WHITECOURT TOWN COUNCIL

APRIL 13, 2019

Whitecourt Town Council approved the 2019 final budget at the April 8 Regular Meeting of Council. For details on the budget please refer to the separate press release dated April 13, 2019 that can be found on the Town's website at www.whitecourt.ca. The Tax Rate Bylaw will be reviewed by Council at the April 22, 2019 Regular Meeting of Council.

Town Council received an overview of 2018 assessment figures by the municipal assessor. The valuation date for 2019 taxation of properties is July 1, 2018.

- · Assessment values for single family homes have decreased approximately 2.8% in the valley area, and 2.5% in the hilltop area. The average house value in Whitecourt is \$340,000.
- Property owners can view the assessment report for their property online. Visit the Whitecourt website at www.whitecourt.ca/ Services/Taxes-Assessment and follow the link and instructions to view assessment reports.
- Property owners will receive a combined assessment and tax notice in mid-May.

The design-build contract for the Scott Safety Centre Expansion project has been awarded to Brenex Building Corporate Ltd. The project involves an extension to the facility to provide an exclusive dressing room area for the Whitecourt Wolverines Junior A Hockey Club, and to free up much needed dressing room space for other facility user groups and Town operations. The project is a partnership endeavor with the Stark Sports Society, and is valued at \$800,000. Details on the construction schedule will be released when confirmed.

The Town of Whitecourt annually prepares a Collision Report that assists in identifying traffic trends and areas that require attention in order to enhance public and traffic safety. Overall, there were 232 reported collisions in 2018, compared to 209 in 2017. Collision trends have stayed the same over the years, with the majority of collisions occurring in private parking lots

and along local public streets. The Town of Whitecourt will continue to monitor collision data to ensure the safe flow of pedestrian and vehicle traffic. Council has forwarded the report to the Protective Services Committee for review, as well as Alberta Transportation as information.

Council has awarded Community Clean Up Program funds to five local non-profit groups, sports and community organizations for cleaning up roadsides, playgrounds, and sports fields. The program provides each group with \$1,000 for 100 hours of clean up undertaken. The following groups have been approved for funding:

- 2019 Relay for Life Anchor
 - ECHO Society;

- Saint Patrick's Anglican Church;
- Colour Me Worthy Wellness Foundation;
- 2716 Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps.

Letter to the EDITOR

MUNICIPALLY CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS

The County is proposing to create 2 M.C.C.s (Municipally Controlled Corporations), One to finance a new \$1 million clinic to replace the existing one and other to "develop" anything that Council "deems" to be to the benefit of the County and the

taxpayers, but the people paying the bills wont get a chance to object.

The fact that the present clinic – which was started with tax payers money – finally made a "small profit" does NOT mean that a new (#1 million) building

will. But its amazing how confident people become in their entrepreneurial skills when they're using other peoples' money. There are two fairly new buildings on main street Onoway that are partially empty (use those first to see what demand there is for additional services and build a business case to justify it). Council has so far refused to release any information regarding the location or constructions of the building and are rushing to get the project underway before taxpayers have time to even think about the consequences.

According to Municipal Affairs, the M.C.C.'s proposed by the Council will be legally independent corporations with the ability to borrow as much money as they please (subject to someone being willing to lend it) and the taxpayers have no recourse, no way to stop that, and, because they are owned by the County, will have to pay any debts if they don't cover their own costs.

Council has arranged a public meeting for May 1st – AFTER the deadline for a petition to be presented – all of fifteen minutes for public input on each of the two M.C.C. proposals but have released so little information that it would be almost impossible for most of us to ask relevant questions.

If this feels like the new Council (who said they would be better) is acting like the last council, just remember that four of the present Councilors are hold-overs from the last Council and Administration is (basically) the same as well.

GLFER'S GUIDE

TIPS FOR NEWCOMERS TO THE GAME OF GOLF

Few hobbies can be as enjoyable one moment and as frustrating the next as golf. Golfers know a great putt can be quickly followed by a bad tee shot, and maintaining their composure through the highs and lows of the game is a key to success on the links.

Maintaining that composure isn't always easy, even for the professionals. It's even more difficult for beginners, who quickly learn the game of golf involves more than just spending sunny weekend afternoons on pristine golf courses. In fact, golf can be quite demanding, and beginners would be wise to heed a few tips before hitting the course.

* Don't commit to an expensive set of clubs right off the bat. Golf clubs can be very expensive, so beginners should buy an affordable secondhand set of clubs so they can get the hang of what they like before spending a lot of money. Visit a pro shop and explain that you are just a beginner. The shop will likely make some valuable suggestions and might even let you try out a pair of clubs. you might frustrate those golfing behind you, learn the fundamentals by taking a few lessons at the driving range. Learn from a professional, who won't offer you any hidden secrets to golfing glory (there aren't any) but will offer sound advice on the game's fundamentals.

* Take the game home with you. Beginners can even take advantage of golf's vast popularity by taking the game home with them. This doesn't mean building a putting green in your backyard. Rather, purchase some instructional DVDs to learn the game during your down time throughout the week. Many golfers don't have time to hit the links during the week, but they do have time to watch some DVDs when they get


home from work. Such instructional DVDs can help you master your grip and stance, which you can then take with you to the course over the weekend.

* Have fun. Golf is a fun game; it just takes time to hone your skills. But even if you aren't ready for the professional tour after your first few rounds, you can still have fun. Don't let some beginner's frustration, which every golfer experiences, ruin the fun of the game. Take note of your surroundings when you hit the links, and appreciate the time you're spending with your group. If the game becomes more a source of frustration than fun, then take a break and put in some more work away from the course, be it at the driving range or studying at home.

HOW TO BRING BENEFICIAL BEES BACK

Bees, birds and butterflies play integral roles in pollinating many of the crops humans rely on for sustenance. The National Pollinator Garden Network, through the National Wildlife Federation. recently launched the Million Pollinator Garden Challenge, an effort to increase the amount of nectar and pollen food sources as the organization aims to reverse the alarming decline of pollinators such as honey bees, native bees and monarch butterflies.

Many people are afraid of bees because of their propensity to sting. Unlike their wasp and yellow-jacket cousins, honeybees and bumblebees are much more docile and content to hop from bloom to bloom without paying humans any mind. The only time such bees may resort to stinging is if someone inadvertently steps on them.

Bees are beneficial for yards. Gardener's Supply Company says one out of every three bites of food humans take depends on a pollinator. That's because about 150 crops grown in the United States depend on pollinators. Even though there are 4,000 species of native or wild bees in the continental United States, many populations are in decline. According to the Pollinator Partnership, various areas of North

America have lost more than 50 percent of their managed honeybee colonies in the past 10 years.

Bringing these important pollinators back will take a little work, but it is possible.

- Plants that offer cover can be attractive to bees that desire a respite from the sun and heat. Coleus and other ground cover offerings can be handy.
- Offer water in shallow dishes, as even bees need a cool drink to stay hydrated.
- Bees like various plants, so plant more than one species. Some plants that bees tend to like include alyssum, aster, geranium, bee balm, poppies, and clover.

- When planting, include some native species.
- Brush piles, dry grasses and dead woods offer nesting areas for bees.
- The Gardener's Supply Company also savs that bees find blue, purple and yellow flowers most appealing. Opt for more of these hues when planning gardens.
- Above all, avoid using pesticides in the yard. Even organic ones can be toxic to bees and other pollinators, and they may contribute to colony collapse disorder.

With these techniques in mind, homeowners can attract more bees to their vards and gardens, which can benefit bees and humans alike.
