RCMP CENTRAL ALBERTA DISTRICT CRIME REDUCTION UNIT DISMANTLE CHOP SHOP IN ST. ALBERT

The RCMP Central Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) were engaged by St. Albert and Morinville RCMP Detachments to assist in arresting targeted offenders who were believed to be operating a 'chop shop'. Four males have been arrested and several charges laid.

Over the course of July 24 and 25, the Central Alberta District

CRU were investigating a property and a known repeat offender in the St. Albert area. While investigating, the CRU observed minor thefts committed by the four suspect males.

On July 24, the four males were arrested. Following their arrest, investigation by the CRU determined that both Ford F350s that the males were associated to had been reported stolen. In one case, the vehicle identification number of the truck had been altered With the assistance of members from St. Albert Detachment, a related residential property on Villeneuve Road was secured in anticipation of a search warrant. On July 25, with the assistance of Edmonton RCMP Auto Theft Unit and the Wetaskiwin and St. Albert CRUs, the Central Alberta District CRU executed a search warrant. A stolen utility trailer along with parts from a GMC Sierra were seized.

It is anticipated that the possession, sale and consumption of cannabis will be legalized by the Government of Canada on October 17, 2018. In preparation for this, the Town of Whitecourt has been working to determine land use regulations, as well as guidelines surrounding consumption within our community.

• In response to upcoming federal and provincial legislative changes, the Land Use Bylaw has been amended to allow for the sale of cannabis in specific land use districts. This change will see cannabis treated similarly to the retail of alcohol and tobacco products.

• Administration is preparing amendments to the Community Standards Bylaw to include restrictions for cannabis consumption, and draft amendments will be reviewed at the August 21 Regular Meeting. The Town of Whitecourt will be hosting a public information meeting in September to receive comments and feedback from residents. Details will be posted on www.whitecourt.ca and on the Town's Facebook page once confirmed.

Whitecourt will be submitting three projects to the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program for consideration. Expressions of interest, the first stage in the application process, will be submitted for:

• Community, Culture, and Recreation Infrastructure category:

- Arts & Culture Facility and Library

- Sportfield Master Plan Improvements

• Green Infrastructure category:

- Wastewater Treatment Plant



Improvements

While the arts & culture facility and library project has not received formal approval to proceed by Whitecourt Town Council, it is felt that submitting an expression of interest is a prudent financial plan to secure funding in the event that a decision will be made soon. All projects, should funding be received through the grant program, will be brought back to Councils for approval prior to commencing.

The Town of Whitecourt will be issuing a tender in the coming

weeks for the rebuild of 50th Avenue and portions of West Street in west Whitecourt. The project will enhance drainage and road conditions for the area.

The 2018 Project List, which outlines projects and initiatives undertaken throughout the organization for this year, has been updated and is available to view on www.whitecourt.ca. There are 161 projects included in the 2018 document.

A new template has been created for the Quarterly Financial Report. The document outlines revenues and expenditures associated with providing municipal services, and includes supplementary information regarding key accomplishments, unforeseen emergencies, and information on federal/provincial grant approvals. The report is available for public viewing on www.whitecourt.ca.

Council has proclaimed September 23 to 29 as Rail Safety Week.

The next Regular Meeting of Council is scheduled for Tuesday, August 21 at 7:00 p.m. at the Forest Interpretive Centre.

July 31, 2018 **BLUE-GREEN ALGAE (CYANOBACTERIA) BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR PEANUT LAKE**

COUNTY OF BARRHEAD – A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Peanut Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

• Avoid all contact with blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

• Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where bluegreen algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.

• Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

• Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Peanut Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Peanut Lake, until further notice.

Please note that areas of Pea-

nut Lake in which the blue-green algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this bluegreen algae Health Advisory is in place.

If you suspect a problem related to blue-green algae or if you require further information on health concerns and blue-green algae, please call Health Link at 811. Additional information is also available online, at www. ahs.ca/bga.

Stony Plain, Alberta – On July 18, 2018 at 5:13 P.M., Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP received a complaint regarding a theft of some items from a storage locker located in Spruce Grove, Alberta. The incident occurred sometime within the previous 2 weeks.

Items missing included personal items and five fully restored vintage motorcycles with a value of approximately \$25,000.00. Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove and Enoch Serious Crimes Unit worked collectively on gathering intelligence and identifying the location of the motorcycles. As a result, a search warrant was obtained and the motorcycles were recovered from a residence in Stony Plain, Alberta.

The motorcycles have since been returned to their owner.

A male and a female were arrested. Both were charged with Possession of Stolen Property over five thousand dollars.

Matthew Boreen, 33 years old, from Stony Plain, Alberta was remanded into custody. His first appearance is on July 25, 2018 at Stony Plain Provincial Court.

Stefanie Dul, 27 years old, from Stony Plain, Alberta, was released with conditions. She will appear in court on July 25, 2018 at Stony Plain Provincial Court.

If you're an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) driver, it's hard to resist the allure of exploring backcountry trails during the summer. These tips will help newbies and trail veterans alike navigate the ins and outs of ATV safety.

Age limits

Some exceptions apply, but the minimum age by law for operating off-highway vehicles is 14 years. The AHS recommended age is 16.

Know the risks

When not used safely, ATV risks include

- Scrapes and cuts
- Strains and sprains
- Broken bones
- · Dislocated joints
- Bruising

• Concussions and head injuries

• Internal injuries.

Safety tips

• Choose an ATV that's right for your size to reduce a chance of rollover or serious injury.

• Wear protective equipment such as an approved ATV helmet, eyewear and gloves.

• Wear pants, long sleeves and boots to prevent cuts and scrapes.

• Ride during daylight hours, at a safe speed, with other people around.

• Carry a first-aid kit with each vehicle.

• Don't drive while or after using alcohol or other drugs.

• Take a certification course through the Alberta Safety Council.

DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

(NC) A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:

Side bending stretch

1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.

2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.

3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a stretch in the side of your back.

4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

ALBERTA RCMP, EDMONTON POLICE SERVICE, LAY CHARGES FOLLOWING SERIES OF BREAK-INS IN CENTRAL ALBERTA

Police arrested four individuals in connection with 18 incidents that took place in Edmonton, Strathcona County, Spruce Grove and Fort Saskatchewan over a two-month period. The group is alleged to have stolen over \$125,000 in cash and goods and caused nearly \$50,000 in property damage.

It was clear members of the crime group were experienced. They moved carefully and operated at all hours to try and avoid police detection. To take them down, a coordinated strategy and additional resources were needed.

A task force under the Intelligence Sharing and Action Program was activated in order to pool resources. Through this collaborative model, Alberta RCMP, Edmonton Police Service and other agencies are able to quickly mount large investigations normally outside the range of single detachments.

"This is true collaborative and intelligence-led policing. We were faced with an issue that impacted multiple jurisdictions and, together, developed and executed a strategy to meaningfully respond." - Super-

Through a coordinated effort, and with the support of a High Altitude Surveillance Plane that helped guide surveillance on the ground, the task force was able to gather the evidence required to execute search warrants on four residences and locate and arrest four individuals. Police recovered, among other items, jewellery, a wall mounted safe and a signed Nugent-Hopkins Edmonton Oilers jersey as well as other memorabilia.



The study will explore whether there are ways to foster more competition in this sector, which could lead to more choices and lower prices for Canadians. Specifically, the study will look at whether changes to internet regulations could result in a broader range of service options, encourage more informed consumer choice, and reduce barriers to consumers switching between providers.

"While most Canadians are well-served, many, including

those in the rural areas of our Yellowhead riding, do not have access to broadband internet access services that are comparable to those offered to the vast majority of Canadians in terms of speed, capacity, quality and price," stated MP Eglinski.

July 31, 2018 **BLUE-GREEN ALGAE (CYANOBACTERIA) BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR LAC LA NONNE**

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY – A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Lac La Nonne. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

• Avoid all contact with blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

• Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where bluegreen algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.

• Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

• Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Lac La Nonne, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Lac La Nonne, until further notice. Please note that areas of Lac La Nonne in which the bluegreen algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this blue-green algae Health Advisory is in place.

If you suspect a problem related to blue-green algae or if you require further information on health concerns and blue-green algae, please call Health Link at 811. Additional information is also available online, at www. ahs.ca/bga.
