

3, 4) were abducted at a residence and taken in a vehicle.



Amber Alert Issued After Abduction

An AMBER Alert was issued with a description of the alleged abductor, vehicle and child information at approximately 5:00 a.m., based on circumstances surrounding the ongoing investigation.

At approximately 7:00 a.m., Sylvan Lake RCMP attended to a vehicle roadside on Highway 20 north of Sylvan Lake where the mother and three children were located. The children were unharmed but taken to hospital as a precaution. Charmaine Darnel was arrested and taken into police custody. Charges are pending further investigation and additional information will be released when available.

AMBER Alerts are used by police to engage the public in locating an abducted child (or adult with a proven mental or physical disability) who is at risk of harm. The Alberta RCMP would like to thank the member of the public for alerting police after they received the AM-BER Alert that led to a swift resolution to this mornings incident.



Letter to the EDITOR LAC STE ANNE PROPERTY TAXES INCREASED 16 % FROM 2018 TO 2019!!

This huge increase in property taxes is a direct consequence of LSAC Administration and Council hindering commercial and residential development.

Both of these provide tax revenue up to 1000 times greater than farmland.


I'm not advocating converting prime agricultural land into businesses and homes, but LSAC has many parcels of land that are not suitable for agriculture.

Administration and Council have also put an insurmountable barrier to development: a December 2018 policy requires developers pave the County roads to the nearest highway. While Administration and Council might naively believe this will get their roads paved, it actually makes developing in LSAC too costly. Developers will go elsewhere.

LSAC is in a Death Spiral -without changes to allow commercial development, taxes will only go up.

For example, I have been trying to develop steep and rocky land into a back-to-nature campground, where every campsite would have between 0.3 and

1.0 acres. This development would create jobs, support local businesses, diversify Alberta's economy, provide amenities for local homeowners, and increase LSAC's commercial tax base. The tax on this parcel of land



would increase approximately 100-fold over bare land.

Administration and Council were fully supportive of this project until November 2018, when they suddenly killed the project and stopped communicating with me. Details are available at www.NakamunOa-

I have discovered that Administration and Council hinder some developments, while allowing other developments to bypass the mandatory approval process.

(These developers have a friend on Council.) Neither of

these are in the best interests of LSAC.

In the interest of fairness and accountability, the Minister of Municipal Affairs should launch an investigation into the actions of Lac Ste Anne County Administration and Council. **Roy Jensen**

The following was debated in the House:

• Government Business No. 30 --Extension of sitting hours and conduct of extended proceedings

• C-81 (Second Reading) -- Accessible Canada Act

• C-93 (Report Stage - motions in Group No. 1) -- An Act to provide no-cost, expedited record suspensions for simple possession of cannabis

• C-97 (Report Stage - motions in Group No. 1) -- Budget Implementation Act, 2019, No. 1

• C-98 (Second Reading) -- Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act

• C-99 (First Reading) -- Citizenship Act

• C-100 (First Reading) -- Canada-United States-Mexico Agreement Implementation Act

• C-418 (Second Reading) -- Protection of Freedom of Conscience Act

• M-230 — Energy Costs

• S-243 (Second Reading) -- Fairness for All Canadian Taxpayers Act

On Monday, in the Finance Committee, we heard from witnesses during our clause-by-clause consideration of Bill C-97 the Budget Implementation Act. Later, in the Standing Committee on Public Safety and National Security (SECU), we heard from witnesses during our clause-by clause consideration of Bill C-93, An Act to provide no-cost, expedited record suspensions for simple possession of cannabis. That evening, the government adopted the extension of sitting hours and conduct of extended proceedings. The House will sit from 6:30pm to midnight starting on Tuesday, May 28th until summer recess.

On Tuesday, I met with Ukrainian interns (Canada-Ukraine Parliamentary Program (CUPP)), who are volunteering in various MP offices to learn first-hand how our democracy works. During my meeting with them we discussed the role of Parliamentarians, issues presently before the House and much more.

On Wednesday, I attended the TELUS Days of Giving. This is the 14th Anniversary of this event of giving back to the community where we work and live. I assisted with filling the backpacks for a school in my riding. Later that afternoon in the SECU Committee, we heard from witnesses on Cybersecurity in the Financial Sector as a National Economic Security Issue and later from witnesses on Motion 208, Rural Digital Infrastructure. That evening I attended the Wild Game Reception for Retiring MPs hosted by the Conservative Hunting and Angling Caucus (CHAC), where I was presented with an 'Honourary Lifetime Member' certificate.



Get on the ball: Choose the right kind of golf ball for your game. While golf balls all look the same, it's what's inside that determines if it's right for you. Golf balls fall into two categories: distance or control. Distance balls are generally twopiece balls with a large core and a cover. They are harder and better suited for higher handicappers or beginners. Control balls, usually three- or fourpiece balls, are softer and spin more meaning they will land on the green and stop. More skillful players should use these.

Consider the elements: Weather is always a factor in golf and dealing with it must always be considered. For instance, in cold temperatures, the ball will travel shorter distances, so take more club. The opposite is true for warmer temperatures. If you're playing into the wind, swing easy as that will keep the ball from spinning too much and rising up into the breezes. And downwind, make sure to judge the intensity of the breezes so you can choose the proper club. Your ball will roll further than normal on a downwind shot so take that into account.

Putting and chipping is priority: Lots of players like to boom their drives and will spend a lot of time on the range hitting their drivers. But if you want to improve your scores, you should spend more time working on your putting and chipping. Since most average players miss a lot of greens, the best way to save strokes is by chipping it close and making more putts. Focus more on your short game than your drive and you will improve.

Play the 19th hole: Win or lose, there's no better way to celebrate than hitting the 19th hole. Less is often more in golf and the same applies when considering what to eat and drink after a round.
