TIPS TO TACKLE DISTRACTED DRIVING

This winter, Alberta RCMP reminds road users that distracted driving limits a driver's ability to focus on the driving task and road conditions. Distracted driving behaviours include talking on a cell phone, texting, reading

a book, eating, attending to other passengers or pets and personal grooming.

"Alberta Transportation statistics indicate that, between Sep. 1, 2011, when distracted driving legislation was introduced, and March 31, 2018, 97 per cent of distracted driving-related convictions were for using a hand-

held electronic device while driving," says Supt. Rick Gardner, Alberta Sheriffs. "Make sure you always store your phone away from you while driving and be prepared for the unexpected actions of other motorists or poor driving conditions."

THE 2019 CAMP DOWN IS ON

Alberta Parks' online campsite reservations open Feb. 4.

Starting at 9 a.m., campers can log on to reserve.albertaparks.ca to book their group camping areas. Comfort camping reservations open Feb. 11 at 9 a.m., while individual campsite reservations for the May long weekend start Feb. 19.

New this year is Kananaskis backcountry camping reservations which open Feb. 25 at 9 a.m. Combined with additional individual, group and comfort camping options, Alberta Parks is offering more than 650 new online booking options.

"Albertans continue to flock to our online reservation system with their sights set on connecting with the great outdoors and evenings relaxing around the campfire. This year, we're pleased to expand our reservation offering to include Alberta's magnificent backcountry." - Shannon Phillips, Minister of Environment and Parks

Staggered reservation times by region for individual campsites on Feb. 19 are:

- South region at 9 a.m.
- Kananaskis Country at 11 a.m.
- Central region at 1 p.m.
- Northwest/east regions at 3 p.m.

Reservations made for individual campsites are 90 days out from the booking date.

In 2018, the reservation system processed 164,101 individual campsites, 3,251 group camping areas and 3,638 comfort camping units. The 2018 total exceeded the previous year's online reservation tally of 163,780 and set a new record for annual bookings.

In the fiscal 2018-19 year, government is investing \$38 million in provincial park upgrades, expansions and modernizations as part of its \$239-million, five-year commitment under Budget 2016. Improvements to the provincial parks system include access for persons with disabilities, new and improved boat launches, facility upgrades and maintenance to popular amenities like picnic tables, fire pits and washrooms.

Quick facts

- The RAP system added seven campgrounds combining 457 indi-

vidual sites, five comfort camping units, eight new group camping areas and 17 backcountry campgrounds with 206 (permit) sites this year.

- Backcountry reservations are campground-specific only, not site-specific, meaning people who book into the campgrounds can select a vacant site upon arrival.

- Comfort camping units are shelters that come in a variety of styles, such as a yurt or canvas-wall tent, and include amenities like beds, table and chairs,

cookware, utensils and power.

- Alberta's RAP system has nearly 600,000 account users.

- There are about 250 provincial campgrounds with more than 14,000 campsites in the Alberta provincial parks system.

- The RAP system allows online booking for 88 provincial campgrounds (the remaining provincial campgrounds are first come, first served), 162 group camping areas and 64 comfort camping units.

- The online system is mobile-friendly, so people can book

campsites on their mobile devices.

- To make an online reservation, set up an account or update your existing account in advance of the reservation days, visit Reserve.AlbertaParks.ca.

- Camping in Alberta remains an affordable family fun option; there are no new camping-related fee increases in 2019. Alberta Parks last introduced minor fee increases in 2016.

- Revenue generated from camping fees is invested back into Alberta Parks.

Alberta RCMP Integrated Traffic Units issued 4,344 distracted driving tickets in 2018. The numbers are still too high," says Supt. Gary Graham, Alberta RCMP Traffic Services. "Traffic safety is a shared responsibility. Distracted driving behaviours increase driver errors and, as a result, the likelihood of collisions. Distracted driving puts your safety and the safety of other road users at risk."

Alberta RCMP encourages you to practice the following #TrafficSafety tips:

- Drive for the weather. Winter in Alberta means icy roads, reduced visibility, and limited daylight.
- Drivers are urged to slow down and give the vehicle in front of them more space.
- Leave early for extra travel time. Know the itinerary and do not attempt to read a map while driving.
- Make sure children are comfortable and properly

buckled up before leaving. Prepare safe activities for the trip so they don't get restless.

- For the safety of both pets and road users, it is best if pets are secured in an appropriate pet carrier.
- Finish grooming before leaving home. Do not comb your hair, shave or apply makeup while driving.
- Pre-set the temperature, radio or CD player. Do not make adjustments unless the vehicle is stopped.
- If you have to make a

call, eat, read, take notes or engage in another distracting activity, make sure you pull over to do it safely.

The Alberta RCMP will continue to work with Alberta Sheriffs and other law enforcement and safety partners to tackle distracted driving, ensure Albertans make the right driving decisions and reduce the number of collisions in the province. RCMP ARREST SUSPECTS FOR BREAK AND ENTER, WEAPONS OFFENCES

On February 2, 2019 at approximately 04:18 a.m. Leduc RCMP responded to a break and enter in progress where the homeowners found two males in their garage. The males were carrying a long gun. A confrontation ensued and both homeowners were bear sprayed. Both homeowners were assessed by EMS.

The two suspects fled on foot, but Police quickly attended and

with the assistance of RCMP Police Dog Service, both suspects were taken into custody.

Both male suspects, an adult and a young person, are facing multiple charges related to weapons, break and enter and other Criminal Code offences.

The adult was released on previous charges and bound by two Undertakings with conditions.

The young person was released on previous charges and bound by a Recognizance with multiple

conditions and three Probation Orders.

It is believed that the two males were involved in a series of break and enters in three jurisdictions.

“The homeowner contacted police right away,” says Cst. Cherilee SMITH, Leduc RCMP. “Their quick action allowed us to respond and arrest the suspects before they were able to flee the area or commit further offences.”

CONSULTATIONS ON AIR PASSENGER PROTECTION REGULATIONS

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to advise that the Canadian Transportation Agency's proposed air passenger protection regulations will be published in the Canada Gazette Part I for public comment this weekend.

The Transportation Modernization Act mandated the Agency to develop regulations for air travellers that would be

clear, consistent, transparent and fair. After months of public and stakeholder consultations, Canadians will have 60 days to comment.

Air passengers who are bumped from overbooked flights or forced to sit through long delays could receive up to \$2,400 in compensation -- under proposed regulations for the government's long-promised Passenger Bill of Rights.

Draft regulations, which will apply to all flights to and from Canada, and those within Cana-

da include:

- Airlines would be required to provide passengers with food, drink and free Wi-Fi after delays of two hours, and accommodation if the delay stretches overnight.

- Compensation of up to \$1,000 for lengthy flight delays and cancellations. This will vary depending on the length of delay and the cause and whether it was in the airline's control.

- Compensation of up to \$2,400 if a passenger is denied boarding and is delayed reaching their

destination because an airline overbooked the flight.

The final regulations will be published in Part II of the Canada Gazette. Regulations are expected to come into force next summer.

Upon my return to the riding on December 15th, I spent most of the month in meetings with constituents and organizations to discuss various issues such as the Trans Mountain Pipeline, CN, Mountain Pine Beetle...

On the 17th I was in the riding office and on the 18th I met with constituents in Rocky Mountain House.

On the 19th I drove to Edmonton to attend an oil and gas rally with our Conservative leader, Andrew Scheer and the next day I met with Westmoreland Coal before returning to Edson.

On December 21st I hosted an Open House – Christmas gathering in my Edson office.

Slightly before or after peak season may still be fine, but ensure that vendors will be available and look into weather trends carefully before choosing a date.

CALL FOR COMMENTS

-- DRAFT TAX LEGISLATIVE PROPOSALS REGARDING SALARY OVERPAYMENTS, INCLUDING PHOENIX PAY SYSTEM

Submitted by Jim Eglinski, MP – Yellowhead

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to advise constituents that the Department of Finance is releasing draft legislative proposals that would—under certain conditions—permit an affected employee to repay to their employer only the net amount of the overpayment received in a previous year, rather than the gross amount (including taxes, CPP, and EI).

Under the proposed legislation:

*The CRA would be able to refund directly to the employer the income tax, CPP, and EI withheld on an overpayment that occurred through a system, administrative, or clerical error.

*Effectively extend the existing rules for overpayments repaid within the same year to overpayments repaid within three calendar years after that year (or where arrangements have been made within that three-year period to make such a repayment).

*Public and private sector em-

ployers could elect to apply these new rules for any overpayment paid after 2015 due to a system, administrative, or clerical error, as long as they have not previously issued a T4 correcting for this overpayment.

For these new rules to apply, the employee must have repaid their employer (or made arrangements to repay) within three years following the end of the year in which the overpayment took place. Where these conditions are not met, the current rules would continue to apply.

Canadians are invited to provide comments on the draft legislative proposals by February 15, 2019.
