SPRUCE GROVE-STONY PLAIN NDP CHOOSES ERIN BABCOCK

Erin Babcock is the Alberta NDP's candidate in Spruce Grove-Stony Plain for the 2019 provincial election.

The resident of Stony Plain, mother of three, and licensed practical nurse has been a champion of healthcare and an advocate for her communities since being elected in 2015.

USE OF MAS SUCCESSFULLY IDENTIFIES IMPAIRED DRIVERS

Stony Plain/Spruce Grove/ Enoch RCMP members have been pulling over people for various traffic offences. However, with the introduction of mandatory alcohol screening, some residents are receiving more

than traffic tickets. Since Dec. 18, 2018, RCMP have made 13 arrests for impaired driving, nine of those arrests are attributed to the new mandatory alcohol screening (MAS) legislation.

The failing drivers have provided breath samples with blood alcohol concentrations ranging from the legal limit of 80

milligrams (mg) of alcohol per 100 millilitres (ml) of blood to 180 mg of alcohol per 100 ml of blood to an extreme case of more than four times the legal limit. In one extreme case, which occurred on Jan. 20, 2019, a female driver was transporting her children.

RCMP INVESTIGATE HIT & RUN

On Jan. 23, 2019 at approximately 10:00 P.M. Stony Plain/ Spruce Grove/Enoch RCMP were advised of a traffic hazard on Hwy 16 in the eastbound lane at the Wabamun overpass. RCMP members arrived on scene and observed what appeared

to be a piece of a crane boom lying in the eastbound lane. It appeared that an oversized load or a load with the crane boom extended struck the underside of the Wabamun overpass. The suspect vehicle did not remain at the scene. The bridge sustained significant damage to the steel girders. There is a crew on scene waiting for a structural integrity

review. The eastbound driving lane of Hwy 16 is closed while crews are working on repairs.

The RCMP were at an unrelated collision in Spruce Grove, Alta. While on scene, RCMP members stopped a female driver as a result of a traffic infraction. There was no suspicion of impairment. A MAS test was administered and the female driver failed the test. She later provided breath samples that were more

than four times the legal limit.

"The brief delay experienced by those legally using our roads will be their contribution to saving thousands of lives in Canada every year," stated Inspector Mike Lokken. "Members are reporting favorable comments from residents during our continuing check stops. Our goal is to detect impaired drivers, get these drivers off of our roads and keep our community safe."

I have travelled through areas such as Israel, Jordan, Vietnam, Cambodia, Central America (Costa Rica, Panama, Honduras), the United Kingdom (England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales) and Europe (Holland, Germany, Italy, Switzerland, France, down to Greece, through the Mediterranean Sea and all the islands within, including Turkey).

WABAMUN LAKE PROPOSED CAMPGROUND OPPOSED AT HEARING

On January 14, 2019 at 2:00 p.m., Parkland County's Subdivision and Development Appeal Board held a hearing on the appeal, by Samco Developments Ltd., of Parkland County's refusal of a development permit to construct a 328 lot "Destination and Enroute Campground" on a property along the north shore of Wabamun Lake. The hearing was held in the Council Chambers at the Parkland County Centre, 53109A HWY 779, Parkland County, Alberta.

Several groups and individuals opposed to the appeal made presentations at the hearing including the Wabamun Area Stewardship Alliance and the Wabamun Watershed Management Council. Objections to the development focus on the damage the developer has already done on the property and to the lake, and the continuing damage the proposed campground would inflict. This development has impacted an important portion of the lake watershed for more than 7 years. In 2011 Samco Development Ltd. cleared approximately a quarter section of land between Fallis and the former Ernest Poole Scout Camp without any development permit or authorization. The denuding of the land resulted in uncontrolled runoff carrying tons of topsoil and earthen material onto Lakeshore Road, under the CN railroad tracks, and into Wabamun Lake. The ongoing erosion and water drainage continue to negatively affect the

general health of the lake, the habitat of aquatic life and wild-life, the quality of life of the community, the integrity of the road and railbed, and the enjoyment of lake users. All this despite a 2012 Alberta Environment and Parks Enforcement Order (and amendments) (http://bit.ly/2LJuZxW) and a Parkland County 2017 Stop Order (http://bit.ly/2LLvXK9).

The Wabamun Area Stewardship Alliance (WASA) is a committee established in October 2018 to represent a group of more than 350 concerned citizens opposed to the development of the 328 RV lot Ridge Water Resort "Enroute and Destination Campground" on the north shore of Wabamun Lake near the Hamlet of Fallis.

The Wabamun Watershed Management Council (WWMC, www.wwmc.ca) is a not-forprofit society that represents a cross-section of Wabamun Lake stakeholders who are committed to maintaining and improving the health of the lake and its watershed. The council works with governments, organizations, businesses and individuals to inform and educate stakeholders about the biology of the lake and the issues affecting the watershed and lake. It sponsors and coordinates programs and activities that gather information about the biology and use of the watershed and that improve the health and viability of the lake.

SAMCO/RIDGE WATER DEVELOPMENT - A BRIEF HISTORY

(as of January 9, 2019)

- Starting in November of 2011 a large scar appeared on the north shore of Wabamun Lake (SW-13-53-5-W5), between the scout camp and Fallis, upsetting many lake users and residents. Trees and shrubs had been cleared right down to the lakeshore and it was obvious there were no measures taken to control erosion of the topsoil as it entered the lake. (Eroded soil and surface runoff are chief sources of phosphorous, nitrogen and other nutrients that stimulate aquatic plant growth as well as cyanobacteria [blue-green algae] that cause toxic blooms in lakes.)
- Parkland County issued a Stop Order to the property owner, Samco Developments Ltd. on March 5, 2012, as the county had not issued a development permit for the work being done.
- After hearing complaints from the public, Alberta Environment and Sustainable Resource Development (AESRD) inspected the property and on October 17, 2012 issued an Enforcement Order (No. WA-EO-2012/06-CR [https://open.alberta.ca/publications/wa-eo-2012-06-cr-amend-1]) to Samco Developments Ltd. to cease operations and take steps to remediate the damage.
- On June 21, 2012, Parkland County approved a development permit to remove trees, stumps, recontour, grade and fence the property for agricultural purpos-
- In August of 2012, AES-RD assessed the area and determined the erosion was destabilizing the CN railroad that runs in front of the property, creating a potential for derailment. The developer was ordered to cease all activity and AESRD was to be provided with an Erosion Control Prevention Plan as recommended by a surveyor, professional engineer and a geoscientist. The remediation work was to be done by July 31, 2013. CN has repaired the railbed several times.
- AESRD issued three amendments to the 2012 Enforcement Order on October 25, 2013; October 29, 2014 and February 12, 2015 (https://open.alberta.ca/publications/wa-eo-2012-06-cr-amend-1, scroll down). The amendments addressed many deficiencies in the actions and reports submitted by the developer, including the ongoing problem of "earthen materials entering Wabamun Lake," an insufficient

geotechnical report, and lack of sufficient plant cover to reduce erosion, etc.

- On May 7, 2018 Alberta Environment and Parks issued an extensive Amendment 4 to the 2012 Enforcement Order (https://open.alberta.ca/publications/wa-eo-2012-06-cr-amend-1). This amendment included a long list of deficiencies and inadequate reports, followed by orders to comply as directed.
- Tons of earthen materials continue to enter the lake from the property.
- An adjacent property owner complained about flooding

resulting from the work done on the Samco property, where it silted a creek on the owner's property, destroying fish spawning habitat.

- In September of 2018 the developer applied to Parkland County for a development permit to build the Ridge Water Resort and Enroute and Destination Campground on the property, including 328 sites for RVs.
- Parkland County ruled the application incomplete. However, Samco appealed to the county Subdivision and Development Appeal Board (SDAB), claiming the application was complete but

deemed refused. A hearing was set in December of 2018.

• In November, Samco withdrew its appeal and submitted a complete application. The SDAB cancelled the December hearing.

• In early December, the Parkland County Development Authority refused to grant the development permit. Samco appealed the decision to the SDAB and a hearing has been scheduled for 2 p.m. on January 14, 2019 in the Parkland County Council Chambers.
















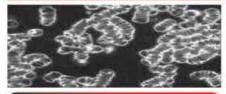
