From November 2017 to October 2018 the RCMP Explosives Disposal Unit (EDU) recovered a substantial amount of commercial explosives:

- 25 kilograms of Geogel
- 205 sticks of dynamite
- eight slurry explosives
- 233 detonators

- \bullet 2½ rolls (approximately 750 metres long) of detonator cord
- one bag of cordite (from Second World War)

"Please remember that no matter how old an explosive is, it is still extremely dangerous," says Cpl. Paul Zanon. "We want Albertans to be safe and the safest thing to do is to call us." Anyone who finds explosives or detonators should contact their local police immediately. Citizens are reminded not to move or touch explosives and providing a picture and an approximate age is helpful. RCMP EDU is trained to safely dispose of explosives and detonators and there is no cost to the public for this service.

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF DECEMBER 3, 2018

The House of Commons debated the following:

- C-21 An Act to Amend The Customs Act (Senate Amendments)
- C-75 Criminal Code (An Act to amend the Criminal Code, the Youth Criminal Justice Act and other Acts and to make consequential amendments to other Acts) (Third Reading)
- C-84 Criminal Code ((bestiality and animal fighting) (Second Reading)
- C-86 Budget Implementation Act, 2018, No. 2 (Third Reading)

• C-88 – Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act (Second Reading)

- C-90 Appropriation Act No.3, 2018-19 – (Third Reading)
- C-316 Canada Revenue Agency Act (Report Stage)
- C-392 Aeronautics Act (Second Reading)
- C-415 -- An Act to Establish a Procedure For Expunging (Second Reading)
- Motion 151 -- National strategy to combat plastic pollution
- Conservative Opposition Motion The Economy

in debate on C-88, wherein I strongly stressed that the Liberal government should leave the people of northern Canada with their resources and let them be their own environmentalists and stewards of the land.

On Tuesday, I attended an All-Party Renewable Fuels Caucus Breakfast Meeting. That afternoon, in the Standing Committee on Public Safety and National Security (SECU), we continued the study on Motion 167, Rural Crime in Canada and on Thursday, we continued our study on Motion 161, the Record Suspension Program. On Tuesday evening, I attended the All-Party Climate Change meeting.

On Friday, while on House Duty, I asked two questions during debate on C-21.

YELLOWHEAD COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

November 13, 2018

Parkland County/Yellowhead County IDP – A public hearing was held in regards to the adoption of the Parkland County/Yellowhead County Intermunicipal Development Plan (2018). No public presentations were made to council.

Federal and Provincial Fire Service Awards Presentation - Yellowhead County council and Kevin Thompson, Deputy Fire Commissioner, Province of Alberta awarded medals to several members of YCFD. The 30 Year Exemplary Service Medal (Federal) was awarded to Albert Bahri, Director of Protective Services: Thomas Heidler, Division Deputy Chief; John Frank, Firefighter; Jay Lowe, Division Chief; and Alfred Adam, Captain. The 12 Year Emergency Services Medal (Provincial) was awarded to Leslie Schatz, Division Chief and Jeremy Clark, Captain.

Evergreens Foundation Consolidates with Pembina Housing Authority – Council acknowledged that they are aware of the decision by the Evergreens Foundation to consolidate with the Pembina Housing Authority and that the Evergreens Foundation will be incorporating 51 additional housing units into their operations with no impact to the municipal requisition.

Portion of Mountain Road Closure – Council gave second and third reading to Bylaw 13.18 to close all of Mountain Road that lies within the SE 15 and NE 10-50-27-W5M. The landowner wishes to close the undeveloped road plan and consolidate with an adjacent parcel.

November 27, 2018

Baseline Road Construction Land Expropriation – To complete the Baseline Road reconstruction project, additional right-of-way is required to be obtained from a landowner. As administration and the land buyer has exhausted its attempts to contact the land owner, council has moved to support a Notice of Intent to Expropriate. So far, the landowner has not been in contact with the county.

Parkland County/Yellowhead County Intermunicipal Development Plan - County council gave second and third reading to the Parkland County/Yellowhead County Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP), dated October 2018, thereby adopting the plan. Previous public meetings regarding the IDP were well attended. In short, the content of the IDP includes: Land Use Policies, Hamlet Service Area Policies, Transportation and Infrastructure Policies, Economic and Social Development Policies, and Environmental Poli-

Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework Agreement with Parkland County – Council also gave second and third reading to an Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework (ICP) Agreement with Parkland County. In short, the ICP outlines the process of collaboration for both counties, the agreed-upon services to be delivered, and modes of dispute resolution.

Wildwood Fire Hall and Wildwood, Evansburg Water Tower Demolition – Council approved the addition of \$131,000 from the Emergent Issues Reserve to the 2018 budget to allow for the demolition of the Wildwood Fire Hall and the Wildwood and Evansburg Water Towers in 2018 as opposed to 2018-19. Council has moved to allow all three demolition projects to be carried out December of this year.

The next Council Meeting is on December 11, 2018. The next Governance & Priorities Committee Meeting is on December 18, 2018. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers.

Our next casino is scheduled for the third quarter of 2019. We will need volunteers to step up to help.


