#### WANTED MALE ARRESTED

A man has been arrested on his outstanding warrants after he fled from police on May 20, 2018.

On June 8, 2018 the Western Alberta District CRU Team acted on gathered intelligence and were lead to a rural location in Yellowhead County northeast of Edson where it was believed two wanted suspects were located. A warrant was obtained to enter the property and wanted suspect Robert William Sherwood (35) of Entwistle was arrested on scene.

Robert Brett Macleod (43) of Edson attempted to elude police on foot but was quickly apprehended with the assistance of Police Dog Services.

In addition to his outstanding charges, Sherwood is facing new Criminal Code charges of possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000, and two counts of failing to comply with his Recognizance. He was remanded into custody and is due in Stony Plain Provincial Court on July 3,

Macleod is facing charges of possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000 and failing to comply with a condition of his Recognizance. He was remanded into custody and is due in Stony Plain Provincial Court on July 3, 2018.

Our dedicated crime reduction teams are hard at work to address repeat crime trends throughout the province. Through their sustained efforts and initiative, Albertans should see a reduced impact of crime in their communities in the long term.

#### LAKE ISLE **LOVE YOUR** UPDATE

Nature Alberta is providing this update to our Lake Isle partners participating in our Shoreline Assessment program. We have completed most of our assessments and want to update you on our progress.

- 1. Most of the assessments conducted from the boats in 2017 are complete and letters with your unique property code will be sent to you this summer. If you wish to follow up with any recommendations identified in your report please contact us.
- 2. There are still boat-conducted shoreline assessments to do, scheduled for June 2018. We were unable to complete all the assessments in 2017 due to inclement weather and shortage of volunteer boat operators.

We need local volunteer boat operators on Lake Isle for approximately one week. If you are interested in helping out by donating your time and a boat to achieve this shared goal please contact us.

Lake Isle - Love Your Lake Background

Love Your Lake is Canada's most comprehensive shoreline assessment and stewardship education program available to lake communities. It provides entire lakes with property-specific shoreline stewardship information and voluntary recommendations for improved lake health.

The data collected about each shoreline property is summarized into unique shoreline property reports available to each shoreline property owner. Reports will be complete with a photo of the shoreline property, and provide friendly information and recommendations for voluntary actions to improve the shoreline, and ultimately the lake. Each report is unique to the individual property. Landowner privacy is important to the program - you can access the program's Privacy Policy online at LoveYourLake.ca.

You may see trained staff from Nature Alberta in a boat along the shoreline, looking at properties and taking notes. Unless invited, we will not access your property or inconvenience you at all. We will be taking photos but will not take photos with people in the field of view. We will gladly tell you about the program, answer your questions, or talk with you about shoreline and lake health.

# WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL UPDATE

June 12, 2018

Whitecourt Town Council has decided to cancel the Highway 43 Stair re-construction project, and will be proceeding with trail enhancements along Memorial Point Trail to connect the west hilltop area to the Highway 43 Trail. Enhancements will include trail lighting, resurfacing of

Memorial Point Trail to fine packed gravel, signage and other landscaping improvements. Administration for the Town of Whitecourt is working to confirm a construction schedule for the project, and will keep the community informed as the project progresses.

Whitecourt recently submitted an application to the Alberta 2018 Flood Readiness Initiative to purchase thirty-seven Tiger DamTM tubes and equipment. In a flood situation, the


tubes will be used to protect critical infrastructure and development, create temporary dykes, divert river flow, and protect essential utilities. One Tiger DamTM tube replaces 1,500 sand bags.

The Whitecourt RCMP was present at last night's Council meeting and reviewed the 2017 Annual Report. The Detachment was pleased to report that the number of files in 2017 was calculated at 4,280; down by over 300 files in the last two years. Both the Staff Sergeant and Sergeant felt that crime prevention initiatives, including the Prolific Offender Program, contributed to this significant decrease. Throughout 2017, the Whitecourt RCMP logged:

- 698 condition checks;
- 685 violation tickets;
- 204 check stops;
- 506 school visits.

The second highest file type responded to by local RCMP in 2017 was false alarms. Whitecourt Town Council, through the Protective Services Committee, will be working on solutions to decrease the number of false alarm calls that Whitecourt RCMP officers attend.







#### ATVS: BE AS SAFE AS POSSIBLE

It's Child Safety Week and Alberta Health Services (AHS) is reminding all Albertans to make all-terrain vehicle (ATV) safety a priority this week and every week.

ATVs pose significant risk to all users and particularly children less than 16 years of age, who have not yet developed to the point of having the strength, skills or judgment needed to operate an ATV. Over a one-year period ending April 1, 2017, 78 children were seen in Alberta's two pediatric emergency departments due to ATV-related injuries; 31 required hospital admission and one died.

To protect children less than 16 years of age, parents and caregivers are advised to ensure these children do not drive or ride in an ATV. This includes ATVs marketed as 'child-sized'. Albertans 16 years of age and older are urged to take the fol-

lowing precautions to ensure their ATV excursions are as safe as possible:

- Get trained: Before you hit the trails, get formal hands-on training from a recognized/trained ATV instructor. Don't be shy about refreshing your training seasonally.
- Wear the gear: Always wear a helmet. As of May 15, 2017, CSA-compliant helmets must be worn by OHV users when riding on public land, but a helmet worn every ride can save your life. From 2002 to 2013, 41 per cent of quad-rider deaths in Alberta were due to head injuries. In 80 per cent of these head injury deaths, the quad riders were not wearing a helmet. In addition to a helmet, always wear a jacket, long pants, goggles, boots and gloves.
- Look first: Be sure you're aware of the weather forecast, fire outlook/potential, and any hazards (geographical, animal or human) or risks that the trail(s) could pose. Ensure


your ATV is equipped with an appropriate head lamp.

- Buckle up: Be sure you're fastened in properly and that all gear and equipment (including your ATV restraints) are in proper working condition before you hit the trails.
- Drive sober: Don't drink or do drugs before or while operating an ATV: 55 per cent of those who died in ATV crashes between 2002 and 2013 tested positive for alcohol.

• Seek help: Before you head out on the trail, let others know where you're going and when they should expect you back. This helps your loved ones know when to call for help if you've been gone too long. Take a cellphone or working radio with you, as well as a first aid-kit.

# WHERE ARE OUR REFUGEES? AN UPDATE FROM THE LAC STE ANNE REFUGEE COMMITTEE

It has been a long time since we have updated you about the status of our refugee family. 18 months ago, we were elated to submit the application for sponsorship. With your generous support, we had raised enough money to bring our family, Yasir and Sarah Laali

and their two children with grampa Sami Samaan to our community. We had a home for them to live it, volunteers lined up to support them and arrangements for the children to go to a local school. We were so excited! We believe they would be here in 3-6 months and we dreamed of our next community event, a meet and greet with our family. And then we started waiting. Well,

it's been 18 long months and our last attempt to connect with immigration was not inspiring. The family has had all their paperwork in for 18 months. They had their immigration interview and health check completed months ago, they have signed their travel agreement. All we are waiting on is a visa. We had truly hoped they would be here this summer to settle in and get the children ready for school. Last month, after our inquiry, we were informed by the Department of Immigration that they should be here by Christmas. We were deeply distraught. The family's living conditions have deteriorated. They are losing hope and the only thing keeping them going is the promise of a chance to build a life in safely in Canada. Committee members have decided to write letters to members of local and federal government requesting that their visas be expedited. It seems incredible that thousands can walk


over the borders from the United States and seek assilm, while a family that has been displaced for years is waiting such a long time when all their paperwork has been completed and their launch in Canada is assured by a committed group of citizens at no cost to the government. The refugee committee would like to to express our deepest thanks to all of you who support this initiative and want you to know that everything remains in place for their arrival. As soon as we have any news, we will update you. Once they arrive, the real work of this project will begin and we will send out another call for folks who would like to help settling them in and getting the family oriented to life in rural Alberta. Meanwhile, if you feel moved to get involved, please consider writing a letter to our elected officials, requesting they speed up this visa process.

# NEW HORIZONS FOR SENIORS - DEADLINE EXTENDED!

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is advising that the Call for Proposals for New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP) has been extended until June 22, 2018. The previous deadline was June 15, 2018.

The NHSP call for proposals is seeking proposals for projects led or inspired by seniors. Eligible organizations can receive up to \$25,000 in project funding. Organizations are invited to apply under the following three national level priorities for projects that empower seniors to initiate and participate in activities that:

- benefit vulnerable seniors populations,
- · focus on diversity of Canada's

seniors; and

• will promote volunteerism to increase an organization's capacity.

Starting this year, organizations that have not benefitted from NHSP funding during the last five years can receive up to \$5,000 as part of the new small grants pilot project. These organizations can apply for the small grants up to \$5,000 per project or for the Community-based funding of up to \$25,000 (but not for both). In the context of Small grants Initiative, priority will be given to projects for seniors that meet at least one of the three above priorities.

"If you are planning to apply, don't forget you can contact my Ottawa office if you require a support letter," concluded MP Eglinski.

# PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF JUNE 11, 2018

This week, we covered many topics including marijuana, Iran, the carbon tax, accessibility, and federal finances.

- Bill C-344 An Act to amend the Department of Public Works and Government Services Act (community benefit) (Third

Reading)

- Bill S-218 Latin American Heritage Month Act (Report Stage)
- Motion 157 Visitability
- CPC Motion Carbon Pricing
- CPC Motion Iran
- NDP Motion Global Climate Change and Clean Energy Leadership
- Main estimates Consideration of motions to concur in the Main Estimates for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2019

left leg went under the wheels. Doctors tried to save my leg but they couldn't.

As a member of The War Amps Child Amputee (CHAMP) Program, I'm spreading the safety message and sharing my story in a new video, PLAYSAFE: Don't Let It Happen to You.

With the help of seven other young amputees, I warn kids

to spot the danger before they play and to be aware of "mean machines" like lawn mowers, trains, boats, cars and farm equipment. If I could say anything to kids that are thinking of jumping onto a train or playing near the railroads because it seems like fun or just because your friends do it – don't do it!

As the weather warms up and

Parkland County, Alberta-On May 27, 2018 Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove/ Enoch RCMP with assistance of the Spruce Grove/ Stony Plain Rural Crime Reduction Unit (CRU), K Division Auto Theft, Forensic Identification Services, and Police Dog Services executed a search warrant at a rural residence in Parkland County. Police entered into the investigation as a result of a complaint from the public regarding a suspicious vehicle.

A 31-year-old male from Stony Plain, Aaron WHITBY, was arrested and faces numerous charges including:

- Possession of Stolen Property Over \$5000
- Tampering with a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN)
- Production of Marijuana
- Trafficking Marijuana
- Trafficking a substance believed to be Fentanyl
- Possession of Methamphetamine

WHITBY was released from custody to appear in Stony Plain Provincial Court on May 30, 2018.

# REDESIGNED, MORE SECURE DRIVER'S LICENCES UNVEILED

New driver's licences and identification cards will help protect Albertans against counterfeiting and ID theft and save government more than \$1 million annually.

To better protect Albertans from fraud, the government has redesigned provincial driver's licences and ID cards with updated security features like clear windows, laser engraving and 3D embossing that makes it harder to alter or replicate the cards.

The new cards also include imagery that reflects Alberta's landscape and history.

"Our government takes identity fraud very seriously. We are the first jurisdiction in North America to integrate this combination of design and security to protect Albertans from ID theft and prevent fraud. We are using the latest technology available to safeguard people's personal information and prevent scams." - Stephanie McLean, Minister of Service Alberta

The cards are now in production and, because of advances in technol-

ogy, cost less to manufacture than the previous design, saving Alberta taxpayers more than \$1 million annually.

The driver's licence design depicts Castle Mountain and the Bow River in Banff National Park, while the ID cards feature a Wild Rose, Alberta's provincial flower. Both cards also include an image of an Albertosaurus, a dinosaur whose name honours Alberta, where its remains were first discovered.

The last redesign occurred in 2009 and the Alberta government has incorporated advice from law enforcement agencies to ensure the cards have the most up-to-date safeguards against fraudsters and identify thieves.

"The new security measures in the Alberta driver's licences and identification cards will help ensure the safety and security of the public's information. These security measures will help law enforcement in identifying those individuals who are fraudulently attempting to use this document for illegal purposes." - Brian Simpson, Deputy Chief, Edmonton Police Service



There is no need to replace current licences or ID cards. Current cards will be phased out through the normal renewal process as cards expire.

Some security features on the cards can be verified using a look-listenfeel approach:

Look

- Clear window: three complex look-through windows, including one in the shape of Alberta, contain the cardholder's photo. The use of a complex, asymmetrical window is a first in Canada.
- Rainbow printing: a gradual transition of colour from one part of the card to another makes it difficult to scan and replicate.
- "Ghost" date of birth: the security background is visible through the characters of the birth month and year.

Listen

• The card makes a tin-like sound when dropped on a hard surface, unlike credit cards or bank cards.

Feel

- Clear laser engraving: you can feel the clear lettering (date of birth and sex) to the left of the photo.
- Raised text: you can feel the raised black text on the date of birth, date of expiry and signature. The data is engraved into the core of the card and difficult to alter or replicate.
- Embossed Alberta shield: can be seen and felt in the lower part of the clear window.
- 3D embossing: you can feel the Albertosaurus image raised above the card surface. It creates a 3D effect the tail continues on the back of the card and appears to travel through the Alberta-shaped window.


#### BRIDGE REPLACEMENT RGE RD 544

### **UNDERPASS PAINTING**

OJSH Art teacher Mrs. Carolyn Walker and her husband, Barry, an EA at OJSH, commute to and from school, driving on Hwy 43. When Alberta Transportation changed the entrances in to and out of Onoway, the Walkers commute necessitated going under an old underpass. The underpass has traditionally been a favourite 'concrete canvas' for graffiti spray artists. Mrs. Walker realized that now, with the entrance change, many more people had to use the underpass, and in doing so, view the graffiti -- some of it interesting, some of it messy, and much of it inappropriate.

Mrs. Walker had a 'light-bulb' moment this spring, coming up with a plan that would not only beautify the underpass but also provide a unique learning experience for her art students. She contacted MLA Oneil Carlier to see how this could be accomplished. He directed her to the Ministry of Transportation. Normally, the ministry does not approve private projects to paint underpasses but in this case, since it was a combined student, school, and community project, they agreed to support the project. Mrs. Walker then had to get appropriate insurance from Northern Gateway Public School's finance department. Traffic control was supplied by the county by-law officers and RCMP. Ledcor's highway maintenance division contributed appropriate signage. The local Timbermart supplied all of the paint at a discount and the Town of Onoway graciously picked up the paint tab. Everything that the students did was dictated by Ministry of Transportation guidelines.

Twenty-six senior high art students participated in this project which had the theme of "Personal Passions". Throughout the project, parents Mrs. Kirwin, Mrs. Puhov, and Mrs. Bouius volunteered their time and help as did Mr. Walker. The students had to initially prep the underpass concrete by painting it a solid gray colour before creating their art works.

The almost month-long project culminated in a media event on Friday, June 8th when Onoway Mayor Judy Tracy, MLA Oneil Carlier and his Press Secretary Renato Gandia arrived at the school to interview the students involved and to commend their good work.

The beautification of the underpass

has already made a difference. Jacqueline Gaffney and Ronny Grenier, parents of an OJSH student who is not in Art classes this semester, were so pleased with the result of the project and what a difference it made to their drive, that they have donated a pizza and pop lunch to the whole senior high art class.









### FIGHTING MOUNTAIN PINE BEETLE IN WHITECOURT AREA

Submitted by Renato Gandia, Press Secretary, Agriculture and Forestry **Government of Alberta** 

The Alberta government is partnering with Woodlands County and the town of Whitecourt to combat mountain pine beetle.

The mountain pine beetle threatens six million hectares of Alberta's pine forest and affects the activities of more than half of the major forest companies operating in the province.

In order to protect Alberta's crucial forestry industry, the province is providing Whitecourt with \$29,000 and Woodlands County with \$26,000 for the control, suppression and eradication of mountain pine beetle on municipal and private lands. The funds are part of the Mountain Pine Beetle Municipal Grant Funding Program which helps communities minimize the spread of mountain pine beetle infestations in their areas.

"Our best chance to combat the mountain pine beetle infestation is if our government partners with local municipalities on aggressive and proactive detection and control programs. This funding will help us work with the Town of Whitecourt and Woodlands County to do that." - Oneil Carlier, Minister of Agriculture and Forestry

"On behalf of the Town of Whitecourt, thank you to the Government of Alberta for its continued support of our local

mountain pine beetle program. For several years, with Alberta Agriculture and Forestry's support, our community has conducted local surveys and control work to minimize the effect of an infestation. Whitecourt is heavily invested in the forest industry, and the control of this insect is vital to our economic, environmental, and social health." - Maryann Chichak, mayor of Whitecourt

"From a municipal point of view, one of the greatest supports from the provincial government has been the pine beetle mitigation. Keeping our forests healthy is vital to the viability of our communities in Woodlands County. This new grant will help strengthen our local mountain pine beetle program. It will assist in educating our residents and stakeholders in identifying trees infected by the pest." - Jim Rennie, mayor of Woodlands County

### **CALLS CATCH CRIMINALS**

St. Albert, AB - At approximately 3:20 a.m., on Friday, May 25, 2018, St. Albert RCMP received multiple calls in a short time period from the Grandin neighbourhood in St. Albert of suspects trying door handles on vehicles parked in a parking garage, suspects entering parked vehicles on the street and of a break in alarm being triggered at a residence. Descriptions of a suspect vehicle connected to these calls was provided as a dark grey 4 door hatchback car.

Immediate attendance to the area by RCMP, combined by information provided by residents, resulted in a grey 2013 Ford Focus car being located and stopped. This car was found to be stolen from Edmonton and the 3 occupants, a 20 year old man from Onoway, a 15 year old male youth from Edmonton and a 13 year old female youth from Edmonton were arrested.

While this matter is still under

investigation, the 15 year old male youth from Edmonton has been charged with:

- · Driving while disqualified
- Possession of stolen property over \$5000
- 2 counts of Fail/ refuse to comply with an order under the Youth Criminal Justice Act.

On June 5, 2018, The youth entered a plea of guilty to some of the charges and received the following sentence:

- Driving while disqualified 5 days in gaol and a 1 year driving prohibition
- Fail/ refuse to comply with an order under the Youth Criminal Justice Act, - one charge was withdrawn by the Crown, while a sentence of 7 days in gaol was given to the other charge.

The charge of Possession of Stolen Property was set over for an entry of a plea in St. Albert Court on July 3, 2018. As the youth had already served time in custody, he has been released by the Court on Bail until his next court date. He has several conditions on that release including a curfew condition restricting his

whereabouts between 10 pm and 7 am.

This incident speaks to the strength of the police and the community working together to stop criminals in their tracks. Using the information from the multiple calls from Grandin residents, three suspects were caught and any illegal activities that they are alleged to have been committing that night were stopped. Crime prevention is a shared responsibility. Members of the community are reminded of their role in preventing criminal activity:

- Lock up houses, sheds, vehicles and any other property that is easily accessible
- Never leave running vehicles unlocked. Nearly half of the vehicle thefts in Alberta over the past year have had the keys left inside
- Take photos and record serial numbers of property
- If you see or suspect suspicious activity notify police immediately

# AHS NOTIFYING PATIENTS OF POTENTIAL DTAP VACCINE INEFFECTIVENESS

EDMONTON – Alberta Health Services (AHS) will be notifying 298 patients who visited the emergency department at Leduc Community Hospital that the dTap vaccine provided to them as part of their treatment was potentially ineffective, due to incomplete temperature monitoring of a vaccine fridge.

During a routine audit on May 7, 2018, it was found that the temperature of the vaccine fridge at Leduc Community Hospital's emergency department had not been recorded properly.

The dTap vaccine prevents against diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis. In the emergency de-

AHS regrets that this issue has resulted in an impact to our patients and we have ensured that proper monitoring is in now in place.

To protect patient privacy and confidentiality, AHS will not be providing any further detail relating to the patients impacted.






