# INVESTIGATION INTO SERIOUS INJURY DURING STONY PLAIN VEHICLE STOP

The Alberta Serious Incident Response Team (ASIRT) has been directed to investigate the circumstances surrounding a traffic stop by members of the Stony Plain RCMP that resulted in serious injury to a 29-year-old man.

On Aug. 5, 2018, at approximately 1:46 a.m., officers stopped a vehicle on Township Rd 232 and Range Rd 280. There were two people in the vehicle. Police identified the passenger, a 29-year-old man, and advised him that he would be detained on outstanding warrants.

# TESTING MAY TEMPORARILY IMPEDE TRAFFIC IN YELLOWHEAD COUNTY

The engineering firm Tetra Tech Canada is conducting pavement strength testing and asphalt core extraction along 10 individual roads in the County over five consecutive days between August 10th – August 20th, 2018.

The purpose of this evaluation is to obtain pavement structure information to assist in the County's pavement management plan.

The strength testing is a stop & go procedure and each test typically take less than 2 minutes per loca-



tion. The work will also consist of extracting 32 asphalt cores with 50 mm diameter throughout the testing zone. Each core will be extracted separately, one at a time, and will require temporary single lane occupancy for about 15 minutes.

Traffic may incur short delays during testing. We apologize for any inconvenience.




# NEW EXHIBIT: WILDFLOWERS OF EVANSBURG

# August 14, 2018 **LETTER TO THE EDITOR: POSSIBLE CLOSURE OF WILDWOOD SCHOOL**

I believe that the time has come when I need to express my personal beliefs as per the matter of education in the East end of Grande Yellowhead School Division. The fact that hundreds of people have signed a petition relating to the possible closure of Wildwood School has prompted me to write.

Wildwood School and I have a long standing relationship. I attended the school for grades one to nine, then 3 years to Evansburg High School and following university I taught at Wildwood School for 33 ½ years... that's more than 40 years in total. With such a record anyone reading this would agree that the closing of Wildwood School would be an especially sad day for me.

So far I have attended three meetings regarding the matter of education in this area. From these meetings I have come away with some basic information. For many years the enrolments at all three schools - Wildwood, Evansview and Grand Trunk High School have been declining. Because of their respective ages all three schools are in need of modernization. I am sure I am correct in stating that more than half of all the students attending all three schools get to school by riding a bus.

It is time to recognize a very important fact of life. The enrolment in this area has dropped to the point where all the students could easily be educated in one school. But a lot of people are of the frame of mind that putting kindergarten to grade twelve in one building is not a good idea. So a very sensible solution would be to have one school for kindergarten to grade six and another one for grades seven to twelve.

I challenge anyone reading this letter to look at a map of the East end of Grande Yellowhead School Division. There is no problem in deciding where all grade seven to grade twelve students would go. They would all attend Grand Trunk High School. For the elementary school it would be most sensible to pick a location that is most central for this part of the division. Unless you are totally blind it is glaringly obvious that Wildwood is the most central location for the elementary school. All kindergarten to grade six students should be bussed to Wildwood School. Since the majority of students already ride the bus it would not take a genius to re-arrange buss routes to make this happen.

Here is where I would like to take a little side trip. For more than 60 years Wildwood area students have attended Grand

Trunk High School and have every year boosted the enrolment of the school. Now, I believe the time has come for the tables to be turned. It is "pav-back" time. Since Wildwood is the most sensible location for the elementary school it is time for Evansburg to boost the enrolment of the centralized school. I repeat: My recommendation for one elementary school in Wildwood is totally visible and sensible. The number of elementary students in the Wildwood area and Evansburg area is not really significantly different. Since the distance from

Wildwood to Evansburg is the same as Evansburg to Wildwood it is really not asking too much to have all the elementary students, including the Evansburg are ones to attend the centralized school in Wildwood. If this was done Wildwood would end up with an elementary school that would be viable for many years and Evansburg would have a junior-senior high school. Thus, both communities would have a school. Isn't this the most sensible solution for both communities?


# CELEBRATE LAKE HEALTH DAY AT SHININGBANK LAKE ON AUGUST 15






# **Investigation Into Serious Injury During Vehicle Stop**

The man got out of the vehicle and ran into a wooded area north of the vehicle stop location.

The RCMP sent a police dog and a handler to the scene to help find the man. When police located the man, a confrontation occurred. During a struggle with officers, the man sustained dog bite punctures/scratches on his right forearm, cuts or bite marks to the left ear and surrounding area, and a skull fracture with a cut on the left side of his head near the ear.

The man was taken to hospital and needed stitches to the area around his left ear. The skull fracture was deemed minor, the man was medically cleared and released into police custody.

At the time of the stop, the man had outstanding warrants for possession of a weapon for a purpose dangerous to the public peace, possession of a controlled substance, theft under \$5,000, and three counts of failing to appear in court.

ASIRT's investigation will focus on the man's arrest and the circumstances surrounding his serious injury. The RCMP will maintain responsibility over the investigation into the criminal conduct of the occupants of the vehicle.

With the investigation underway, ASIRT will not make any further comment until the matter is concluded.

ASIRT's mandate is to effectively,

independently and objectively investigate incidents involving police that have resulted in serious injury or death to any person, as well as serious or sensitive allegations of police misconduct.


