## BODY OF MAN RECOVERED FROM BANKS OF PEMBINA RIVER

Entwistle, Alberta - Evansburg RCMP have recovered the body of an Edmonton man from the banks of the Pembina River near Entwistle.

On July 11 at approximately 1:00 pm, Evansburg RCMP responded to a report of a body

being found near the edge of the Pembina River near Entwistle, below the Highway 16 bridge. RCMP attended with assistance of the local fire department and Fish and Wildlife. Due to rugged terrain and steep cliffs in the area, the operation lasted for several hours and resulted in a closure of a popular river rafting area while the recovery efforts

were under way

The deceased has been identified as a 37-year-old man from Edmonton. The investigation is on-going, however the death is not considered suspicious at this time. The identity of the decease will not be released and the Evansburg RCMP would like to thank the public for their patience during the event.

#### FARM FAMILIES HONOURED IN NISKU

Alberta families who have farmed the same land for 100 years or more are being recognized with Century Farm and Ranch awards.

"My great-grandparents came over from Europe in 1902 and purchased our family's first land in 1904. Since then we've had 114 crops on the same land, and I think it's amazing that this farm has been in our family for that long. It is quite a privilege to be able to keep up the farm. It must be in my blood because farming is all I've ever wanted to do. It's a lot of work, but also a lot of reward." - Wayne Schneider, of Nisku, Century Farm and Ranch Award recipient

Since 1993, more than 1,750 families have received the Government of Alberta's Century Farm and Ranch awards.

Agriculture is the province's largest renewable industry, with exports valued at more than \$10 billion annually. There are more than 40,000 farms in Alberta, totalling more than 50 million acres.

# BRAZEAU COUNTY AND SURROUNDING COUNTIES NAMED FINALIST FOR SMART CITIES CHALLENGE GRANT

Along with Parkland, Lac Ste. Anne, and Yellowhead Counties, Brazeau County has been named a top 10 finalist out of more than 200 submissions for the Government of Canada's Smart Cities Challenge based on their plan to revitalize agriculture through technology and innovation.

As finalists, the counties have received a \$250,000 grant, which will be used to develop

a final proposal that will outline all design, planning, and project management components of the plan. The counties are the only rural finalists in the Smart Cities \$10 million prize category. If selected as winners, the prize will be used to create more prosperous and safe rural communities.

The Brazeau-Parkland-Lac Ste. Anne-Yellowhead proposal seeks to enhance market and knowledge links with urban Canada and beyond. Data-driven discussions will bring farmers closer to people's kitchen tables and address misconceptions

about how food is produced. The plan will improve safety and security in rural areas by reducing accidents between large machinery, and improve regional security through technology adoption.

"The Parkland 'Smart Cities Challenge' is inspiring," says Leanne Bellegarde, a member of the Smart Cities jury. "Through innovative technologies, they will capture data that is not only about farming innovation and sustainable land practices, but also about encouraging the future of farming."

"Harnessing the power of new innovative technologies begins with broad rural access to reliable high-speed Internet," says Brazeau County Reeve Bart Guyon. "We are proud to be a Smart Cities Challenge finalist with the other three counties, and look forward to sharing in the \$10 million prize to benefit our residents."





# FIRST CLASS ROPE RESCUE AND EMBANKMENT TRAINING FOR YCFD

There's more to Yellowhead County's Fire Department (YCFD) than just firefighting – both casual and paid-on-call firefighters are trained in vehicle extraction, heavy rescue training, first-aid, and now there are several who have embankment training under their belt.

In May, several YCFD firefighters worked under various weather conditions during some hands-on training with Pro Rescue Services out of Edmonton. Instructor and company president Bruce Dreany shared his experience and expertise in rope rescue training with the YCFD firefighters.

With an emphasis on safety for both the rescuers and the people being rescued, combined with learning from experience, the group of trainees came away with a wealth of new skills that are an asset to both Yellowhead County residents as well people working or recreating in the region.

Dreany uses learning opportunities to teach the firefighters how

to think on their feet and how to respond to situations that they may come up against that may not have been part of the plan.

During the training, the firefighters realized that they underestimated the length of the rope they needed and instead of letting them run back to the nearby training vehicle, Dreany used the scenario to replicate a rope rescue where the rescue location was theoretically a far distance from their vehicles with the longer rope they needed. The firefighters were able to problem solve the situation and come up with a safe and efficient solution that utilized the equipment they had on hand, and as a result, successfully rescue the firefighter located down the steep bank.

While trying to place the firefighters in situations that they might find themselves in, Dreany emphasizes that the rescuers first priority is safety, whether they are in training or a real rescue.

With such a large area that the Yellowhead County Fire Department covers for rescue situations, these new skills will likely prove to be an invaluable resource for YCFD firefighters.

# HAVE YOUR SAY ON UPDATING LOCAL ELECTION LAWS

Albertans have the opportunity to provide feedback about how

elections in municipalities, school boards, Metis Settlements and irrigation districts are conducted.

The Local Authorities Election Act establishes the framework for local elections in the province and is traditionally reviewed following each municipal election cycle.

"We're looking to Albertans to help us decide how local elections are run. We want to gauge Albertans' interest in bringing municipal campaign rules in line with the rules we put in place to take big money out of provincial politics. I encourage Albertans to visit our website and provide their input on how we can make municipal elections fairer and more transparent." - Shaye Anderson, Minister of Municipal Affairs

Government wants to hear from you!

Albertans are invited to complete an online survey and provide their comments by July 31.

Topics covered in the consultation include:

- campaign contributions and finances
- · campaign expenses
- third-party advertising
- school board trustee elections
- voter identification
- · advance votes
- residency requirements

In addition to the public survey, government will consult with key stakeholders, including municipalities, school boards, Metis Settlements and irrigation districts.

Based on the feedback, proposed changes may be introduced in a future session of the legislature









# CONSULTATION – AIR PASSENGER BILL OF RIGHTS

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is informing residents that the Canadian Transportation Agency (CTA) has announced the launch of public consultations on air passenger protection regulations.

Under new provisions of the Canada Transportation Act, which were added by the recently-passed, Transportation Modernization Act, the agency is charged with drafting a bill of rights for air travelers.

<sup>a</sup>This consultation will help develop regulations for the minimum standards of treatment and minimum levels of compensation, including how best to deal with tarmac delays, bumped seats and lost luggage," state MP Eglinski.

Canadians can give their input on these regulations by:

• attending one of eight in-person or online sessions across the country,

• filling in a questionnaire, or

• Reading the discussion paper and providing a written submission.

The CTA will also conduct surveys with air travelers at select airports across Canada.

The consultation process will continue until August 28, 2018. Once it concludes, all the input received will be considered and the new regulations will be drafted. The regulations will require approval from both the CTA and

the Governor in Council to come into force.

"When this Bill was going through the legislative process, I received several emails concerning this issue. Therefore, I encourage all those interested in air passenger protection to participate in this consultation," concluded MP Eglinski.

## **NO CLARITY ON CARBON TAX**

OTTAWA: Justin Trudeau is trying to ram through his carbon tax. He has failed to tell Canadians how much this tax hike will cost or what it will achieve.

Over the last two years, Conservatives have asked the government dozens of times to tell us how much a middle-class family will pay in new taxes and each time the Liberals have covered up the truth. Multiple requests for information filed with

the government have resulted in the release of documents that have key information blacked out

Canada's Conservatives have also repeatedly asked how much the Liberals' carbon tax will reduce greenhouse gas emissions, but the Prime Minister and the Minister of Environment have refused to answer.

When asked directly to provide real numbers on how much the Trudeau carbon tax would actually help the environment, **Environment Minister Catherine** 

McKenna could not even answer the question. That's unacceptable when Canadians are footing the bill.

The Parliamentary Budget Officer released a new report recently which found that the Liberal carbon tax will take \$10 billion out of the Canadian economy by 2022, while other estimates argue the cost could be as much as \$35 billion per year. This will hurt jobs, workers, and their families.

While the Liberals admit that gasoline prices will go up by

at least 11¢ a litre and that the cost of heating one's home will increase by over \$200, they will not tell us what the overall cost will be for an average Canadian family.

Justin Trudeau is making life more expensive for Canadian families. Gas prices, electricity rates, taxes and mortgage payments are all increasing, making it difficult for families to make ends meet. His Liberal government has raised income taxes on 80% of middle class taxpayers, boosted payroll taxes, and now he is ramming through a carbon tax that will inflate other consumer prices.



## CRA SCAM USING RCMP PHONE NUMBERS

Spruce Grove, Alberta – Many Canadians have received messages on their phone from someone claiming to be a police officer. This person states that the Canadian Revenue Agency has issued a warrant for their arrest because they owe taxes. They provide a name and a badge number. In order to avoid arrest, taxpayers are told to pay with money, gift cards and recently, bitcoin.

The scammers have now introduced a new twist. Spruce Grove RCMP have received reports that the CRA scammers are now using the Spruce Grove Detachment's complaint line, (780) 962-2222, to convince victims they are not scammers. They use spoofing mechanisms that allow them to choose any phone number they wish. Many peo-

ple are aware of this scam and will use the internet to check the phone number. When the phone number belongs to a RCMP detachment, victims start to believe that the warrant may be legitimate.

RCMP want the public to know that the Canadian Revenue Agency would never request payment over the phone, they do not accept gift cards or bitcoin as payment.

#### PASSING OF BILL C-49 IS A HISTORIC TURNING POINT FOR THE GRAIN INDUSTRY

The Alberta Wheat Commission (AWC) and Alberta Barley say today's news that Bill C-49, the Transportation Modernization Act, is about to receive Royal Assent represents a historic step forward for farmers. The Commissions have pressed hard for years to see a reformed transportation system that farmers can rely on to get their product to Canada's global customers in a timely fashion.

The commissions are now looking forward to seeing key aspects of the legislation implemented including shippers' ability to negotiate reciprocal penalties in service level agreements with the railways and access to long haul interswitching to open up better competitive rail options.

The commissions hope to see these mechanisms introduced in the system prior to the beginning of the crop year on August 1 and look forward to seeing the railways' plans for moving the 2018 crop.

"We saw today that the government is listening to farmers," said Jason Lenz, Alberta Barley Chair. "Bill C-49 is a monumental turning point – it not only provides the long-term competitive mechanisms to improve rail service that we've been working to see implemented, but also paves the way for Canada to maintain its status as a reliable supplier to our global customers."

The commissions further note their gratitude to Ministers Marc Garneau and Lawrence MacAulay for their commitment to this file. The Senate Standing Committee on Transport and Communications chaired by Senator David Tkachuk also played an instrumental role in bringing forward important amendments that strengthen the legislation.

"We are extremely pleased to see the government move this long overdue legislation forward," said Kevin Bender, AWC Chair. "Bill C-49 lays the foundation for a transportation system where all players, including the railways, are accountable for their performance."

The commissions look forward to monitoring the implementation of Bill C-49 through the Crop Logistics Working Group of which AWC is a member.
