

FATAL COLLISION

On November 22, 2018 at approximately 4:00 p.m. Stony Plain RCMP along with Emergency Services responded to a two vehicle collision on Highway 43 and the intersection of Range Road 32 near the community of

Gunn. A silver SUV pulled out onto Hwy 43 from Range Road 32 heading northbound and was struck by a blue car travelling eastbound on Hwy 43.

Tragically, the 61 year old lone male occupant from Edmonton, Alberta, driver of the silver SUV, was pronounced deceased at the scene

The driver of the blue car, a 19 year old female from the Peace River Regional District of British Columbia, was transported to hospital by ambulance.

The RCMP Collision Analyst attended the scene. The collision remains under investigation. The name of the deceased male will not be released.



PARLIAMENT UPDATE **WEEK OF NOVEMBER 26, 2018**

On Monday, I spent the day in Leeds-Grenville, meeting with local business leaders and assisting the new candidate in the area, Michael Barrett.

On Tuesday, in the Standing Committee on Public Safety and National Security (SECU), we continued the study on Bill C-83, An Act to amend the Corrections and Conditional Release Act.

On Wednesday, I attended a luncheon featuring a keynote address by Premier Rachel Notley. She spoke of the challenges facing Alberta's energy industry and explained why

every Canadian, whether they work in energy or not, has a direct stake in Alberta's success. Later that evening, I asked a question during the Emergency Debate on Canada's Oil and Gas Sector in relation to the jobs losses in Alberta.

On Thursday, I attended the Transportation Committee meeting in the morning and the Public Safety and National Security (SECU) in the afternoon where we went through Bill C-83, clause-by-clause well into the www.ourcommons.ca/ evening. Committees/en/SECU.


