MLAS HORNE AND BABCOCK COMMITTED TO IMPROVING RURAL TRANSPORTATION

SPRUCE GROVE – Trevor Horne, MLA for Spruce Grove-St Albert, Erin Babcock, MLA for Stony Plain, and Alberta's Premier Rachel Notley share Albertans' concerns about Greyhound's decision to discontinue service in Western Canada.

"There are many Albertans in Spruce Grove-St Albert, particularly those living Spruce Grove, that rely on the Greyhound bus service to get to medical appointments or even to commute to work" said MLA Horne. "If anyone needs to visit family in places like Whitecourt, Valleyview, or Fox Creek, they have no other alternatives."

Greyhound only gave a 90-day notice before discontinuing service, making it difficult to find other transportation options. In response, Premier Notley and Transportation Minister Brian Mason are urging the federal government to work with Greyhound to extend the notice by at least six months, and establish a task group with the provinces to find alternative options.

"Premier Notley and our government will keep fighting to extend Greyhound's operations in our communities until there are other solutions in place," said MLA Babcock. "This is an issue of national importance and we are making sure the federal government also stands up for rural Albertans and all Western Canadians. These people make a huge contribution to our communities and country and we cannot leave them stranded on the side of the road."

In addition, the Alberta government has already committed to improving rural transportation, having launched pilot projects that connect communities like Sexsmith and Clairmont to hubs like Grande Prairie. The province is looking at expanding these pilot projects to other communities.

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents that the federal government is accepting applications for small projects under the Enabling Accessibility Fund (EAF) through Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC).

The call is open to not-for-profit

and Indigenous organizations, small businesses, and municipalities and territorial governments.

Successful applicants can receive grant funding of up to \$100,000 for the capital costs of construction, renovation and/or retrofit activities in workplaces and communities, as well as the provision of accessible technologies in one of two streams:

• Workplace stream: facilities where people with disabilities work,

or could work in the future; and,

• Community Accessibility stream: community spaces where programs and/or services are offered, or will be offered, to people with disabilities.

The deadline to apply is July 26, 2018.

"This Enabling Accessibility Fund provides an important opportunity to make sure that all residents in our riding of Yellowhead, regardless of their abilities, feel welcome in their workplaces and communities. I strongly encourage interested organizations to submit a proposal for this funding," concluded MP Eglinski.

CANADA SUPPORTING UKRAINE'S ECONOMIC SECURITY

As a member of the Canada-Ukraine Parliamentary Friendship Group (CUFPG), Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, was pleased to learn that Canada will continue to support Ukraine's economic security.

The announcement was made this week by the Honourable Marie-Claude Bibeau, Minister of International Development, in Kyiv during a joint press conference with Ukraine's First Deputy Prime Minister, Stepan Kubiv.

The announcement launched a \$30-million call for preliminary proposals for innovative projects that will enhance the economic security of rural women, especially those affected by the conflict in the eastern part of the country. The projects will also help to create a more competitive, innovative and sustainable environment for small and

medium-sized enterprises, as well as increase employment and entrepreneurship opportunities for women and for vulnerable and marginalized groups.

The preliminary call for proposals is entitled "Growth that works for everyone—Inclusive and shared prosperity in Ukraine." The deadline to submit proposals is October 24, 2018.

Since the previous Conservative Government initiated support in January 2014, Canada has committed more than \$750 million in multifaceted support to Ukraine, encompassing a broad range of financial, development, stabilization and security, non-lethal military and humanitarian assistance.

"The defence of Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity should continue to be a priority for Canada's government on the international stage," concluded MP Eglinski.



BARRHEAD RCMP ARREST MALE AFTER REPORT OF DRIVING WITH BALACLAVA

On July 14, 2018 at approximately 2:30 p.m., Barrhead RCMP responded to a report of a suspicious vehicle in Lac Ste. Anne County. The vehicle was believed to be involved in a break and enter that occurred the same morning at a residence where a firearm and property was stolen.

A witness also reported seeing a lone occupant driving a truck wearing a balaclava on Highway 33.

Police located the vehicle believed to be involved on Highway 33 and Township Road 590 and initiated a traffic stop. The vehicle was approached during the stop but the driver then sped off. A pursuit was initiated and the vehicle came to a stop near Highway 18 and Range Road 30 as it attempted to drive through a ditch. The male suspect was arrested and taken into custody. The truck was previously stolen from the Hamlet of Sangudo, Alberta and two firearms and ammunition

were also seized.

Kenny Angus Rain (29) of Duffield, Alberta was charged with 12 Criminal Code offences some of which include:

• Drive while disqualified

• Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle while being pursued by police

• Disguise with intent to commit an offence

 Possession of break-in instruments

• Possession of property obtained

by crime over \$5000

• Mischief under \$5000

Additional charges of break and enter (X2) and motor vehicle theft were also laid as a result of the break and enter and theft in Sangudo. Rain also had a warrant for assault causing bodily harm from an incident in Duffield, Alberta on June 19, 2018.

He was remanded into custody and his next court appearance will be in Barrhead Provincial Court on July 24, 2018 in relation to the 12 charges.

PHOENIX PAY SYSTEM ISSUES

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is informing residents that Public Services and Procurement Canada has announced the introduction of a new approach to addressing Phoenix Pay System issues.

"Fixing the Phoenix pay system is long overdue. While we await the Liberal plan to replace Phoenix, 150,000 public servants, including many in our riding, still have outstanding pay requests that need to be processed," stated MP Eglinski.

Pay Pods are being introduced at the Miramichi Pay Centre to better support employees by processing pay transactions. Pay Pods, a concept developed by Pay Centre employees, group together compensation advisors assigned to a specific department or agency. These groups will work with client departments to address all outstanding transactions in an employee's pay file, in contrast to the current approach of addressing pay issues by transaction type. This new approach is expected to result in more efficient and comprehensive resolutions of pay issues, and a reduction in backlogged cases.

Pay Pods will be rolled out to all departments and agencies serviced by the Pay Centre in phases starting this month.

"The Auditor General estimated

that because of Liberal inaction the Phoenix system would take more than half a billion dollars to fix. I urge the Minister of Public Services to make this a top priority," concluded MP Eglinski.

ATTENTION YOUTH! THE ENABLING ACCESSIBILITY FUND WANTS YOUR IDEAS

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents of a call for expressions of interest under the Enabling Accessibility Fund (EAF).

In celebration of National AccessAbility Week, Employment and Social Development Canada has launched the call for expressions of interest for youth leaders across Canada, who will work with eligible organizations to submit project proposals under EAF's Youth Innovation Component.

"This opportunity gives young volunteers a chance to make a difference and directly address accessibility issues in their communities," stated MP Eglinski.

Youth interested in participating are required to identify accessibility barriers in public places or workplaces within their immediate and/or surrounding communities, and seek out interested organizations willing to work with them to develop an EAF accessibility project funding proposal worth up to \$10,000. Eligible organizations include: not-for-profit organizations, small businesses (up to 99 full-time employees), small municipalities (population under 125,000), Indigenous organizations, and territorial governments. The call for expressions of inter-

The call for expressions of interest will support approximately 125 youth-driven projects aimed at increasing accessibility in community facilities and workplaces across Canada.

"This is an incredible opportunity for young people to gain significant experience in public service and project management, while making meaningful changes in their communities for persons with disabilities and accessibility issues. I encourage our local youth to consider applying to this funding program," concluded MP Eglinski.

RAIL CONSULTATION AND RAIL HELP LINE LAUNCHED

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents that the Canadian Transportation Agency (CTA) has launched consultation on rail-related regulations and guidance materials. .

These consultations are part of the agency's Regulatory Modernization Initiative and will support the implementation of the Transportation Modernization Act (Bill C-49), which amends the Canada Transportation Act (Act) to introduce new measures related to freight rail.

"For years now, our communities in Yellowhead have experienced ongoing safety issues in which trains block crossings for unacceptable amounts of time. I am encouraging all affected residents and stakeholders with a vested interest in rail safety to make their voices heard in this consultation." stated MP Eglinski.

All those interested are invited to share their views to ensure that the CTA's rail-related regulations and guidance materials are relevant, clear and up to date. Participants can submit comments to ferroviaire-rail@otc-cta.gc.ca before the September 30, 2018 deadline.

The CTA has also launched a new confidential toll-free Rail Help Line to provide information, guidance and dispute resolution services on the rail-related provisions of the Act.

Shippers, communities, members of the public, and railway companies now have immediate access to a rail analyst if they have questions on railway operations, railway infrastructure, shipper and community rights, or dispute resolution.

The phone number for the Rail Help Line is 1-877-850-7148.

"If you are being excessively held up by a train at a rail crossing or have a safety concern, I encourage you to call this number and make sure the agency and the rail companies are aware of residents' concerns," concluded MP Eglinski.

REDESIGNED, MORE SECURE DRIVER'S LICENCES UNVEILED

New driver's licences and identification cards will help protect Albertans against counterfeiting and ID theft and save government more than \$1 million annually.

To better protect Albertans from fraud, the government has redesigned provincial driver's licences and ID cards with updated security features like clear windows, laser

engraving and 3D embossing that makes it harder to alter or replicate the cards.

The new cards also include imagery that reflects Alberta's landscape and history.

"Our government takes identity fraud very seriously. We are the first jurisdiction in North America to integrate this combination of design and security to protect Albertans from ID theft and prevent fraud. We are using the latest technology available to safeguard people's personal information and prevent scams." -Stephanie McLean, Minister of Service Alberta

The cards are now in production and, because of advances in technology, cost less to manufacture than the previous design, saving Alberta taxpayers more than \$1 million annually.

The driver's licence design depicts Castle Mountain and the Bow River in Banff National Park, while the ID cards feature a Wild Rose, Alberta's provincial flower. Both cards also



include an image of an Albertosaurus, a dinosaur whose name honours Alberta, where its remains were first discovered.

The last redesign occurred in 2009 and the Alberta government has incorporated advice from law enforcement agencies to ensure the cards have the most up-to-date safe-guards against fraudsters and identify thieves.

"The new security measures in the Alberta driver's licences and identification cards will help ensure the safety and security of the public's information. These security measures will help law enforcement in identifying those individuals who are fraudulently attempting to use this document for illegal purposes." - Brian Simpson, Deputy Chief, Edmonton Police Service

There is no need to replace current licences or ID cards. Current cards will be phased out through the normal renewal process as cards expire.

Some security features on the cards can be verified using a look-listen-feel approach:

Look

• Clear window: three complex look-through windows, including one in the shape of Alberta, contain the cardholder's photo. The use of a complex, asymmetrical window is a first in Canada.

• Rainbow printing: a gradual transition of colour from one part of the card to another makes it difficult to scan and replicate.

• "Ghost" date of birth: the security background is visible through the characters of the birth month and year.

Listen

• The card makes a tin-like sound when dropped on a hard surface, unlike credit cards or bank cards.

Feel

• Clear laser engraving: you can feel the clear lettering (date of birth and sex) to the left of the photo.

• Raised text: you can feel the raised black text on the date of birth, date of expiry and signature. The data is engraved into the core of the card and difficult to alter or replicate.

• Embossed Alberta shield: can be seen and felt in the lower part of the clear window.

• 3D embossing: you can feel the Albertosaurus image raised above the card surface. It creates a 3D effect – the tail continues on the back of the card and appears to travel through the Alberta-shaped window.


