OJSH SUPPORTS CHRISTMAS CHARITIES

This year, the students at OJSH



are helping others by organizing and participating in a variety of charities that will help in Third World countries as well as locally. OJSH is a "Webs of Support" school. Staff and students create emotional support webs that uplift, encourage and anchor others so that those who are webbed-up have a better chance of living a positive life. Our school has taken that philosophy one step further: OJSH wanted to help to thicken webs for people in Third World countries and, at the same time, make gift giving easier for the school community. OJSH merchandise customized with individual's names, family photos, or other personal graphics were made available for purchase on a school -based web site until December 7th. Not only would the student or staff member have a great gift for someone, the proceeds from the giftware sales were allocated to World Vision, an organization that buys goats, chicken and other livestock for Third World people to help them thrive and improve their standard of living.

During the first week of December, the OJSH Student Council, under the direction of Principal Lobo and E.A. Ray Huxley, held a Mitten, Sock and Hat Drive for those less fortunate. Students and staff were encouraged to donate new mittens, gloves, hats, toques, and socks throughout the week. Donated items were collected in a decorated Christmas box in the front foyer. At the end of the week, Mr. Huxley gathered all the donated items and delivered them to Pastor Rick Foster. The Student Council has also planned

an exciting activity week for the days leading up to the Christmas break. Of particular importance is the Student Council's annual food bank initiative. Each day, Monday through Thursday, students and staff are being asked to bring a food item. For example, on Monday, December 17th, people are asked to bring canned items and jars; on Tuesday, boxed or bagged items are requested. On Wednesday, December 19th, toiletries are being asked for and on Thursday, it is the giver's choice to bring whatever they can. On the last day of school before Christmas holidays, the Onoway Food Bank will come to the school and pick up the items.

The high school Cosmetology students under the guidance of Mrs. Villneff are once again holding the very popular Christmas manicures for charity. The manicures will be done by our talented cosmetology students for a very reasonable price of \$5.00 for regular polish and \$10.00 for gel. Nail customers must make appointments at lunch-time for their very special manicures that will take place from December 10th to 20th during Block 2 and the noon break. All proceeds from this fun event will go to Santa's Helpers Onoway.

Teaching and modelling 'giving' to our students empowers them: giving encourages conversations about what is important in our lives and what is the right thing to do. And of course, by giving, students see that they can make a difference and provide some relief to others from poverty, struggling and suffering.

2018 is coming to an end and it's been quite the year in our Village. Recently there was a fire at the Alberta Beach Post Office, our Fire Department (Onoway Regional Fire Services / Northwest Fire & Rescue) received the page out at 2:17 a.m. and were on scene at 2:21 a.m., 4 minute response time which is awesome. They were able to save the building, all the mail and packages were salvaged or protected in place and no injuries were reported (public or firefighters) great job! Unfortunately our busy little post office is temporarily closed and all our mail and packages will be temporarily re-routed to the Onoway post office, until a permanent solution is found. We will try to keep you informed as we receive updates from Canada Post.

I would also like to announce, this month we came to an agreement with Lac Ste. Anne County, they have implemented a process where both fire services (Lac Ste. Anne County Fire and Onoway Regional Fire Rescue) will be paged out simultaneously to all motor vehicle accidents on all local highways. This addresses the immediate concern of getting emergency response to a scene as quickly as possible and saving lives. Thank you to Reeve Blakeman, his council and county staff as well as Onoway Regional Fire Services for working with us and implementing this service.

This past spring everyone noticed the frost heaves in our roads and alleys, we were not alone in this, as it was a common occurrence through — out the province. Our contractors were able to do repairs to a few of the worst roads and have committed

to return in June, once the roads bans are lifted to continue repairs and paving. Thank you for your patience.

We must give a big shout out to our Deputy Mayor Angela Duncan, who was elected as Director; Villages West on the AUMA Executive Board her term on this board will run 2018 – 2020. Congratulations Angela, your seat on this board will give our Village much needed exposure on the Provincial stage.

Alberta Beach also has a new Public Works Manager, Harold (Happy) Johnson. I would like to thank Jason Madge for filling in as the Public Works Manager and helping us in our search for a new manager. Contact information for our Public Works Department is 780-924-3322.

We Thank you for your service.

Council and Staff also showed support for Family Violence Prevention Month by wearing purple ribbons to bring awareness to the cause. The biggest issue that many are still awaiting resolution on the new provincial funding formula which will replace the MSI funding for Municipalities.



We were also fortunate to have a representative from STARS Al-



berta attend our last meeting to update Council and Administration on the initiatives being taken on by STARS along with the total amount of STARS responses within Lac Ste. Anne County (including all Summer Villages and Towns) for 2018 which was 29. This is a vital service to our residents we are very lucky to have this caliber of care available in our area, so please if you have the opportunity to donate to this worthwhile cause, do.

ALBERTA RCMP RECOVER LARGE QUANTITY OF EXPLOSIVES. REMEMBER, DON'T TOUCH!

Edmonton - Explosives and detonators that are not disposed of properly are extremely dangerous and surprisingly common on Alberta properties. Historic rules gave Alberta farmers easy access to dynamite and as a result there is a large quantity of explosives that remain forgotten on properties.

From November 2017 to October 2018 the RCMP Explosives Disposal Unit (EDU) recovered a substantial amount of commercial explosives:

- 25 kilograms of Geogel
- 205 sticks of dynamite
- eight slurry explosives
- 233 detonators
- 2½ rolls (approximately 750 metres long) of detonator cord
- one bag of cordite (from Second World War)

"Please remember that no matter how old an explosive is, it is still extremely dangerous," says Cpl. Paul Zanon. "We want Albertans to be safe and the safest thing to do is to call us."

Anyone who finds explosives or detonators should contact their local police immediately. Citizens are reminded not to move or touch explosives and providing a picture and an approximate age is helpful. RCMP EDU is trained to safely dispose of explosives and detonators and there is no cost to the public for this service.

STRUCTURE FIRE IN THE VILLAGE OF ALBERTA BEACH

Alberta Beach, AB – December 5, 2018

At 0217 this morning North West Fire Rescue – Onoway was paged to a structure fire at 4715 47 Street, Alberta Beach (the Post Office building). At 0219 North West Fire – Onoway paged out its mutual aid partners from Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Service for back-up. At 0220

North West Fire Rescue – Onoway was rolling with its first two units.

At 0221 North West Fire – Onoway crews noted smoke exiting the roof vents. After a quick size-up, interior operations begun with the "All Clear" being called shortly thereafter. By 0244 the fire had been contained, power and gas shut off, and mutual aid units were stood down before arrival. At 0310 a secondary search had been completed further confirming no casualties while ambitious efforts

to salvage and protect letters, packages, and gifts was well underway.

Significant smoke damage and fire extension was rooted-out over the next few ours until the Office of the Fire Commissioner representative assumed command of the scene for investigations purposes at 0710 this morning. Crews assisted with the investigation until released at 0848.

The building is intact, Canada Post's mail was protected, and no one was injured. North West Fire Rescue — Onoway would like to thank Lac Ste Anne County Fire Services for being willing to help and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Fortis, and the Office of the Fire Commissioner for their on-scene assessment. Please be reminded: do not to overload electrical outlets and ensure all electrical renovations are completed by qualified electricians and under permit.
