# DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM A SUCCESS FOR STUDENTS

OJSH participates in a dual credit program offered by Norquest College in co-operation with NGPS. The Health Care Aide program continues to be a very popular option for many students in Northern Gateway. The program enables students to train in the medical field before leaving high school and, in the process, earn 25 credits.

When students graduate, they will have achieved their high school diploma and, in addition, their Health Care Aide certificate from Norquest College. This certificate will allow graduates to be employed in many front line health care positions such as in assisted living facil-



ities, continuing care institutions, acute care hospitals, group homes, home care or private care opportunities.

Students of partnered high schools are taught by a Nurse Instructor, often through videoconferencing. The program consists of:

- 200 of theory in class,
- 85 hours of lab, and
- 200 hours of clinical.

# RCMP INVESTIGATE FATAL COLLISION

Woodlands County, Alberta – One man is dead and three others were injured after a two vehicle collision on Highway 43 early this morning.

Just after midnight on June 7, 2018 Whitecourt RCMP were dispatched to a two vehicle collision on Highway 43 east bound near Range Road 104A. Preliminary investigation suggests that an east bound sedan rear ended an east bound pickup causing it to roll.

A 48 year old male passenger of the pickup was pronounced dead on scene. A 16 year old passenger of the pickup was transported to hospital and is listed in stable condition. The driver of the pickup truck was treated on scene for minor injuries.

Criminal code charges are pending against the 28 year old male driver of the sedan who received minor injuries.

Alcohol was a factor in this

collision.

In addition to the Health Care Aide certificate, there are several other certifications that can be achieved through the dual credit program: Oil and Gas Production Operator (Northern Lakes College); Service Rig Floorhand (Northern Lights School Division and Business and Industry Partners); Power Engineering 4th class (NAIT and Careers Next Generation); Waste Water Technician (NAIT); Administrative Professional Certificate (Norquest College and Evergreen Catholic Schools); Harley Davidson Technician Certificate (Grande Prairie Regional College) and Educational Assistant Program (Northern Lakes College and Fort Vermillion Public Schools).

These programs are great opportunities for students to gain credits for high school as well as earning a post-secondary accreditation. This week, we covered many topics including our justice system, firearms legislation, and national security.

The following was debated in the House:

• Bill C-47 – An Act to amend the Export and Import Permits Act and the Criminal Code (amendments permitting the accession to the Arms Trade Treaty and other amendments) (Third Reading)

• Bill C-59 – An Act respecting national security matters (Time Allocation and Report Stage)

• Bill C-69 – An Act to enact the Impact Assessment Act and the Canadian Energy Regulator Act, to amend the Navigation Protection Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts ( Time Allocation and Report Stage)

• Bill C-71 - An Act to amend certain Acts and Regulations in relation to firearms (Instruction to Committee)

Also on Monday, my wife, Nancy, on my behalf, attended an award ceremony for seniors in Hinton.

In the Standing Committee on Canadian Heritage (CHPC), we continued our review of the Copyright Act, as well as questioned Minister Jolie regarding the Department of Canadian Heritage's budget for 2018-2019. This week, I attended --- -- four meetings and ¬three events, as well as recorded a message. Over the weekend, I will attend events in Nordegg, Rocky Mountain House, Drayton Valley, Wildwood, Edson, and Evansburg. I will fly back to Ottawa on Sunday as the House will continue to sit for two more weeks before the summer break. Look for my next update on the happenings of Parliament.

Whitecourt has launched an online survey that provides the business community an opportunity to share feedback on business support services, employee recruitment, and staff training needs.



### Press Release - To the Community Members and Rate Payers of Alberta Beach:

The high water levels over the past few years and the January Ice Quakes have wreaked havoc on Alberta Beach this spring. Our public beach is currently closed due to erosion and safety concerns; although the provincial boat launch remains open, there has been a significant amount of erosion that has triggered the need for repairs; and, while significantly improved now, our roads were definitely in rough shape this spring and many are in need of repair.

We are very aware that with a name like Alberta Beach, our public beach is paramount to the social and economic success of our community. On a hot summer day, we are proud to boast that our beach, boat launch and other amenities can attract thousands of visitors, who are vital to the success of our local businesses. Every day that our beach is closed our community suffers. We are concerned that many visitors will not come back if the beach stays closed much longer, or if the need arises to close the provincial boat launch. We would like to move forward with fixing these areas, but are waiting on the necessary government approvals, which we may not get until sometime in August. We are also working to encourage the province to help cover the costs to repair the boat launch, as It is owned by the province and is used by boaters not only from our village, but from our region and across the province as well.

Although all municipalities in Alberta are allocated provincial grant money for infrastructure, through the Municipal Sustainability Initiative (MSI), there are not enough grant dollars to cover the costs to repair the roads, beach, and boat launch. We have been in contact with provincial officials, including our MLA (Honourable Oneil Carlier), Minister of Environment and Parks (Honourable Shannon Phillips), and Minister of Municipal Affairs (Honourable Shaye Anderson). We are asking them for assistance to help speed up the regulatory approval, as well as assistance to help cover the costs to fix the erosion on the boat launch (and potentially the beach as well). We encourage all residents and stakeholders to write a letter, send an email or call our MLA, to express your concerns, ask for help to speed up the approval process, and help cover the costs to repair these important tourist and economic attractions.

# SUCCESS IN THE LAKE ISLE WATERSHED – ALTERNATIVE LAND USE SERVICES PROGRAM

## Submitted by Lac Ste. Anne County

In March of 2015 the Alternative Land Use Services (ALUS) program began its debut for Lac Ste. Anne County in the Lake Isle - Sturgeon River Headwaters Sub-watersheds. Since its inception in the sub-watersheds, ALUS Lac Ste. Anne and Parkland County established 10 projects on 7 unique farms positively impacting 160 acres of farmland. Projects included fencing off waterways from livestock, protecting riparian areas, and planting native vegetation on degraded land. The goal of these projects is to improve water quality, enhance wildlife habitat, prevent soil erosion and loss, and increase biodiversity. This program aims to reduce the impacts of flood and drought events on the landscape. ALUS works by implementing Beneficial Management Practices (BMPs) and is designed to compliment the current agricultural operations. ALUS works with the farmer to design projects and provide technical and financial support to see the project right through to the end.

The Agricultural Watershed Enhancement Program (AWEP) under Growing Forward 2 provided a grant to get ALUS up and running with tremendous help from Parkland County. A second grant through the Watershed Resiliency and Restoration Program was secured in 2017 to grow ALUS in Lac Ste. Anne County.
