AGENCIES WORK TOGETHER TO ARREST PROLIFIC OFFENDER

Drayton Valley, Alberta - On July 23, 2018 at approximately 9:30 pm, Drayton Valley RCMP were on patrol when they received a tip of a wanted male on a stolen side by side. The tipster provided information on the direction of travel and approximate speed. The side by side entered a bush area where it became stuck, the male fled on foot through the bush.

Members contacted the RCMP Police Dog Service and devised a plan to contain the area. Oil-field agency security also assisted with the containment. Upon arrival of the Police Dog Service they began tracking the suspect through deep brush crossing over an area of the North Saskatchewan River through thigh high water, up steep inclines and then back through the water again for a distance of approximately 3 and a half kilometres.

The suspect, 27 year old James

Roblin was subsequently arrested for outstanding warrants from Banff and Drayton Valley. Additional Charges include Possession of Stolen Property over \$5000, Break and Enter, Hit and Run to escape, Breach of Recognizance x 3, Possession of a weapon for dangerous purpose.

The cooperation of all parties involved was instrumental in bringing this event to a safe and successful conclusion.

ALBERTA RCMP, EDMONTON POLICE SERVICE, LAY CHARGES FOLLOWING SERIES OF BREAK-INS IN CENTRAL ALBERTA

Police arrested four individuals in connection with 18 incidents that took place in Edmonton, Strathcona County, Spruce Grove and Fort Saskatchewan over a two-month period. The



group is alleged to have stolen over \$125,000 in cash and goods and caused nearly \$50,000 in property damage.


It was clear members of the crime group were experienced. They moved carefully and operated at all hours to try and avoid police detection. To take them down, a coordinated strategy and additional resources were needed.

A task force under the Intelligence Sharing and Action Program was activated in order to pool resources. Through this collaborative model, Alberta RCMP, Edmonton Police Service and other agencies are able to quickly mount large investigations normally outside the range of single detachments.

"This is true collaborative and intelligence-led policing. We were faced with an issue that impacted multiple jurisdictions and, together, developed and executed a strategy to meaningfully respond." - Superintendent Peter Tewfik, Officer in Charge of Crime Reduction, Alberta RCMP

Through a coordinated effort, and with the support of a High Altitude Surveillance Plane that helped guide surveillance on the ground, the task force was able to gather the evidence required to execute search warrants on four residences and locate and arrest four individuals. Police recovered, among other items, jewellery, a wall mounted safe and a signed Nugent-Hopkins Edmonton Oilers jersey as well as other memorabilia.

TASK FORCE ON COAL TRANSITION

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is informing residents that the Liberal Government has announced the members of the Just Transition Task Force, which will provide advice on how to make the transition away from coal a fair one for workers and communities.

The terms of reference for the Just Transition Task Force were published in February 2018, along with updated regulations accelerating the phase-out of

traditional coal-fired electricity, by 2030.

The Task Force will be cochaired by the President of the Canadian Labour Congress and the Executive Director of the Conservation Council of New Brunswick. In total, the Task Force has eleven members, including a Leduc County Councillor, Rick Smith, Seven members were nominated by the Canadian Labour Congress, Unifor, and the Federation of Canadian Municipalities. Four members were selected for their expertise in sustainable development, workforce development,

and the electricity sector.

Their work will include meeting with communities, workers, and other stakeholders. Its members will make site visits to coal plants and communities that will be affected by the accelerated phase-out of coal power in Canada. Their mandate is to make recommendations to the federal government, by the end of 2018, on how to help workers and communities identify economic opportunities for the future, seize those opportunities, and minimize impacts in the transition away from coal power.

"While I am glad to see the

Liberal Government consulting workers and communities, this should have been done before any decision was made to accelerate the phase-out of coal power. I hope the Task Force will identify meaningful solutions to transition communities and help workers acquire the skills they will need to find new jobs," concluded MP Eglinski.

FUNDING FOR STUDENT PLACEMENTS IN THE MINING SECTOR

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform local companies that the Department of Employment, Workforce Development and Labour has announced that it will provide \$7.8 million over the next four years to the Mining Industry Human Resources Council for their Gearing Up: Developing Mining Talent Through Work-Integrated Learning project.

"This project will help 850 students throughout Canada in the STEM and business fields to develop important skills and gain valuable workplace experience," stated MP Eglinski.

Interested companies can apply to the Mining Industry Human Resources Council, which is a not-for-profit organization that works with stakeholders to identify and address the human resources and labour market challenges facing the Canadian minerals and metals sector.

Applicants must be Canadian-owned small, medium or large companies involved in the mining or mineral exploration sector. Not-for profits and educational institutions can also apply.

Eligible employers will receive up to 70% of an intern's salary (up to \$7,000) for new WIL placements involving under-represented groups (women, immigrants, people with disabilities and first year students). Other placements are eligible to receive 50% of an intern's salary (up to

Age limits

Some exceptions apply, but the minimum age by law for operating off-highway vehicles is 14 years. The AHS recommended age is 16.

Know the risks

When not used safely, ATV risks include

- Scrapes and cuts
- · Strains and sprains
- Broken bones
- · Dislocated joints


- Bruising
- Concussions and head injuries
- Internal injuries.


Safety tips

SEARCH WARRANT RESULTS IN ARRESTS

On July 18, 2018 at 5:13 P.M., Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP received a complaint regarding a theft of some items from a storage locker located in Spruce Grove, Alberta. The incident occurred sometime within the previous 2 weeks.

Items missing included personal items and five fully restored vintage motorcycles with a value

of approximately \$25,000.00.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HOUSE RCMP RESPOND TO VEHICLE IN THE CLEARWATER RIVER

Nordegg, Alberta – Early morning on July 25, 2018, Rocky Mountain House RCMP responded to an incident where a truck plummeted over an embankment and landed in the Clearwater River. The RCMP, with the assis-

tance of Rocky Mountain House Search and Rescue, Fire Rescue and special tow trucks have all worked together to recover the truck and the deceased driver.

At 2:59 a.m., the RCMP were made aware that the International Emergency Response Coordination Centre had received a call for assistance on Highway 734 at Marker #41. Information received was that the truck with the lone occupant was seen, by witnesses in the area, to leave the roadway.

Given the terrain and the location of the truck, it took almost twelve hours for all agencies to remove the truck from its position in the river. No other vehicles

were involved in the collision.

The investigation continues by the Rocky Mountain House RCMP into the contributing factors of this incident.

The identification of the driver will not be reported on and there are no further updates anticipat-



NEW CENTRALIZED PHONE LINE TO REPORT ABUSE

Albertans can now report abuse and receive support, information and referrals through a new centralized phone line.

If people suspect someone is being abused or neglected, they can get help by calling the Alberta Supports abuse line at 1-855-4HELPAB (4435722).

The phone line includes new staff training and protocols, such as an abuse response procedure to help ensure a coordinated provincial response to callers. All calls will be tracked to ensure Albertans receive the supports they need.

"No one should live in fear or suffer alone. This phone line means Albertans know where to turn to get the help they need. If you know or suspect someone is being abused or neglected but don't know what to do, Alberta Supports can help. This is part of our government's commitment to ensuring the safety and security of individuals who need extra care and support." - Irfan Sabir, Minister of Community and Social Services

A coordinated reporting system to address situations of abuse or neglect was one of the recommendations made in Judge Michele Collinson's report stemming from the Betty Ann Gagnon fatality inquiry.

The phone line and new protocols are designed to ensure Albertans who may be more vulnerable to abuse, such as those who rely on others for daily assistance, special care and access to government services, have the information and support they need, when they need it. Abuse can be physical, emotional, sexual or financial. This includes hitting, threatening, inappropriate touching or theft of funds

The service will be a single point of contact if Albertans are unsure of where to get help. If someone is in immediate danger or facing a significant health or safety risk, contact 911.

"This phone line will increase the protection of Alberta's most vulnerable citizens. Many agencies such as CORE Association have protocols for reporting abuse and neglect, but this direct line will be an open and available resource to the general public when they have observed some form of neglect." - Rita Bessant, executive director, CORE Association

In addition to the new phone line, Community and Social Services staff can address Albertans' questions about abuse. People with concerns can go into any Alberta Supports for assistance.

COMPETITION BUREAU LAUNCHES MARKET STUDY ON BROADBAND

OTTAWA - Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform residents that the Competition Bureau has launched a market study to look into consumer habits in purchasing internet services, with the goal of better understanding the competitive dynamics within the Canadian broadband sector.

The study will explore whether there are ways to foster more competition in this sector, which could lead to more choices and lower prices for Canadians. Specifically, the study will look at whether changes to internet regulations could result in a broader range of service options, encourage more informed consumer choice, and reduce barriers to consumers switching between providers.

"While most Canadians are well-served, many, including those in the rural areas of our Yellowhead riding, do not have access to broadband internet access services that are comparable to those offered to the vast majority of Canadians in terms of speed, capacity, quality and price," stated MP Eglinski.

The study will address four broad themes: the ability of broadband providers to deploy competitive service offers, consumer reactions to new competitive alternatives, the impact of existing regulation on broadband providers, and whether there are lessons to be learned from how other countries manage and regulate broadband competition.

"Ensuring availability of broadband internet access service is a shared responsibility that will only be attained with the help of everyone involved," concluded MP Eglinski.

PEMBINA CRISIS CONNECTION SOCIETY (PCCS) AND THE WORK THAT WE DO TO CREATE A SAFE AND HEALTHY

In December of 1989, Drayton Valley was struck with a murder/suicide tragedy. This tragedy focused renewed interested and concern on the problems of family violence facing this community. The group realized that all aspects of violence, including suicide, needed to be addressed.

The Pembina Crisis Connection Society was established in April 1990 to bring prevention into focus. A telethon scheduled in May 1991 brought the Society to front page headlines when over \$25,000.00 was pledged in six hours! The community support was overwhelming and PCCS was able to achieve its goal of accessing the Distress Line - a 24 Hour crisis line, in Edmonton on July 1, 1991.

Prevention is key

Children who grow up in homes where there is domestic violence are more likely to die by suicide, more likely to abuse drugs or alcohol and more likely to end up in the criminal justice system. There are very real human costs as well as heavy economic and societal costs to allowing violence to continue in a communi-

"The impact of Childhood Domestic Violence can be lifelong in terms of physical and mental health problems, such as anxiety, depression, and traumatic stress, difficulty in relationships with others, academic and employment failures, and trouble parenting." - Dr. Sandra A. 


