WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

Whitecourt is now accepting applications to the Whitecourt Downtown Business Incubator Program. The program, which is funded in part by the Government of Alberta's Community and Regional Economic Support (CARES) Grant, will provide support over a twoyear term to assist entrepreneurs in creating and sustaining profitable businesses, and will help revitalize our downtown core. Information on the program, and application forms, can be found on www. whitecourt.ca by searching "Municipal Grant Opportunities.'

Council has created an Ad Hoc Committee to analyze local training needs. The Ad Hoc Community Training Needs Analysis Committee will be responsible for identifying what community, business, and industry see as educational needs for current and future residents and employees. Further information on member recruitment for the Committee has been posted to the Whitecourt website and can be found by searching "How To Get Involved."

Council has adopted a Public Participation Policy. The new policy outlines approaches the municipality will take to engage the public, and the circumstances of when the municipality will engage stakeholders. The policy outlines the important role citizens play in decision making, and is available for viewing on www.whitecourt.

Twenty-five new street lights will be installed along 51 Street from the Whitecourt Fire Hall to Rotary Park, and within the Rotary Park parking lot.



To accommodate the June 5 Westcoast Amusement Carnival, hosted by the Whitecourt & District Chamber of Commerce, Council has approved the closure of 52 Avenue from 49 Street to 50 Street from 12 noon on Monday, June 4 to 6:00 a.m. on Wednesday. Whitecourt circulated a request for proposals to mine and reclaim the Town owned gravel pit located east of Whitecourt. One proposal was received, however Council decided to reject the proposal.



CHANGES TO CANADA

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is informing residents of recent changes to Canada Student Loans that will take effect in Fall 2018.

A new Skills Boost grants program has been announced. The \$287.2-million three-year pilot project will offer a \$1,600-peryear federal student grant for adults who have been out of school for more than ten years.

In addition, a person's eligibility for a Canada student grant will be based on their current year of earnings, rather than their previous year of earnings. This change is intended to better reflect the financial need of individuals, especially if they have experienced a reduction in hours or been laid off.

There have also been complimentary changes to the employment insurance (EI) program to support those wanting to return to school. Recipients of EI are required to be ready and available for work as a condition of receiving the funds, and enrolling in a program of study used to put an individual's EI claim at risk. With the new changes, recipients of EI will now remain eligible if they enroll in an educational program.

"Due to recent layoffs of coal miners in our riding, I am hopeful that these changes will benefit many in Yellowhead. I encourage anyone interested in pursuing a new career, or brushing up on their current skills, to ensure they take full advantage of the Skills Boost grant program," concluded MP Eglinski.



Local Counties Announced as Finalists in Smart City Challenge

"I was excited to learn that four of our very own counties have been selected to move on to the next step of the challenge," stated MP Eglinski.

Parkland, Brazeau, Lac Ste Anne and Yellowhead Counties all teamed together to submit a proposal that would help their "agricultural community to revitalize and grow through the connection of people to the land and food while attracting citizens to share in its prosperous, innovative and resilient way of life."

The counties' submission is one of ten in the prize category for up to \$10 million that was open to communities with populations under 500,000 people. Out of the ten finalists in this category, two will be selected.

In the next and final stage, each applicant group will receive a \$250,000 grant to help develop its final proposal that outline all design, planning, privacy, data protection and project management components of their plans. The grant can be used for activities such as staffing, professional services, feasibility assessments, capacity building, pilot projects, community engagement and communications, data, and relevant training.

The winners are expected to be announced in the spring of 2019.

"Congratulations to our counties on their grant and the best of luck in this final stage of the challenge!" concluded MP Eglinski.



PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF MAY 25, 2018

This week, we covered many topics including national security, sustainable development, the justice system, and the rights of Indigenous Peoples.

The following was debated in the House:

- Bill C-47 An Act to amend the Export and Import Permits Act and the Criminal Code (amendments permitting the accession to the Arms Trade Treaty and other amendments) (Time Allocation and Report Stage)
- Bill C-57 An Act to amend the Federal Sustainable Development Act (Time Allocation and Third Reading)
- Bill C-59 An Act respecting national security matters (Report Stage)
- Bill C-74 Budget Implementation Act, 2018, No. 1 (Time Allocation and Report Stage)
- Bill C-75 An Act to amend the Criminal Code, the Youth Criminal Justice Act and other Acts and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Time Allocation)
- Bill C-262 United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act (Third Reading)
- Bill C-281 National Local Food Day Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-391 Aboriginal Cultural Property Repatriation Act (Second Reading)
- Government Motion No. 22 – Extension of Sitting Hours
- Bill C-395 Opportunity for Workers with Disabilities Act (Second Reading)
- Bill C-396 An Act to amend the Department of Industry Act (financial assistance) (Second Reading)

On Tuesday, I made a statement in the House calling on the Federal Government to increase their efforts to bring Widlene Alexis Earl home to Canada so she can be with her adoptive parents, grandparents, and friends. I also encouraged my colleagues to give lots of hugs on May 31, in honour of an initiative started by Niton

On Thursday evening, I asked a question during the debate on Bill C-47, which attempts to bring Canada into line with the UN Arms Trade Treaty, also known as the ATT. Canada already has a responsible internal system to monitor and control the export of military and security equipment that meets or exceeds the UN Treaty. We do not need more red tape on firearms. Instead, the fed-

eral government should be focusing on how to address the issue of rural crime.


