BARRHEAD RCMP ARREST MALE AFTER REPORT OF DRIVING WITH BALACLAVA

On July 14, 2018 at approximately 2:30 p.m., Barrhead RCMP responded to a report of a suspicious vehicle in Lac Ste. Anne County. The vehicle was believed to be involved in a break and enter that occurred the same morning at a residence where a firearm and property was stolen.

A witness also reported seeing a lone occupant driving a truck wearing a balaclava on Highway 33.

Police located the vehicle believed to be involved on Highway 33 and Township Road 590 and initiated a traffic stop. The vehicle was approached during the stop but the driver then sped off. A pursuit was initiated and the vehicle came to a stop near Highway 18 and Range Road 30 as it attempted to drive through a ditch. The male suspect was arrested and taken into custody.


We were thrilled to have Chief Ives and the North West Fire Rescue Team join us again this year to showcase their equipment and expertise and provide educational information on fire safety!

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents that the federal government is accepting applications for small projects under the Enabling Accessibility Fund (EAF) through Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC).

The call is open to not-forprofit and Indigenous organizations, small businesses, and municipalities and territorial governments.

Successful applicants can receive grant funding of up to \$100,000 for the capital costs of construction, renovation and/or retrofit activities in workplaces and communities, as well as the provision of accessible technologies in one of two streams:

• Workplace stream: facilities where people with disabilities work, or could work in the future: and.

. Community Accessibility stream: community spaces where programs and/or services are offered, or will be offered, to people with disabilities.

The deadline to apply is July 26, 2018.

"This Enabling Accessibility Fund provides an important opportunity to make sure that all residents in our riding of Yellowhead, regardless of their abilities, feel welcome in their

workplaces and communities. I strongly encourage interested organizations to submit a proposal for this funding," concluded MP Eglinski.

CANADA SUPPORTING UKRAINE'S ECONOMIC SECURITY

OTTAWA – As a member of the Canada-Ukraine Parliamentary Friendship Group (CUFPG), Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, was pleased to learn that Canada will continue to support Ukraine's economic security.

The announcement was made this week by the Honourable Marie-Claude Bibeau, Minister of International Development, in Kyiv during a joint press conference with Ukraine's First Deputy Prime Minister, Stepan Kubiv.

The announcement launched a \$30-million call for preliminary proposals for innovative projects that will enhance the economic security of rural women, especially those affected by the conflict in the eastern part of the country. The projects will also help to create a more competitive, innovative and sustainable environment for small and medium-sized enterprises, as well as increase employment and entrepreneurship opportunities for women and for vulnerable and marginalized groups.

The preliminary call for proposals is entitled "Growth that works for everyone—Inclusive and shared prosperity in Ukraine." The deadline to submit proposals is October 24, 2018.

Since the previous Conservative Government initiated support in January 2014, Canada has committed more than \$750 million in multifaceted support to Ukraine, encompassing a broad range of financial, development, stabilization and security, non-lethal military and humanitarian assistance.

"The defence of Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity should continue to be a priority for Canada's government on the international stage," concluded MP Eglinski.

The threshing bee is a go! Onoway and District Historical Guild will once again (this is the 12th year!) give people of all ages a chance to experience some of what life was like for rural families back in the days before online shopping, driverless cars, communication via texting and buying ready-made meals at the grocery store.

Horses and hayracks will haul stooks in from the field just north-west of the junction of highways 43 and 633. Then the stooks will be tossed on to the feeder of the threshing machine and be transformed into straw and grain. Volunteers are welcome to try their hand at tossing stooks.

Besides the straw flying through the air, visitors will be treated to a display of antique vehicles, demos of old-time blacksmithing and ropemaking, and there will be special activities for kids. To top off the day, visitors can indulge in homemade pies – one of the "musthave" dishes that were part of the threshing crew's meals. The traditional events will be enhanced by a visit from Eden North parachute jumpers and entertainment by Connie Lefebvre.

The gates open at 11:00 a.m. with closing down at 4:00 p.m. Admission is by donation.

HERE COMES THE SUN (SCREEN)

Ah, the lazy, hazy days of summer. The sun shines brightly—and strongly. When it does, these tips will make your time in the sun safer.

Check the UV index, which measures sun strength. You can be sunburned in as little as 15 minutes. When the UV index is between 3 and 8, everyone, especially kids, needs sunscreen. If it's above 8, these tips will reduce your risk of sunburn as well as heat rash, heat stroke and, over time, skin cancer. Safety tips

• Cover up: Wear wide-brimmed hats, UV-blocking sunglasses and thin light-coloured clothing

• Limit the rays: Take frequent

breaks in the shade or indoors

• Apply and re-apply sunscreen: Put it on every two hours (at least). Match the sun protective factor (SPF) to the UV index and your skin's sensitivity to sunlight. Babies have thin skin and can burn easily. Keep them out of the sun. Use an SPF 30 lip balm on your lips.

• Stay hydrated: Bring lots of water with you when spending time outside, and drink often, before you're thirsty

• Car safety: Never leave your child or pet alone in a car. Your car can heat up quickly, even on days that do not seem very warm.

Try to stay out of the sun between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m., when the sun's rays are strongest and the UV Index is at its highest.

NO CHARGES IN BARRHEAD SHOOTING INVESTIGATION

On Feb. 22, 2017, the Alberta Serious Incident Response Team (ASIRT) was directed to investigate the circumstances surrounding an officer-involved shooting that day in Barrhead.

While there was no injury, an incident when an officer discharges a firearm at a person is deemed to fall under the provisions of the Police Act requiring notification to the director of law enforcement.

In the early morning hours of Feb. 22, 2017, Barrhead RCMP received information about the location of a 33-year-old man wanted by police on several outstanding warrants. Through further investigation, police identified a local residence as the wanted man's likely location. The man was well-known to police and had an extensive criminal record, including a history of violence. Based on the available information, the man was believed to be in possession of a handgun, a picture of which was circulated to RCMP members.

Several RCMP members went to the residence with the intention of obtaining a warrant authorizing them to enter the residence to arrest the wanted man. As part of the process, officers would need to establish reasonable grounds to believe that the man was, in fact, inside. Prior to obtaining a warrant, an RCMP officer knocked on the door, which was answered by

another occupant of the residence. As officers asked the occupant if the wanted man was home, police saw the man run through a portion of the house, and he appeared to be trying to escape through a bedroom window. The person at the door closed and locked the door with police outside. Based on their observations, police decided to force entry into the residence. One officer tried to force open the front door, while a second officer forced open and entered the side door. Once inside, the officer who entered via the side door encountered the wanted man, told him that he was under arrest, and issued verbal commands to the man to get down on the ground and to show his hands. The man was non-compliant and refused to show his hands. The officer fired a single round from his service weapon. The man was not struck and fled the residence. Ultimately, police found and arrested him at a later date. No one was injured

from the gunshot. A review of the evidence raised arguable issues with the lawful placement of the officers following the warrantless entry into the residence. As is required by the Police Act, ASIRT forwarded the matter to the Alberta Crown Prosecution Service (ACPS) for an opinion. The opinion indicated that based on a totality of the circumstances, there was no reasonable likelihood of conviction against the subject officer. Following a careful review of the evidence gathered in the investigation, and considering the ACPS opinion, the officer will not be charged with any criminal offence(s).

ASIRT's mandate is to effectively, independently and objectively investigate incidents involving Alberta's police that have resulted in serious injury or death to any person and serious or sensitive allegations of police misconduct.

Alberta families who have farmed the same land for 100 years or more are being recognized with Century Farm and Ranch awards.

Recipients of the award received a bronze plaque to commemorate this significant milestone. A total of 96 families are being recognized across the province, including 15 families who were honoured in Nisku on June 21.

"Agriculture is at the core of who we are as Albertans. It's an integral part of the foundation of our province's cultural heritage, our strong economy and our vibrant rural communities. It is an honour to recognize these founding families and their legacy. Our government continues to support the sustainable growth of our local food industry and the hard-working entrepreneurs in this sector." - Oneil Carlier, Minister of Agriculture and Forestry

"My great-grandparents came over from Europe in 1902 and purchased our family's first land in 1904. Since then we've had 114 crops on the same land, and I think it's amazing that this farm has been in our family for that long. It is quite a privilege to be able to keep up the farm. It must



be in my blood because farming is all I've ever wanted to do. It's a lot of work, but also a lot of reward." - Wayne Schneider, of Nisku, Century Farm and Ranch Award recipient

ONEIL CARLIER, MLA for WHITECOURT-STE. ANNE and Alberta's Premier Rachel Notley share Albertans' concerns about Greyhound's decision to discontinue service in Western Canada.

"There are many Albertans in Whitecourt-Ste. Anne constituency, particularly those living in Onoway, Mayerthorpe and Whitecourt who rely on the Greyhound bus service to get to medical appointments, visit family and friends, or even to commute to work" said Carlier. "Senior citizens, working residents and university students rely heavily on this transportation service to get to and from Edmonton and now they will lose this option all together."

Greyhound only gave a 90-day notice before discontinuing service, making it difficult to find other transportation options. In response, Premier Notley and Transportation Minister Brian Mason are urging the federal government to work with Greyhound to extend the notice by at least six months, and establish a task group with the provinces to find alternative options.

"Premier Notley and our government will keep fighting to extend Greyhound's operations in our communities until there are other solutions in place," said Carlier. "This is an issue of national importance and we are making sure the federal government also stands up for rural Albertans and all Western Canadians. These people make a huge contribution to our communities and country and we cannot leave them stranded on the side of the road."

In addition, the Alberta government has already committed to improving rural transportation, having launched pilot projects that connect communities like Sexsmith and Clairmont to hubs like Grande Prairie. The province is looking at expanding these pilot projects to other communities.

TASK FORCE ON COAL TRANSITION

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is informing residents that the Liberal Government has announced the members of the Just Transition Task Force, which will provide advice on how to make the transition away from coal a fair one for workers and communities.

The terms of reference for the Just Transition Task Force were published in February 2018, along with updated regulations accelerating the phase-out of traditional coal-fired electricity, by 2030.

The Task Force will be cochaired by the President of the Canadian Labour Congress and the Executive Director of the Conservation Council of New Brunswick. In total, the Task Force has eleven members, including a Leduc County Councillor, Rick Smith. Seven members were nominated by the Canadian Labour Congress, Unifor, and the Federation of Canadian Municipalities. Four members were selected for their expertise in sustainable development, workforce development,

and the electricity sector.

Their work will include meeting with communities, workers, and other stakeholders. Its members will make site visits to coal plants and communities that will be affected by the accelerated phase-out of coal power in Canada. Their mandate is to make recommendations to the federal government, by the end of 2018, on how to help workers and communities identify economic opportunities for the future, seize those opportunities, and minimize impacts in the transition away from coal power.

"While I am glad to see the

Liberal Government consulting workers and communities, this should have been done before any decision was made to accelerate the phase-out of coal power. I hope the Task Force will identify meaningful solutions to transition communities and help workers acquire the skills they will need to find new jobs," concluded MP Eglinski.

RAIL CONSULTATION AND RAIL HELP LINE LAUNCHED

These consultations are part of the agency's Regulatory Modernization Initiative and will support the implementation of the Transportation Modernization Act (Bill C-49), which amends the Canada Transportation Act (Act) to introduce new

measures related to freight rail.

"For years now, our communities in Yellowhead have experienced ongoing safety issues in which trains block crossings for unacceptable amounts of time. I am encouraging all affected residents and stakeholders with a vested interest in rail safety to make their voices heard in this consultation," stated MP Eglinski.

All those interested are invited to share their views to ensure that the CTA's rail-related regulations and guidance materials are relevant, clear and up to date. Participants can submit comments to ferroviaire-rail@otccta.gc.ca before the September 30, 2018 deadline.

"If you are being excessively held up by a train at a rail crossing or have a safety concern, I encourage you to call this number and make sure the agency and the rail companies are aware of residents' concerns," concluded MP Eglinski.
