NO SPRAY PROGRAM YEARLY RENEWAL REMINDER

If you are a Yellowhead County landowner who does not want herbicide applied adjacent to your property, you must enter into a no-spray agreement with the County

prior to April 1st of each year. This means that you will be responsible for weed and brush control in the designated areas, as defined by the no-spray agreement. Once an agreement has been completed, you must place no-spray signs in a highly visible area as close as possible to the property line. No-spray signs must

be purchased from the Yellowhead County Edson or Wildwood Offices at a cost of \$5.00 for two signs.

Yellowhead County Agricultural Services requires each landowner who has signed the agreement to fulfill their obligations before the July 1st deadline.

JOINT OPERATION RESULTS IN DRUG TRAFFICKING CHARGES

Stony Plain, Alberta- On March 2nd, 2018 members of the Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove Serious Crime Unit, Edmonton General Investigation Section, K Division Auto Theft Section (North), and the Central Alberta District Integrated Crime Reduction Unit conducted a joint investigation into the trafficking

of stolen vehicles in the Spruce Grove area. As a result, two suspects were arrested in the city of Edmonton and a stolen 2017 Nissan Titan pickup truck was recovered.

At the time of arrest, the two suspects were also in possession of 28 grams of fentanyl, 8 grams of methamphetamine, 87 grams of marihuana, Canadian currency, drug trafficking paraphernalia and a stolen handgun which was loaded when found

by police.

34-year-old Brady SHIVAK of Stony Plain, AB faces numerous charges including;

- possession of a stolen firearm
- possession of a firearm without holding a proper license
- possession of fentanyl for the purpose of trafficking
- possession of methamphetamine for the purpose of trafficking
- possession of marihuana
- trafficking in property ob-

tained by crime over \$5000

21-year-old Winter ALGER of Sylvan Lake, AB faces numerous charges including:

- possession of a stolen firearm
- possession of fentanyl for the purpose of trafficking
- possession of methamphetamine for the purpose of trafficking
- possession of marihuana
- trafficking in property obtained by crime over \$5000

Both SHIVAK and ALGER were remanded into custody, and were scheduled to appear in Edmonton Provincial Court on March 6th, 2018.

The RCMP crime reduction model is a targeted, evidence-based approach to policing. It uses intelligence-driven analysis to identify repeat offenders, prolific addresses and crime hot spots, and conduct targeted enforcement initiatives with the goal of reducing crime in Alberta.

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF MARCH 19

This week, debate was largely focused on Budget 2018. We also covered topics including distracted driving, Latin American heritage, and the invitation of an attempted assassin to a state dinner with the Prime Minister.

The following was debated in the House:

- Budget 2018
- Bill C-373, an act respecting a federal framework on distracted driving (Second Reading)
- Bill S-218, an act respecting Latin American heritage month (Second Reading)
- Opposition Motion—National Security Advisor to the Prime Minister

On Tuesday, I participated in debate on Bill C-373, which would implement a national framework on distracted driving. You can read all debates in the House on the corresponding day's Hansard at www.ourcommons.ca/en.

Also on Tuesday, the Liberals

introduced new firearms legislation, Bill C-71. I believe that the safety of Canadians should be the number one priority of any government. This issue is especially important to our riding due to the increase in rural crime in the region. Unfortunately, this legislation has no new measures to combat escalating crime rates in our rural communities, or to reduce gang violence in Surrey and Toronto. Bill C-71 will be debated next week and I expect to speak on the legislation on Tuesday.

I was unable to attend two events in the riding this weekend as we had a marathon voting session that began on Thursday evening and continued well into Friday. The Liberals were given the choice to be transparent with Canadians and allow the National Security Advisor to brief Parliamentarians about the Prime Minister's trip to India, or face up to 40 hours of voting in the House of Commons.

The Prime Minister failed to be honest with Canadians about the

Atwal affair. He embarrassingly continues to support a conspiracy theory that the Indian Government tried to sabotage his trip.

It is imperative that the National Security Advisor provide Members of Parliament with the same information provided to journalists on February 23, 2018. This will help Canadians understand if the Prime Minister is telling the truth.

In the Standing Committee on Canadian Heritage (CHPC), we

continued our study on the state of Canadian museums. For more information on these meetings, visit the CHPC Committee website at www.ourcommons.ca/Committees/en/CHPC.

This week, I attended nine meetings, three events, and taped one video message. Next week, the House will sit from Monday through Thursday before the Easter holiday. Look for my next update on Thursday on the happenings of Parliament.



COMPLETE THESE HOME IMPROVEMENTS OVER THE WEEKEND

Home improvement projects ramp up when the weather warms up, as homeowners channel the rejuvenating feelings of spring and tackle their home to-do lists. Large-scale renovations can greatly affect a home, but smaller projects can yield impressive results and be completed over the course of a single weekend.

If time is of the essence, these weekend or one-day projects may satisfy homeowners' desires to fix up their homes.

- Create an accent wall. Painting a focal wall in a home can create a serious impact. The bonus is it will not take as long or require as many materials as painting an entire room.

Accent walls frequently feature a bold color, so decide on placement and tackle this project in less than a day.

- Install stair runners. Dress up hardwood stairs with decorative carpet runners. Runners come in elongated pieces of carpeting or individual pieces that can be placed

on each step. If carpeting doesn't fit with the home's design, painting individual stair treads also can create visual appeal.

- Dress up the entryway. An entryway is a guest's first impression of a home. Many entryways can use a minor overhaul, both inside and outside. Paint the front door a different color so it pops from the curb. Install a new mailbox or decorative house numbers. A new welcome mat can change the look as well. Inside, consider laying a new floor. Resilient vinyl tiles come in many different patterns and can mimic the look of wood, travertine or marble. Installing a floor can take a day or two.

- Install a new faucet. Instantly improve a kitchen or a bathroom with new fixtures. New faucets can provide aesthetic appeal and low-flow faucets can help conserve water.

- Create a gallery on the staircase. Gather and arrange framed photos, artwork or wall accents so that they ascend the wall of a staircase. This creates a designer touch and can dress up an often barren area of wall space.

- Install a fresh light fixture. Improve drab spaces with a little illumination. Better Homes & Gardens suggests replacing an existing fixture with something new and vibrant. If hanging a new fixture is not within one's skill set, free-standing table or floor lamps also can cast a new glow on a space.

- Add molding. Molding can add instant aesthetic appeal to a room. Molding is appropriate near the floor, at the top of walls where they meet the ceiling, or even mid-wall as a chair rail. Some homeowners like to create framed molding on walls in formal living spaces.

- Update kitchen or bathroom hardware. Replacing hardware is a fast and easy project, but one that can have immediate impact. Swap out tired or outdated hardware for newer brushed metals and more impactful shapes and designs.

Home renovations do not need to take weeks or months. Many projects can be completed over the course of a weekend.

HOW TO CLEAR A CLOGGED DRAIN

Home plumbing systems are designed to handle heavy usage. When everything is working as it should, toilets flush, showers drain properly, and sink basins empty of water in a snap. But when a clog is present in a system, water can quickly back up.

There are various techniques to clear clogged drains. Minor clogs may be cleared without the help of a plumber or even any tools. More significant blockages will require more elbow grease.

The first step to clearing a clog is to locate the problem. Drainage issues that affect a particular sink or toilet may be isolated to that fixture. Clogs that are present throughout the house may be indicative of a larger problem in the plumbing that is directing waste away from the house and into the sewer system.

Sometimes a clog can be freed by pouring boiling hot water or a combination of baking soda and vinegar down the drain. If that doesn't help, move on to a plunger, advise the experts at This Old House. By creating pressure within the pipes, a plunger can dislodge whatever is causing the backup. If the clog seems to be further down the drain, hair or grime may have become trapped. An auger, often referred to as a "plumber's snake," can be inserted into the drain to remove the grime and free up the water flow. Homeowners without access to an auger can try to fish the clog out of the drain with a wire hanger.

If clogs cannot be alleviated, drain traps may need to be accessed. Those who do not know their way around pipes and wrenches should hire a professional.

Simple Maintenance Tips To Keep Your Ride Running Strong

Whether your vehicle is brand new or has some tread on its tire, consult the owner's manual for manufacturer recommendations with regard to changing fluids and replacing filters. Many recent models can now be driven roughly 5,000 miles before they need an oil change, but check your owner's manual for the guidelines established by your vehicle's manufacturer, and adhere to that schedule religiously. If you drive an older car, recognize that the vehicle may benefit from more frequent oil changes and tuneups.

In addition, read the manual for additional guidelines, such as how often to replace the air

filter, headlight, turn signal and brake lamps, windshield wipers, and other vehicle parts that can wear down over time.

Look under the hood as well. While many drivers feel that the area beneath their vehicles' hoods is best left to the professionals, you can still lift up the hood every so often to see if there are any glaring problems that demand attention. Inspect rubber belts for signs of wear and tear, and know that such belts may need to be replaced every 50,000 miles or even more frequently depending on your driving habits. Lifting the hood is also necessary when checking fluid levels, which you should

check periodically and before and after any long trips.

Drivers who notice or suspect damage when performing sim-

ple vehicle maintenance should bring these concerns to the attention of their mechanics as soon as possible.




