STONY PLAIN RCMP AND STONY PLAIN FISH AND WILDLIFE CONDUCT JOINT INITIATIVE ON WABAMUN LAKE

Wabamun, Alberta – On Saturday June 16th, 2018 the Stony Plain RCMP and Stony Plain District Fish and Wildlife Enforcement Branch conducted the first of many joint operations this summer at Wabumun Lake. Members from both agencies were on the lake and checked 30-35 boats. Approximately 50% of the boats checked were not compliant with regulations. There were a number of deficiencies observed in relation to safety equipment. Stony Plain District Fish and Wildlife Enforcement undertook 12 enforcement actions that included violation tickets and warnings. RCMP members seized an amount of liquor and reminded the public about the laws regarding open liquor. This is the first operation this year, with many more scheduled throughout the summer. Boaters are reminded that:

• Boat drivers require a Canada Pleasure Craft Operator Card (PCOC). This card proves you have taken and successfully completed an approved boating safety course that is required for pleasure craft operators.

• Fishing licences are required. • In Alberta, the fines and penalties for operating a boat while under the influence of alcohol or drugs match the fines and penalties for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs. There is NO difference between drunk driving and drunk boating. The Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/ Enoch RCMP want everyone to be safe. By complying with boat safety rules and regulations we ensure that everyone arrives home safe.

Lake Isle - Love Your Lake Background


Love Your Lake is Canada's most comprehensive shoreline assessment and stewardship education program available to lake communities. It provides entire lakes with property-specific shoreline stewardship information and voluntary recommendations for improved lake health.

The data collected about each shoreline property is summarized into unique shoreline property reports available to each shoreline property owner.

Reports will be complete with a photo of the shoreline property, and provide friendly information and recommendations for voluntary actions to improve the shoreline, and ultimately the lake. Each report is unique to the individual property. Landowner privacy is important to the program - you can access the program's Privacy Policy online at LoveYourLake.ca.

You may see trained staff from Nature Alberta in a boat along the shoreline, looking at properties and taking notes. Unless invited, we will not access your property or inconvenience you at all. We will be taking photos but will not take photos with people in the field of view. We will gladly tell you about the program, answer your questions, or talk with you about shoreline and lake health.

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF JUNE 18, 2018

Before the House adjourned for the summer, several government bills were pushed through to the Senate.

The following was debated in the House:

• Bill C-45 – Cannabis Act (Consideration of Senate Amendments)

• Bill S-210 – An Act to amend An Act to amend the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, the Civil Marriage Act and the Criminal Code and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Third Reading)

• Bill C-69 – An Act to enact the Impact Assessment Act and the Canadian Energy Regulator Act, to amend the Navigation Protection Act and to make consequential amendments to other Acts (Third Reading)

 Bill C-59 – An Act respecting national security matters (Third Reading)
 Bill C-64 – Wrecked, Abandoned or

Hazardous Vessels Act (Report Stage) • Bill C-71 – An Act to amend cer-

tain Acts and Regulations in relation to firearms (Time Allocation, Report Stage and Third Reading)

On Monday, I presented a petition from constituents regarding the Liberal

Government's requirement to sign an attestation in agreement with the Liberals' view on abortion when applying for student summer job funding. The petition called on the Prime Minister to defend freedom of conscience, thought, and belief, and to withdraw the attestation requirement.

Also on Monday, I made a statement in the House regarding the recent arson at our Edson Mosque that made national headlines. Edson is an inclusive community and we have many different religious and cultural organizations that have always intermingled and respected each other. Religious beliefs and freedoms must be respected, and we should not tolerate any group or individual who attacks the rights of religious groups in our community.





Proposed Bylaw 2018-13 Parkland County and Brazeau County Intermunicipal Development Plan

An Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) is a statutory document prepared with two (or more) municipalities that share a common border, and where at least one member is not a part of a growth management region. An IDP ensures future development and land use policy are coordinated between municipalities. Parkland County and Brazeau County, under the direction of Section 631 of the Modernized Municipal Government Act, have agreed to jointly engage in an IDP. This plan has been developed to reduce the possibility of any potential conflicts between Counties and to ensure the relationship remains strong, transparent and collaborative in the future.

Hearing Procedure

This is a formal Public Hearing and Council is prepared to hear and receive formal submissions and presentations (verbal or written) from those who wish to speak to the proposed Bylaw. Written submissions or presentations may either be submitted to Planning & Development by 4:00 P.M. on July 3, 2018, or submitted at the commencement of the Public Hearing.

Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation to Council must notify Planning & Development Services by 4:00 P.M., on July 3, 2018. Verbal presentations at the Public Hearing will be limited to a maximum of 10 minutes. Anyone wishing to make a verbal presentation who has not made prior arrangements may be allocated a time at the commencement of the Public Hearing. Council advises that this is your last opportunity to comment on the proposed Bylaw as Council is unable to receive further submissions after the Public Hearing is closed.



DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:

Side bending stretch

1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.

2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.

3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a stretch in the side of your back.

4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch

1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically behind your back.

2. Gently pull the club up with your top hand until you feel a slight stretch in the shoulder of your lower arm. Hold for 15 seconds. 3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder

and arm.4. Hold for 15 seconds.5. Reverse hand positions and

Submitted by Alberta **Health Services**

ONOWAY - A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Isle Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

Avoid all contact with ٠ blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs,

wash with tap water as soon as possible.

Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where bluegreen algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.

Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Isle Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An alternate source of drinking

water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Isle Lake, until further notice.

Please note that areas of Isle Lake in which the blue-green algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this bluegreen algae Health Advisory is in place.
