## CALL FOR PROPOSALS FOR UNION TRAINING AND INNOVATION PROGRAM

Submitted by Jim Eglinski, MP – Yellowhead

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to advise that Employment and Social Development Canada has launched a call for proposals for the Investments in the Training Equipment stream of the Union Training and Innovation Program. Approximately \$10 million is being invested.

The Program has two streams, is open to all unions, including those that do not provide training recognized by provinces and territories as technical apprenticeship training, and those that do not operate training facilities:

•The Investments in Training Equipment stream helps unions purchase new and up-to-date training equipment. Continuous technological change puts pressure on training providers to ensure workers are developing the right skills needed on the job site.

•The Innovation in Apprenticeship stream supports innovative approaches to address challenges limiting apprenticeship outcomes, including barriers to participation and success in the trades for key groups such as women, Indigenous people, newcomers and persons with disabilities. This stream is open to a range of stakeholders and partners, but unions need to be involved, either as the lead or as a partner on projects.

Through the Investments in Training Equipment stream of the Union Training and Innovation Program, successful applicants will receive financial support to purchase up-to-date training equipment and materials, so trades workers can get the skills they need.

The call for proposals closes on May 29, 2019.

"I am encouraging trade unions and training trust funds representing workers in the Red Seal trades in the Yellowhead to apply for funding," concluded MP Eglinski.

In particular, their leadership on the flowering rush infestation on Lake Isle has been instrumental in securing GoA support and grants to help find solutions for the problem.

# PATHWAY TO PERMANENT RESIDENCE FOR CAREGIVERS CLOSES JUNE 4, 2019

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to inform constituents that Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) is launching two new five-year caregiver immigration pilot programs. This will replace expiring and ineffective pilot programs.

The new pilots will allow caregivers to come to Canada together with their family and provide a pathway

to permanent residence.

Under the new pilots, applicants will be assessed for permanent residence criteria before they begin working in Canada. Once the caregiver has their work permit and 2 years of work experience, they will have access to a direct pathway to become a permanent resident.

These pilot programs will replace the Caring for Children and Caring for People with High Medical Needs pilots and include:

•Occupation-specific work per-

mits for caregivers, providing the ability to change jobs quickly when necessary.

•Open work permits for spouses/ common-law partners and study permits for dependent children, to allow the caregiver's family to accompany them to Canada.

The Interim Pathway for Caregivers, which will be open from March 4, 2019, until June 4, 2019.

The Interim Pathway for Caregivers will provide those caregivers an opportunity to stay in Canada permanently.

"Caregivers provide care to families in Canada needing assistance. I encourage caregivers and all those involved with caregivers in the Yellowhead, whether personally or professionally, to let them know," concluded MP Eglinski.

The Interim Pathway for Caregivers was launched as a three-month program on March 4 as a short-term pathway for caregivers, their spouses and their children for the opportunity to become permanent residents. This pathway was launched to help caregivers who have been working in Canada but who haven't qualified for any other current caregiver program.

To apply, a caregiver needs to have:

• a valid work permit (or have applied to extend their work permit or restore their status)

• one year of Canadian work experience as a home childcare provider or home support worker, or a combination of both jobs since November 2014

• a minimum of Canadian Language Benchmark level 5 in reading, writing, listening and speaking in either English or French

• a Canadian high school diploma or a foreign equivalent

If an applicant can't get the results of a language test or Educational Credential Assessment in time before the deadline, they can submit proof they have scheduled a language test and have submitted a request for an assessment.

"I encourage caregivers and all those involved with caregivers in the Yellowhead, whether personally or professionally, to let them know," concluded MP Eglinski.



of the Atlantic.

Later that day, in the Standing Committee on Public Safety and National Security (SECU), we continued hearing from witnesses

on Bill C-93, An Act to provide nocost, expedited record suspensions for simple possession of cannabis.

On Tuesday, I asked a question during the Conservative Opposition Motion on the 'Price of Gas'. Also, on Tuesday, MP Mark Warawa delivered his farewell speech ahead of his retirement.

On Wednesday, in the SECU

Committee, we heard from witnesses on the Subject Matter of Clauses 222 to 224 (Part 4, Division 10) of Bill C-97, An Act to implement certain provisions of the budget tabled in Parliament on March 19, 2019 and other measures.

On Thursday, close to 20,000 people were on Parliament Hill for the National March for Life.

# HOW TREE SERVICES CAN PROTECT YOUR PROPERTY

Cold weather can take its toll on a property, especially in regions of the world where winters are harsh. Most parts of the landscape are vulnerable to damage from winter storms, but trees may be especially susceptible. • Tree services can improve vis-

ibility. Trees that have aged a bit since their last trimming might affect the view of a property from inside a home. Overgrown branches can compromise residents' ability to see and experience the natural beauty just outside their windows. The average homeowner may be able to trim short trees on his or her own, but if views from the second floor of a home or higher have been compromised, it's much safer to call a professional tree service. Such services have the right tools and experienced personnel necessary to safely trim high branches on tall trees.

• Tree services can help prevent future damage. Even if trees made it through a recent winter unscathed, that's no guarantee next winter or even the coming seasons of spring, summer and fall won't ultimately prove their undoing. Travelers Insurance notes that weather-related roof damage, including damage resulting from falling limbs and branches weighed down by snow during the winter months, accounted for more than half of all Travelers property loss claims between 2009 and 2016. According to BNC Insurance and Risk Advisors, homeowners may be liable if a tree they knew posed a threat falls onto a passerby or a neighbor's property and causes damage or injury. Having all trees properly trimmed each year, but especially those that can fall on your home and your neighbors' homes, may prevent future damage and legal issues.

Tree services can ensure trees maintain their awe-inspiring beauty and help homeowners protect their homes and their belongings.

# GET READY: EARLY SPRING LANDSCAPING TIPS

During the cold months of winter, many people stare longingly out of the window dreaming of spring and time spent outdoors. For those with green thumbs, images of tending to the garden and other aspects of their landscapes no doubt dominate such daydreams.

Draw inspiration from those budding crocuses and daffodils pushing through the last remnants of snow and employ these tips to prepare for the upcoming gardening season.

• One of the first steps is to apply a preemergent weed killer to get a head start knocking out weeds that can plague the lawn during the growing season. Killing weeds at the roots early on can mean far fewer has-

sles in spring and summer, and may prevent new generations of weeds from cropping up each year.

- While it may be tempting to take a prematurely warm day as a sign that spring is in full force and purchase a bunch of annuals, it's better to know the last of the possible frost dates (check "The Farmer's Almanac"); otherwise, you may waste time and money planting flowers or vegetables only to have them zapped by another frosty day.
- Amend the soil so that it is the right consistency - just crumbling when lifting it. Soil that is too muddy after spring thaw can harden, making it difficult for plants to flourish later on. Speak with representatives at a local

lawn and garden center about which types of amendments you can add to the soil in your particular area to enrich it.

- Lawn and garden experts at The Home Depot suggest filling in bare patches of lawn now by mixing a few shovelfuls of soil with grass seed. Then apply this patch to the bare areas, water, and continue to care for the area until the spot fills in.
- Spend a day in the garage or shed tending to the lawn mower and other gardening equipment. Clean all tools and ensure that everything works, repairing parts as needed.
- Give outdoor entertaining spaces a good scrubbing, clearing away dirt and grime that may have accumulated over the win-

ter. Use a leaf blower to blow away any leftover leaves.

- Check if the front porch, railings or decking need painting and/or staining. Tackle these projects when the weather is cooler so everything will be ready for those peak spring days.
- Think about any annuals you might want to plant in the land-scape this year that will complement any existing shrubbery or perennials. Come up with a theme so that the entire yard is cohesive.

Before homeowners know it, winter is gone and it is time to once again enjoy long days spent outdoors. Get a jump start on spring lawn prep as soon as you can.



### THESE GOLF TERMS ARE PAR FOR THE COURSE

Golf is a game of sport and skill that can be played at any age. Millions of people in North America participate in golf as a recreational endeavor or a professional pursuit. As of the spring 2016, 25.13 million people in the United States played golf over the previous 12 months, according to Statistica.

People may immediately think Canada's sports-based loyalty favors hockey. However, on the recreational side, golf is king in the country. Canada has the fourth most golf courses of any country in the world, says the National Golf Foundation. Plus, one out of every 10 Canadians play golf - a participation rate that is more than double that of the United States.

Storied golf history

Although golf can be traced back to the Netherlands during

the Middle Ages, many people concur that the modern game of golf - played over 18 holes - is a Scottish invention.

The popularity of the sport began to spread throughout the world from Great Britain. The first permanent golf club in North America was founded in 1873 and was named Canada's Royal Montreal Club. The first 18-hole course in the United States was The Chicago Golf Club.

Golf lingo

Understanding the terminology is key to becoming a full-fledged golf fanatic. While golf lingo is extensive, here is a sampling of some of the more popular terms to get novices started, courtesy of the PGA.

Approach: A shot hit towards the green.

Attack: The relative angle at which the clubhead approaches

the ball at impact.

Backswing: The motion that involves the club and every element of the body in taking the club away from the ball.

Birdie: A score of one under par on a hole.

Bogey: A score of one over par on a hole.

Bunker: A hallow comprised of sand or grass that serves as an obstacle.

Carry: The distance a ball will fly in the air.

Chip: A short approach with a low trajectory.

Chunk: A poor shot caused by hitting the turf.

Divot: The turf displaced when the club strikes the ball.

Downswing: The swing forward from the top of the backswing.

Eagle: A score of two under par on a hole.

Golf range: A facility where people can practice golf swings.

Grip: The positioning of hands on the club.

Hole: A round receptacle on the green that the ball is aimed into.

Lie: As it relates to the golf ball, the position when it has come to rest.

Links: Specific term for a course built on linksland, which is land reclaimed from the ocean.

Mulligan: An extra shot taken

on a poor first shot.


Par: The score an accomplished player is expected to make on a hole, either a three, four or five.

Putt: A shot on the green.

Stance: The position of the feet. Golf terms are as varied as the game itself. Knowing commonly used words and phrases makes for a more intimate understanding of the sport.




