### Page 2 Community Voice August 14, 2018 INVESTIGATION INTO SERIOUS INJURY DURING STONY PLAIN VEHICLE STOP


The Alberta Serious Incident Response Team (ASIRT) has been directed to investigate the circumstances surrounding a traffic stop by members of the Stony Plain RCMP that resulted in serious injury to a 29-year-old man.

On Aug. 5, 2018, at approximately 1:46 a.m., officers

stopped a vehicle on Township Rd 232 and Range Rd 280. There were two people in the vehicle. Police identified the passenger, a 29-year-old man, and advised him that he would be detained on outstanding warrants. The man got out of the vehicle and ran into a wooded area north of the vehicle stop location.

The RCMP sent a police dog and a handler to the scene to help find the man. When police located the man, a confrontation occurred. During a struggle with officers, the man sustained dog bite punctures/scratches on his right forearm, cuts or bite marks to the left ear and surrounding area, and a skull fracture with a cut on the left side of his head near the ear.

The man was taken to hospital and needed stitches to the area around his left ear. The skull fracture was deemed minor, the man was medically cleared and released into police custody.

At the time of the stop, the man had outstanding warrants for possession of a weapon for a purpose dangerous to the public peace, possession of a controlled substance, theft under \$5,000, and three counts of failing to appear in court.

ASIRT's investigation will focus on the man's arrest and the circumstances surrounding his serious injury. The RCMP will maintain responsibility over the investigation into the criminal conduct of the occupants of the vehicle.

With the investigation underway, ASIRT will not make any further comment until the matter is concluded.

ASIRT's mandate is to effectively, independently and objectively investigate incidents involving police that have resulted in serious injury or death to any person, as well as serious or sensitive allegations of police misconduct.

A 42 year old male, Jody Peters, from Red Deer was charged with 13 offences including:





### CANADA'S CONSERVATIVES CALL ON TRUDEAU GOVERNMENT TO DEFEND BEEF PRODUCERS

OTTAWA: On August 7, 2018, Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, along with 32 Conservative MPs, wrote to the Finance Minister about the potential impact sanctions or tariffs would have on Canadian beef producers.

"With the escalation of the trade

conflict between Canada and the United States, export industries, such as the beef sector, have become increasingly nervous about what the future holds," stated MP Eglinski. "It is important that we stand up for the 60,000 beef farmers across Canada, 18,000 of which are in Alberta.

The co-signed letter requests that the Liberal government consult the beef industry and prepare a package of broad-based tax cuts and industry supports for the agricultural sector in the event of further retaliatory trade measures that could cause significant damage to Canadian beef producers.

The Conservative Caucus has been touring Canada this summer listening to workers, business leaders and labour groups from across the country about the ongoing trade dispute with the United States and its effects on Canadian families. The beef sector employs more than 60,000 people, and is responsible for \$6.8 billion in sales.

Interested companies can apply to the Mining Industry Human Resources Council, which is a not-for-profit organization that works with stakeholders to identify and address the human resources and labour market challenges facing the Canadian minerals and metals sector.

Applicants must be Canadian-owned small, medium or large companies involved in the mining or mineral exploration sector. Not-for profits and educational institutions can also apply.

Eligible employers will receive up to 70% of an intern's salary (up to \$7,000) for new WIL placements involving under-represented groups (women, immigrants, people with disabilities and first year students). Other placements are eligible to receive 50% of an intern's salary (up to \$5,000).

There is currently no established deadline.

"This is a program that many companies in Yellowhead can take advantage of. I encourage all those who are eligible to fill out an application and invest in a student," concluded MP Eglinski.


