ATTEMPTED MURDER CHARGES

County of Barrhead, Alberta – The Barrhead RCMP have made an arrest and laid an attempted murder charge following a serious incident which occurred on November 28 in the early morning.

At 7:42 a.m., RCMP respond-

ed to a complaint of a pickup truck on fire at the Tiger Lily Dump. The male driver of the truck was on scene and was fortunately uninjured. Investigation revealed that he was allegedly assaulted and gas was poured on both his truck and his person before the truck was lit on fire.

The RCMP Major Crimes Unit, the Interview Assistance Team and Forensic Identification Section all provided assistance in the investigation.

Two suspects were located and arrested without incident.

34-year-old Chastity Willie Belcourt has been charged with attempted murder, assault with weapon and uttering threats against a person.

WHITECOURT RCMP INVESTIGATES DRUG TRAFFICKING – SEARCH EXECUTED AND TWO ARRESTED

On November 30, 2018, Whitecourt RCMP General Investigations section, with the assistance of the Whitecourt RCMP Detachment as well as the KDIV Police Dog Service Unit simultaneously executed 2 Controlled Drugs and Substances Act search warrants at 2 separate residences in Whitecourt. As a result, a significant amount of drugs, various drug paraphernalia and weapons were seized.

During the execution of the search warrant, approximately

\$21,000 cash was seized as well as the following controlled substances:

• 14 ounces Cocaine - Street Value: \$40, 0000

• 56 grams powder Ecstasy -Street Value: \$4, 480



31-year-old Harley Rudolf Horn has been charged with attempted murder, arson, assault with a weapon, dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, failure to stop or remain at the scene of a collision and uttering threats against a person.

Both subjects remain in custody and are scheduled for court in Barrhead on December 11, 2018.

The RCMP do not believe that this was a random event, and public safety was not at risk.





Principal Wyman shares that Hero also presents students with "an opportunity to learn about empathy, caring for others and how to care for an animal."

The school is very excited to have Hero join the team. Hero's primary handler will be Grade 5 teacher, Anna Secord. All students will have access to Hero who will work primarily Ms. Secord's classroom for now, so that he and Ms. Secord can learn about one another.



FIRE PERMIT SEASON IN EFFECT YEAR-ROUND

Lac Ste. Anne County's fire season begins March first annually. On January 13, 2011, the County enacted a year-round permitting system. This means that AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR a Fire Permit must be obtained from your local Fire Guardian for ANY BURNING you would like to do.

Please note that Fire Permits will not be issued for existing fires nor for ground fires; therefore, any existing fires must be extinguished immediately. Also, a Fireworks Permit must be obtained prior to setting off any fireworks within the County at any time.

****A FIRE PERMIT OR** FIREWORKS PERMIT MUST BE OBTAINED AT **ANY TIME OF THE YEAR****

It is unlawful to burn without a Fire Permit and you may be fined as per the County's Fire Bylaw. It is also unlawful to set off Fireworks without a Fireworks Permit and you may be fined as per the County's Fireworks Bylaw. (These Bylaws may be viewed on the County's website at LSAC.ca.) Fire and Fireworks Permits are FREE, so your cooperation in this regard is greatly appreciated.

Residents interested in obtaining Forest & Prairie (Wildfire) Insurance should contact their insurance agent, as a number of insurance companies and brokers offer this type of insurance coverage as an

add-on to existing farm/house policies. If there is a fire on your property and Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services provides fire suppression, the County may invoice the land owners for those costs. Please call the Fire Services Department should you have any questions regarding fire insurance or billing for fire suppression costs at 780.785.3411 / 1.866.880.5722.

To obtain a Fire or Fireworks Permit, please contact the Fire Guardian in your Division, listed below, or call the County Office at 780.785.3411 / 1.866.880.5722. We encourage you to work with the Fire Guardian for pre-planning of your burning, such as pile sizes, location of piles, weather concerns, and necessary equipment to have on hand.

NOTE: Fire Guardians will respond within 24 hours to make arrangement for issuing a Fire Permit, so please plan your burning with this in mind.

Anyone who is a property owner and resides within the Lac Ste. Anne County and requires the services of the County Public Works Department to clear the snow in their driveway must purchase a snowplow flag in advance at various outlets throughout the County.

The charge is \$25.00 per flag, per clearing. This means one (1) flag will be used each time



be requested through the Public Works Department at the County office and will be charged at a rate of \$80.00 per hour with a minimum charge of one (1) hour. Please note that your approach and driveway must be a minimum of 22 feet wide, with no obstacles and have a clearance of 18 feet high, with no overhanging trees or wires, otherwise the County grader(s) will NOT clear






