HIGHWAY 748 DETOUR NOTICE FOR ROSEVEAR CONSTRUCTION

(May 30, 2018) Yellowhead County would like to notify residents of a temporary detour and traffic pattern change along Highway 748. Beginning June 1, 2018 traffic lights will be placed on the highway between Range Road 155 and Range Road 153A. During this time traffic will be shifted off the existing highway surface and moved over to a detour roadway; traffic will alternate directions of flow thru the detour area.

Please be aware, delays for

motorists are expected.

The detour will allow crews to complete the final grading portion of the project which will tie Highway 748 into the newly constructed Rosevear Road and Bridge over the McLeod River.

The detour is expected to be in place until August 31, 2018.

Please be aware of work crews

on the roadway, slow down, and allow them space to complete their work. Motorists are required to obey all roadway construction signs when posted.

TEACHING YOUTH: FARM SAFETY

(May 31, 2018) – Yellowhead County and Wildwood & District Agricultural Society joined forces this year to cohost the Youth Farm Safety Day for junior high students on May 23, 2018. The event provided handson education on identifying hazards and promoting agricultural safety.

Working on a family or industrial farm has always had its inherent risks—from working long

hours, to using heavy equipment and managing unpredictable livestock. Unsurprisingly, agriculture in Canada ranks as the third most hazardous industry—and those hazards can leave rural children vulnerable. That's why Yellowhead County's Agricultural Services department wanted to offer youth the knowledge to stay safe on farms.

There were 34 school children in attendance from Niton Junction and Wildwood who took part in the full-day event. The students were broken up into small groups and rotated

through numerous educational stations related to: ATV safety; lawn mower safety, proper livestock handling and management techniques; utility safety, and rail and fire safety.



CALL FOR PROPOSALS – NEW HORIZONS FOR SENIORS

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to advise that Social Development Canada has launched the New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP) 2018-2019 call for proposals for Community-based Projects.

Programs like NHSP not only encourage seniors to stay involved in their community, but also increase their social participation and inclusion. This is key to enhancing their well-being and quality of life, as well as to enable them to stay active and share their knowledge, skills and experience with other community members.

The NHSP call for proposals, open until June 15, 2018, is seeking proposals for projects led or inspired by seniors. Organizations are invited to apply for funding, under the following three national priorities, for projects that empower seniors to initiate and participate in activities that:

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF JUNE 4, 2018

This week, we covered many topics including our justice system, firearms legislation, and national security.

Paul First Nation, AB Begins Construction Of New Kindergarten To Grade 9 School

On June 6, 2018, the Honourable Jane Philpott, Minister of Indigenous Services, congratulates Chief Arthur Rain, the Council, and the community of Paul First Nation, who are celebrating the official start of construction of a new K-9 school in their community with a sod turning ceremony.

Indigenous Services Canada is providing \$18.6 million for the school construction and \$800,000 for a dedicated space for a Head Start program in the school. In addition to a better learning environment for Kindergarten to Grade 9 students, there will also be an industrial art shop that will provide a classroom for career and technology programs for junior high school

students, as well as a space for community members to upgrade their skills through adult education.

"Congratulations to Chief Rain and the Paul First Nation Council on the beginning of construction on your new Kindergarten to Grade 9 school. Education is critical to improving opportunities for First Nations youth and a welcoming learning environment is essential. This school will provide invaluable opportunities for the children of Paul First Nation to reach their full potential." - The Honourable

- Paul First Nation is located 60 km west of Edmonton, near Duffield, Alberta.
- Construction commenced in May 2018 and the project is expected to be completed by September 2019.
- The Nation has a school enrollment of approximately 470 students
- Through Budget 2016, the Government of Canada is investing \$969.4 million over five years for the construction, repair and maintenance of First Nation school facilities as part of a long-term strategy to improve education infrastructure in First Nations communities.

KEY MESSAGES FROM GYPSD'S PUBLIC BOARD MEETING

June 6, 2018

· Students from Parkland Composite High School's (PCHS) Envirothon Team gave a presentation to trustees on their recent hosting of the annual provincial competition. Envirothon is an academic science competition based on natural resource management. Through the event, the students learn about forestry, wildlife, aquatic ecology,

soils, and a current theme. The team from PCHS has participated in the provincial event for the past seven years, and has gone to the National Conservation Foundation (NCF) Envirothon five times. Only the winning team from the province, or state, moves on to the NCF Envirothon. With this year's provincial win, the team will be going to the 2018 NCF Envirothon Event in Idaho and the board was pleased to approve \$5,000 in funding towards some of the expenses for the team to attend.

• The board approved the 2018/19

school year budget based on the projected enrolments for the 2018/19 school year, 2017/18 financial information and data from the 2016/17 financials. A detailed report was provided that summarized the guiding principles, budget assumptions, financial risks, operating results, accumulated surplus, students and staffing statistics. Budget 2018/19 focuses on maximizing classroom resources and equitable funding allocation to students and schools, while maintaining fiscal responsibility. Although GYPSD expects an operating deficit of \$1.4 million, it is

a significant improvement over the almost \$2 million deficit in Budget 2017/18.Through Budget 2018/19, the division will maintain the level of certificated full time equivalent positions and service levels in the classrooms.

• As part of the governance process, several board policies were reviewed and updated at today's meeting including Policy 16 - Recruitment and Selection of Personnel; Policy 21 - Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Gender Expression; and Policy 2, Appendix A -Board Annual Work Plan.

• Trustees approved an increase to the 2018/19 ineligible transportation fees for the 2018/19 school year. The increase from the current fee of \$250.00 to \$350.00 is intended to off set the actual cost of \$812.00 per student per year. In addition, a new clause 2.4 was added to the policy that states "Ineligible students will not be registered on a school bus until the fourth (4th) week of school as ridership is being confirmed during this time."

• Director of Transportation Services, Mr. Corey Halabi, provided the quarterly Transportation Community Consultation Action Plan (TCCAP) update. The TCCAP provides the board with regular updates from transportation services on a number of topics including the school bus registration progress, student ridership, information on the number of ineligible students transported, ridership waiting lists, and current ride times.

· School instructional times for the upcoming school year were developed in accordance with Policy 18 - School Calendar and to align with the new pilot calendar implemented for the 2018/19 school year.

· Superintendent Lewis addressed the Annual Accountability Pillar Survey Summary for 2017-18. Every year Alberta Education conducts the Accountability Pillar Survey to all school divisions. The division uses this report to celebrate successes, identify trends, issues and areas of growth.

· Information on the Mental Health Capacity Building (MHCB) in School Initiative and Bringing Empowered Students Together (BEST) programs were highlighted at today's meeting. BEST continues to partner with GYPSD staff as the division continues to focus on self-regulation for students, teachers and educational assistants.

SUCCESS IN THE LAKE ISLE WATERSHED – ALTERNATIVE LAND USE SERVICES PROGRAM

In March of 2015 the Alternative Land Use Services (ALUS) program began its debut for Lac Ste. Anne County in the Lake Isle - Sturgeon River Headwaters Sub-watersheds. Since its inception in the sub-watersheds, ALUS Lac Ste. Anne and Parkland County established 10 projects on 7 unique farms positive-

ly impacting 160 acres of farmland.

Projects included fencing off waterways from livestock, protecting riparian areas, and planting native vegetation on degraded land. The goal of these projects is to improve water quality, enhance wildlife habitat, prevent soil erosion and loss, and increase biodiversity. This program aims to reduce the impacts of flood and drought events on the landscape.

ALUS works by implementing Beneficial Management Practices (BMPs) and is designed to compliment the current agricultural operations. ALUS works with the farmer to design projects and provide technical and financial support to see the project right through to the end.

The Agricultural Watershed Enhancement Program (AWEP) under Growing Forward 2 provided a grant to get ALUS up and running

with tremendous help from Parkland County. A second grant through the Watershed Resiliency and Restoration Program was secured in 2017 to grow ALUS in Lac Ste. Anne County.




