiday. Look for my next update on Thursday on the happenings of Parliament.



(MS) - As building codes enforce tightened minimum standards for eco-responsibility, the more progressive builders are illustrating their own accountability by using and producing materials that are even more efficient than mandates demand. This is great news if you

Building code revisions worldwide are ushering a whole new generation of structures that are between 35 and 40 percent more environmentally responsible. The improved practices in construction are showcasing advancements in wall building, windows, insulation and air-infiltration.

"Switching from wood-framing to concrete walls, for example, has so many spin-off benefits," explains Natalie Rodgers of Nudura, the manufacturer of an advanced building method called the insulated concrete form (ICF). "Solid, air-tight concrete walls would initially lower your energy bills. You'll live in a stronger, more comfortable home while the investment grows in resale value. As importantly, your home would create far lower demand on natural resources."

Designed like Lego, the interlocking Nudura forms are designed with monolithic concrete sandwiched between two continuous layers of expanded polystyrene (EPS) foam.

"The foam material isolates the

concrete and significantly reduces the flow of heat through the wall," says Rodgers. "It stabilizes the internal temperature from day to night fluctuations and provides a largely self-regulating environment. This faster method of construction creates one solid concrete wall."

As a result, you will need less energy for mechanical heating and cooling, delivering cost savings throughout the year. A home built with this concrete system is stronger, provides greater safety, offers greater sound and fire resistance, and would be far less prone to mold, cold spots and drafts.

"Benefits are plentiful to builders, too," says Rodgers. "The patented hinged web allows the forms to fold flat, requiring smaller shipping space and less manpower than other methods."

If you want your builder to use insulated concrete forms, be sure to make the request well before construction gets underway.

To former apartment dwellers or those who have never enjoyed the benefit of a dedicated laundry area, even the smallest washer and dryer space can seem like a luxury.

The benefits of dedicated laundry rooms abound. However, disorganized laundry rooms can nullify such benefits. Depending on the needs and preferences of each homeowner, laundry room designs can be customized for convenience.

Employ vertical space

However, newer homes may have plumbing installed directly through the floor or walls. It is still a worthwhile idea to have a sink in the laundry room for rinsing out stains, handwashing items and having a go-to sink for messier cleanup.

Utilize a tension rod

A rod installed between two cabinets or across a narrow width of space in the laundry room is a handy spot to hang shirts or pants

to prevent wrinkling. Repurposing a ladder and suspending it from the ceiling also creates a spot to hang

Consider laundry room flooring It's important to select flooring materials that will not be damaged by contact with moisture or spills. Vinyl, tile and some composite products often make good laundry room floor materials. Resilient flooring that mimics the look of hardwood may add a classy touch, and give the appearance of wood without having to worry about damage. To alleviate fatigue while spending long moments in the laundry room, invest in a memory foam mat that can be placed underfoot.

Keep lighting in mind

Lighting can be important in the laundry room. Rely on task lighting, under-cabinet strip lighting and overhead lights as needed for efficiency.

Laundry room design can maximize the space available and make it more convenient to launder and sort clothes.



DID YOU KNOW? CLEAN AIR FILTERS

Cars and trucks can benefit greatly from clean air filters. Many drivers are aware of the need to change the oil in their vehicles according to the intervals designated in their owners' manuals, but few may be aware of the many benefits of changing air filters. One such benefit pertains to fuel efficiency. The automotive website CarsDirect. com notes that studies have shown that changing clogged air filters can improve fuel efficiency by as much as 10 percent and save drivers as much as 15 cents per gallon of fuel. Clean air filters also can benefit the environment. When vehicle air filters are clogged, air flow to the engine is reduced, adversely affecting vehicle emissions. Clean filters increase air flow to the engine, reducing vehicle emissions as a result. Clean air filters also can help drivers get more out of their vehicle investments. Designed to trap dirt and debris, clean air filters prolong engine life by preventing such particles from damaging engine components. Drivers can check their owners' manuals for air filter replacement guidelines, but manufacturers generally advise drivers change their air filters every 12,000 to 15,000 miles. Such a repair is inexpensive but can go a long way toward ensuring vehicles operate as efficiently as possible.

SOME TELLTALE SIGNS OF ENGINE TROUBLES

Engine troubles are many drivers' worst nightmares. Whether they occur out on the road or they prevent drivers from leaving their driveways in the morning, engine troubles can quickly derail plans and cost drivers substantial amounts of money.

Thankfully, engine troubles are often noticeable long before cars break down. Drivers who learn to recognize the signs that suggest engines might be in need of work can avoid being stranded on the road or at home.

• Vehicle shaking: One telltale sign of engine trouble is when a vehicle shakes while it's moving. Drivers of old cars and trucks may not expect the smoothest of rides, but cars that shake, sometimes violently, could be experiencing problems. Sometimes a car might shake if its spark plugs need replacing. That's an easy, inexpensive fix that drivers can do on their own in a matter of minutes. A more serious cause of the vehicle

shaking could be problems with its timing belt or fuel intake system. Drivers who inspect and/or replace their spark plugs but notice their vehicles are still shaking should take their cars into their mechanics immediately.

- Sudden gas mileage reduction: Drivers who notice they're not getting as much bang for their gas bucks as they used to might have engine troubles to blame. According to Pep Boys, a dropoff in gas mileage might be indicative of an issue in the compression stroke of the engine. Such an issue can typically be fixed by having the fuel system serviced, which will clean the fuel system and can help restore the vehicle's performance and reduce emissions.
- Noises: If driving has become as noisy as a rock concert, drivers should take heed that this could be indicative of engine trouble. Pep Boys notes that noises typically indicate abnormalities in the combus-

tion flow. Such noises may include knocking, hissing and popping. Vehicles making these noises should be taken to a mechanic immediately.

• Stalling: Vehicles that jerk or stall also may be experiencing engine troubles. While old spark plugs might be the culprit, stalling or jerking may indicate clogged fuel lines or fuel filters. Such issues may also be traced to issues with the vehicle's computer system. Bring such issues to the attention of a mechanic, and reduce their frequency with regular oil changes.


