LEDUC FIRE ASKS CITIZENS TO 'BE EMERGENCY READY' MAY 6-12

This week is National Emergency Preparedness Week, May 6-12, and is designed to help remind citizens the essential nature of being prepared for whatever comes our way from coast-to-coast-to-coast. Disasters come in all forms from fires and floods, to tornadoes and hurricanes, to man-made incidents which is why it's important to be prepared for what can happen in our region.

"Being prepared for any emergency is everyone's responsibility because when a major disaster occurs, we can't assume first responders will be able to help us immediately, hence the importance of having a 72- hour kit,"

says Deputy Fire Chief Gerry Kelly.

These 72-hour kits must contain everyday items and essentials you'll need during an emergency. Some of the items are blankets, bottled water and high energy food, flashlights, batteries and more. For a complete list, see Page 14 of the Leduc Emergency Preparedness Booklet online or pick up a hard copy at Fire House 1.

According to Kelly, another factor to consider with emergency preparedness is knowing what to do and what's needed for disaster relief, like the Wood Buffalo fires in 2016.

"By nature, we all want to help others so it's vital for people to know what's needed during the recovery phase, such as volunteering your time and monetary donations," says Kelly. "With our Family and Community Support Services partners, helpful information can be found on the website that clearly outlines how people can help in times of crisis."

ENABLING ACCESSIBILITY FUND – MID-SIZED PROJECTS

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents that the federal government has opened a call for concepts (CFC) for mid-sized projects under the Enabling Accessibility Fund (EAF) through Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC).

The call is open to not-for-profit

and Indigenous organizations, municipalities and territorial governments.

The EAF mid-sized CFC provides contribution funding to organizations for projects that help improve and make Canadian facilities and venues more accessible for people with disabilities. As a result of the projects, eligible organizations must offer or plan to offer services and programs that support the social and labour market integration

needs of people with disabilities. Financial contributions between \$350,000 and \$1 million will be provided through the current CFC for each successful retrofit, renovation or construction project.


The CFC follows a two-step application approach. First, applicants are invited to submit their project concepts. Then, applicants whose project concepts are successful will be asked to submit a detailed proposal at a later date.

The deadline to apply is May 24, 2018

"This call for proposals provides an important opportunity to make sure that all residents in our riding of Yellowhead, regardless of their abilities, feel welcome in their workplaces and communities. That is why I strongly encourage all eligible organizations to submit a proposal for this funding," concluded MP Eglinski.



Gordon was a respected member of the parliamentary community and will be greatly missed by all his colleagues in the House. I would like to extend my condolences to his wife Claudine and his sons, Chance and Tristan, as well as to his family and friends. Out of

respect, Parliament closed early on Wednesday after the leaders of each party made a public tribute to Gordon in the House of Commons.

On Thursday, I participated in debate on Bill C-49, which is an omnibus bill that substantially amends 13 different Acts and has consequential impacts on all three modes of transport. 



TIPS TO STOP SCHOOLYARD BULLYING

• Take it seriously. It's easy to say, "Kids will be kids" and assume it will pass. But if your child is coming home upset and is suddenly anxious about school because of the way a kid (or kids) are treating him, you should pay attention.

 Drop your kid off at school or stand on the sidelines during recess. Bullying tends to occur when adult supervision is lacking, so before school or on the playground at recess.

 Talk to other parents. Young kids are talkers. If you're friendly with a parent in your kid's class, ask them if their child has mentioned anything about kids being picked on at school.

 Tell the teacher. It's really important to let your child's teacher know what your kid is telling you
 especially if someone is getting hit.

• Empower your children. Let your kids know that it's not their fault that they are being bullied. Teach your kids to focus on their own behavior.

BULLYING Tips for Dealing With Bullying

1) Take complaints of bullying seriously. Do not dismiss your child or expect your child to work through the situation alone.

Praise your child for reporting bullying situations to you and assure your child you will take action.

3) Talk to your child's teacher, counselor, or other caregiver about reports of bullying.

4) Work together to address the bullying situation. Don't confront the parents of the bully directly.

5) Ask your child specific questions about how your child is treated by peers, who he or she eats lunch with, and how other children are treated.

6) Teach your child to be assertive. Your child should be able to express feelings and needs clearly, without shouting or other aggressive behavior.



7) Provide opportunities for your child to make friends. Identify some of your child's interests and encourage your child to pursue them through sports, clubs, or other group activities.

8) Teach your child to identify bullying behaviors. These include hitting, damaging possessions, threatening, name calling, & excluding someone

RURAL CRIME AWARENESS

Protect machinery from theft by leaving valuables locked in a shed or storage facility and by marking equipment with your drivers licence and province of issue (an engraver can be borrowed free of charge from most local police detachments).

Protect livestock by checking herds regularly and keeping accurate records of livestock born, sold or purchased.



"Grain Fette" or "Grain Guard" is a unique approach to identifying your crops. Small bits of paper, each one imprinted with your special code number, are mixed with grain as grain is being augered into the storage shed. This is approved by the Canadian Grain Commission. The paper used is also digestable in animal feed.

Utilize the Report-A-Poacher Program. Their toll free number is 1-800-642-3800.

Rural Crime Watch Members are concerned citizens who are watchful for unusual activity in their community. They record information on suspicious people and vehicles and pass it along to local police. Join together with your neighbours to install a crime watch program in your area. Do not approach suspicious individuals on your own.

Drivers who are impaired by fatigue, drugs, alcohol or other distractions such as cell phones, are a danger not only to themselves, but also to the innocent drivers around them. If you witness any of the behaviors below, call 911 and tell the operator that you are calling to report an impaired driver. Be prepared to describe the make, model, color and license plate number of the vehicle, and provide its exact location.

Signs of impaired driving include:

• Failure to turn on headlights at night. • Illegal or sudden turning. • Turning within an unusually wide radius. • Nearly striking other cars or objects. • Sudden or erratic braking. • Drifting, swerving or weaving. • Driving with the face close to the windshield. • Drinking alcohol in the vehicle. • Driving much slower than the posted speed limit. • Rapidly accelerating. • Tailgating. • Driving in the middle of the road, or with the left tires on the center line. • Responding slowly to traffic signals


