On June 16, 2018 at approximately 7:00 p.m., Mayerthorpe RCMP were called to a cabin on Lessard Lake where they discovered the body of an adult male inside.

On June 19, 2018 an autopsy was conducted at the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner in Edmonton and determined the manner of death to be a homicide. The lone resident of the cabin, 57 year old Peter Joseph Kaminski has been identified as the victim. 



# June 26, 2018 BLUE-GREEN ALGAE (CYANOBACTERIA) BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR ISLE LAKE

# Submitted by Alberta Health Services

ONOWAY – A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Isle Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

• Avoid all contact with blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

• Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where bluegreen algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.

• Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

• Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Isle Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Isle Lake, until further notice.


Please note that areas of Isle

Lake in which the blue-green algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this bluegreen algae Health Advisory is in place.



# PARLIAMENT UPDATE **WEEK OF JUNE 18, 2018**

Before the House adjourned for the summer, several government bills were pushed through to the Senate.

The following was debated in the House:

Bill C-45 - Cannabis Act (Consideration of Senate

### Amendments)

Bill S-210 - An Act to amend An Act to amend the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, the Civil Marriage Act and the Criminal Code and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Third Reading)

Bill C-69 – An Act to enact the Impact Assessment Act

and the Canadian Energy Regulator Act, to amend the Navigation Protection Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Third Reading)

Bill C-59 - An Act respecting national security matters (Third Reading)

Bill C-64 – Wrecked, Abandoned or Hazardous Vessels Act (Report Stage)



Bill C-71 – An Act to amend certain Acts and Regulations in relation to firearms (Time Allocation, Report Stage and Third Reading)

On Monday, I presented a petition from constituents regarding the Liberal Government's requirement to sign an attestation in agreement with the Liberals' view on abortion when applying for student summer job funding. The petition called on the Prime Minister to defend freedom of conscience, thought, and belief, and to withdraw the attestation requirement.

Also on Monday, I made a statement in the House regarding the recent arson at our Edson Mosque that made national headlines. Edson is an inclusive community and we have many different religious and cultural organizations that have always intermingled and respected each other. Religious beliefs and freedoms must be respected, and we should not tolerate any group or individual who attacks the rights of religious groups in our community.



Construction season is here and crews will be out in force in the coming weeks working to complete local road and other infrastructure projects.

Slide repair on the hillside along Highway 43 – Closure of Hillside Trail from June 19 through July 6:

Kana Oilfield Service has been hired by Alberta Transportation to repair areas along the hillside of the south side of Highway 43 between 51 Street and Hospital Road. To complete the repairs, Hillside Trail from Memorial Point west to 51 Street will be closed from June 19 through to July 6. Signage and barricades will be placed along the trail. Questions related to this project can be made to Irvin Fry, Site Supervisor, at 587-336-7073.



Street Improvement Program: Construction crews are in town this week to complete base preparations as part of the 2018 Street Improvement Program. Paving throughout the community is scheduled from July 3 through 18; work will take place between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Projects include rehabilitation of roadways, the extension and rehabilitation of the paved trail network, utility cut restoration and the Residential Driveway Replacement Program. Knelsen Rock Products Ltd. will be completing the project, and

areas to be paved include: - Graham Road from 47th Street to Wedow Drive:

- Wedow Drive cul de sac and Pritchard Drive connector;

- 55 Avenue from 47 Street to Stephens Crescent;

- Kepler Drive – north parking lane;

- Miscellaneous patching will be completed along Dahl Drive;

- Poplar Drive and Mink Creek Road intersection.

Crack Sealing Roads:

Whitecourt Infrastructure Services crews have begun sealing cracks in roads in downtown and residential areas. Crews plan to complete the roadways in the valley area, and then will proceed to hilltop locations. Pot Hole Patching:

As is typically the case, Whitecourt experienced temperature swings throughout the winter and spring season, which has created ideal conditions for the development of potholes. Town of Whitecourt crews will begin pot hole patching throughout town this week.

Whitecourt Wide Area Network:

Installation and commissioning of fiber optic communication cable segments to connect several public facilities to Alberta SuperNet will begin soon. Details on the schedule will be provided as construction progresses; however, notices to businesses along the route will be provided by the contractor prior to construction starting. Construction for this project is anticipated to start June 25 and will take place along the south side of Highway 43 (from the Allan & Jean Millar Centre through to 33 Street), and along 37 Avenue and 35 Street in the Hilltop East Industrial Park.

FortisAlberta Downtown Pole Replacement:

As part of Whitecourt's Vitalization Plan, wood streetlight poles will be replaced with decorative Domus light fixtures throughout the downtown core. FortisAlberta has not specified when the work will begin, however it is anticipated to start before the end of the month. Construction work will impact parking in the downtown, and residents are encouraged to follow the Town of Whitecourt Facebook page for information as it becomes available.

Highway 43 and Highway 32 Paving Projects:

Alberta Transportation has started construction work along Highway 43 between Highway 32 South junction and Highway 32 North junction. The paving project is expected to be complete by mid-July, and work will be performed both day and night. Construction will take place in both east and westbound lanes. Construction has also begun on a paving project along Highway 32 North between the north junction of Highway 43 and the Town of Swan Hills. Both projects are managed by Alberta Transportation, and details can be found on https://511.alberta.ca/




