NEW CHARGES IN ANIMAL CRUELTY INVESTIGATION

UPDATE 3

January 10, 2019 - A male previously charged in an animal cruelty investigation has turned himself in and is facing new charges.

Ross Andrew Atkinson (50) of Parkland County has been charged with 60 counts of permitting and/ or causing unnecessary pain, suffering, or injury to animals contrary to section 446(1)(a) of the Criminal Code.

Atkinson was released from custody after a bail hearing to appear in Evansburg Provincial Court on January 14, 2019.

The public is reminded that the RCMP nor the SPCA is soliciting funds, feed, or supports of any kind. The animals involved are in appropriate care and necessary supports are in place.

UPDATE 2

January 9, 2019 - A female previously charged in an animal cruelty investigation is now facing an additional 60 Criminal Code charges as a result of a continuing investigation by Evansburg RCMP.

On January 8, 2019, a collaborative effort involving Evans-

burg RCMP, RCMP Livestock Investigations, Alberta SPCA, Brand Inspectors, Sangudo Veterinary Clinic, Parkland County, and Lac St. Anne County resulted in the removal of a total of 65 horses and 6 dogs from a rural property. The animals were alive but in varied states of health. The animals were taken to appropriate locations for care and medical treatment where required.

Patricia Lynn Moore (48) of Parkland County has been charged with 60 counts of permitting and/or causing unnecessary pain, suffering, or injury to animals contrary to section 446(1)(a) of the Criminal Code.

Moore remains in custody and is due to appear before a Justice by phone in Stony Plain Provincial Court this morning.

Back on December 22nd I posted on Wabamun Village Voices that I would start posting updates on some of the projects that we have been working on, as well as other things that everyone (students, families and community members) can look forward to. I'll be sharing all of the postings with you in the newsletter. You may also choose to check out each of the posts so you can join selected conversations and share as you'd like. I'd like to emphasize that Wabamun School is a proud member of the community of Wabamun, and we look forward to celebrating and promoting the things that make Wabamun an amazing place for people to live and to raise their children!

Basketball, Archery, and more... It's important that students be given the opportunity to grow and develop in a variety of ways including, but not limited to: academically, socially, artistically and athletically. This past fall our volleyball teams provided us with some of the most memorable seasons in school history. The boys captured silver and the girls won gold! That momentum has carried over and we are pleased to announced that we will have a boys team participating in league play (practices start Monday, yes this Monday \square) and their first game is a home game this coming Wednesday. Its not everyday a Planetarium comes to Evansburg, so we might as well make the most of it. I have to admit I'm pretty excited myself. Hope to see everyone there.



Based upon my experience as both a parent and an educator these rates are very reasonable. I'm aware of other programs that are only afterschool care for close to \$500/month.

Several people have approached me about the need for before and after school care in the area. The school has the space, we have a provider and a model (there currently is a program ran by Cindy out of Parkland Village School), and the approval to go ahead from PSD.

What I need to do now if confirm the level of interest. Please add to this thread or message me directly.

Spread the word!

Field Trips - Several students have already had the opportunity to participate in field trips this year including: WE Day (Student Leadership), Alberta Legislature (Grades 6-9), Net Zero House (7-9), Bee Aware (7), University of Alberta Volleyball Games (Volleyball teams), and Cinderella at Horizon Stage (Kindergarten - 3). Between January and June, we have already booked the following: PARTY Program (8 & 9; Feb 5th), Matilda at Citadel Theater (3-9; Feb 27th), Drumheller - Sleeping with the Dinosaurs (3-5; May 1st & 2nd), Swimming Lessons (1-5; May 6th- 10th), and Edmonton Valley Zoo (Kindergarten – 2; June). These educational opportunities, although not necessary, do enhance students learning of the curriculum, and create positive memories that students share with their friends and remember for years to come. Parents do share the cost of these fees, and we are fortunate to have Wabamun School Fundraising Association donate thousands of dollars annually to Wabamun School to help create these opportunities. On a future posting I will be celebrating our volunteers! More great things to come tomorrow!

Brazilian Jiu Jitsu update – I've had a couple of meetings with Rodrigo Resende, and received lots of positive feedback from both interested parents and adults for classes in Wabamun. As such, this will continue to be something we pursue. Fees would be reasonable and Rodrigo is willing to work with families who may need assistance.

What we need is a location where we can setup jiu jitsu mats on a permanent basis. Unfortunately, potential locations, such as Jubilee Hall and Union Hall, wouldn't work because the mats would need to be setup before a class, and removed after. This isn't ideal as the mats are 3'x 6' and made of a dense foam. I do have an area in mind that could serve us well, but do you know of a space that could potentially work? Bathrooms and a potential area to get changed would also be beneficial.

Also a huge thanks to Sarah Nipshank (FCSS) and Shawn Patience (CAO – Village of Wabamun) who have also assisted in trying to make this come to

fruition

Rebranding - Since last year we have been undergoing a thorough rebranding processes as we work towards finding a new school name. Students in the past who have participated on sports teams have gone either by Wabamun Waves or Wabamun Whitecaps. Going forward it's important to note that the new name will be representative of all our students (K-9) in every capacity (classroom, fieldtrips, clubs, teams, etc.), not solely teams. We began reviewing our PRIDE virtues by having the students select the virtues they felt were important for all members of the school community to try to achieve: Perseverance: Being persistent, refusing to stop despite failures, delays and difficulties. Respect: An act of giving particular attention. Integrity: The quality of being honest and fair. Determination: A quality that makes you continue trying to do or achieve something that is difficult. Empathy: The ability to put aside your ego, step into someone else's shoes and experience their emotions. When we do this, we create connection.

Having selected new virtues, we then began this year by searching for a name with the criteria that it could not already be used by another school in the division or area, had to be reflective of the virtues and needed to have a connection to the community of Wabamun. After months of whittling down the list we have arrived at the final two that we are in the

final stage of selecting: Wild or Wolverines. Once we have a final name selected we will have a logo contest and then a graphic designer to refine the final product. From there we will put that new logo on everything and share it with everyone! Pens, stickers, shirts, coffee cups, magnets, etc. The goal will be to continue to create a school community where everyone (students, staff, parents, and community members) feel a part of the school and that we continue to show that we are "The PRIDE of the Community"!

Community Breakfasts & Breakfast Club - We are very fortunate to have breakfast available at the school every day from 8:00-8:30. Colleen Atkinson and her team of volunteers do an amazing job of ensuring that all of our students have the opportunity to get a healthy start to their day. The menu varies daily and includes an amazing variety of delicious and healthy foods. Personally, I'm a big fan of the banana wraps and grilled cheese sandwiches! We have also received several sponsors this year for our (now monthly) Community Breakfasts. Community Breakfast take place in the gymnasium and are open to the public, and bring together the students, staff, parents, and community members. You are invited to our next Community Breakfast on Friday, January 18th starting at 8:00. A huge thank you to our local Servus Credit Union who both sponsored the meal, and will be on site to help serve. See you then!




