After some community deliberation, we are happy to share that volunteers throughout the county's hamlets have stepped

up to coordinate orders for our residents! Coordinator phone numbers, names, and the full menu of frozen meals can be found at all local county libraries (Niton, Wildwood, Evansburg, Entwistle, Seba Beach), and at the Yellowhead County Wildwood Office.

When placing an order, please have your method of payment ready as orders will have to be prepaid. Our coordinators will be accepting the first round of meal orders before July 4th, for pick up on the following week. These frozen meals are locally made by the Edmonton Meals on Wheels program and range

in cost from \$4.50 to \$7.00 per meal.

The coordinating Meals on Wheels group would like to thank Lobstick River Foods for their gracious donation of an upright freezer, which will be used to store frozen meals in the Wildwood Library. A huge thank you to the Mackay Community Association for allowing the coordinating group to store additional frozen meals!

# ATVS: BE AS SAFE AS POSSIBLE

It's Child Safety Week and Alberta Health Services (AHS) is reminding all Albertans to make all-terrain vehicle (ATV) safety a priority this week and every week.

ATVs pose significant risk to all users and particularly children less than 16 years of age, who have not yet developed to the point of having the strength, skills or judgment needed to operate an ATV. Over a one-year period ending April 1, 2017, 78 children were seen in Alberta's two pediatric emergency departments due to ATV-related injuries; 31 required hospital admission and one died.

To protect children less than 16 years of age, parents and caregivers are advised to ensure these children do not drive or ride in an ATV. This includes ATVs marketed as 'child-sized'. Albertans 16 years of age and older are urged to take the following precautions to ensure their ATV excursions are as safe as possible:

• Get trained: Before you hit the trails, get formal hands-on

training from a recognized/trained ATV instructor. Don't be shy about refreshing your training seasonally.

- Wear the gear: Always wear a helmet. As of May 15, 2017, CSA-compliant helmets must be worn by OHV users when riding on public land, but a helmet worn every ride can save your life. From 2002 to 2013, 41 per cent of quad-rider deaths in Alberta were due to head injuries. In 80 per cent of these head injury deaths, the quad riders were not wearing a helmet. In addition to a helmet, always wear a jacket, long pants, goggles, boots and gloves.
- Look first: Be sure you're aware of the weather forecast, fire outlook/potential, and any hazards (geographical, animal or human) or risks that the trail(s) could pose. Ensure your ATV is equipped with an appropriate head lamp.
- Buckle up: Be sure you're fastened in properly and that all gear and equipment (including your ATV restraints) are in proper working condition before you hit the trails.
- Drive sober: Don't drink or do drugs before or while oper-

ating an ATV: 55 per cent of those who died in ATV crashes between 2002 and 2013 tested positive for alcohol.


• Seek help: Before you head out on the trail, let others know where you're going and when they should expect you back. This helps your loved ones know when to call for help if you've been gone too long. Take a cellphone or working radio with you, as well as a first aid-kit.

# **WANTED MALE ARRESTED**

Yellowhead County, Alberta -A man has been arrested on his outstanding warrants after he fled from police on May 20, 2018.

On June 8, 2018 the Western Alberta District CRU Team acted on gathered intelligence and were lead to a rural location in Yellowhead County northeast of Edson where it was believed two wanted suspects were located. A warrant was obtained to enter the property and wanted suspect Robert William Sherwood (35) of Entwistle was arrested on scene.



Robert Brett Macleod (43) of Edson attempted to elude police on foot but was quickly apprehended with the assistance of Police Dog Services.

In addition to his outstanding charges, Sherwood is facing new Criminal Code charges of possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000, and two counts of failing to comply with his Recognizance. He was remanded into custody and is due in Stony Plain Provincial Court on July 3, 2018.

Macleod is facing charges of possession of property obtained by crime over \$5000 and failing to comply with a condition of his Recognizance. He was remanded into custody and is due in Stony Plain Provincial Court on July 3, 2018.



In accordance with the requirements of Section 606 of the Municipal Government Act, as amended, the Council of Parkland County has scheduled a Public Hearing regarding the proposed adoption of the following Bylaw:

Proposed Bylaw 2018-13 Parkland County and Brazeau County Intermunicipal Development Plan

An Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) is a statutory document prepared with two (or more) municipalities that share a common border, and where at least one member is not a part of a growth management region. An IDP ensures future development and land use policy are coordinated between municipalities. Parkland County and Brazeau County, under the direction of Section 631 of the Modernized Municipal Government Act, have agreed to jointly engage in an IDP. This plan has been developed to reduce the possibility of any potential conflicts between Counties and to ensure the relationship remains strong, transparent and collaborative in the future.

### Hearing Procedure

This is a formal Public Hearing and Council is prepared to hear and receive formal submissions and presentations (verbal or written) from those who wish to speak to the proposed Bylaw. Written submissions or presentations may either be submitted to Planning & Development by 4:00 P.M. on July 3, 2018, or submitted at the commencement of the Public Hearing.

Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation to Council must notify Planning & Development Services by 4:00 P.M., on July 3, 2018. Verbal presentations at the Public Hearing will be limited to a maximum of 10 minutes. Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation who has not made prior arrangements may be allocated a time at the commencement of the Public Hearing. Council advises that this is your last opportunity to comment on the proposed Bylaw as Council is unable to receive further submissions after the Public Hearing is closed.



# YELLOWHEAD COUNTY LIBRARIES READY FOR TD SUMMER READING CLUB

"As the name suggests, the primary focus of the TD Summer Reading Club is to provide a way for chil-



We cover a variety of themes such as cooking, farm safety, science, and

In addition to various literacy-based programming, Evansburg Public Library has obtained two plots in the Evansburg Community Garden and participants will have the opportunity to plant, raise and harvest various vegetables throughout the summer. coding, digital literacy and video game programs. Wildwood Public Library will also be hosting a youth reading challenge in which youth ages twelve and up can read to earn prizes.

All three libraries will be hosting kick off parties to celebrate the start of the club. Evansburg's will take place on July 28th at 4pm, Wildwood's will be at 5pm also on July 28th and Niton's party will take place at 10:30am on July 10th. # Week of June 11, 2018

- NDP Motion Global Climate Change and Clean Energy Leadership
- Main estimates Consideration of motions to concur in the Main Estimates for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2019




