



AMBER ALERT ISSUED AFTER ABDUCTION

Fox Creek, Alta. – June 1, 2019 at approximately 1:30 a.m., Fox Creek RCMP responded to a report of a child abduction from a residence in Fox Creek.

Preliminary investigation revealed three children (9 months, 3, 4) were abducted at a resi-

dence and taken in a vehicle.

An AMBER Alert was issued with a description of the alleged abductor, vehicle and child information at approximately 5:00 a.m., based on circumstances surrounding the ongoing investigation.

At approximately 7:00 a.m., Sylvan Lake RCMP attended to a vehicle roadside on Highway

20 north of Sylvan Lake where the mother and three children were located. The children were unharmed but taken to hospital as a precaution.

Charmaine Darnel was arrested and taken into police custody. Charges are pending further investigation and additional information will be released when available.

AMBER Alerts are used by police to engage the public in locating an abducted child (or adult with a proven mental or physical disability) who is at risk of harm. The Alberta RCMP would like to thank the member of the public for alerting police after they received the AMBER Alert that led to a swift resolution to this mornings incident.

were generated as high priority or urgent police requests.

COMMUNITY CONNECTOR II NEWS

The name Community Connector was chosen from, Name the Bus Contest Entries, when a new bus was purchased in 2007. Prior to that we were known as

the "Legion Bus". When we purchased our present bus in 2016, we named it the Community Connector II. The bus can carry up to 18 passengers or 4 wheel-chairs and 14 passengers.

Now a bit of history as to how this all started. In the ear-

ly 80's a group started the Wolf Creek Pembina Transportation Society to address the need for transportation for seniors and the disabled. They purchased a used van and provided door to door service in the area from Evansburg to Wolf Creek. The bus was not wheelchair friendly and by the early 90's it was no longer roadworthy. The Society purchased a new wheelchair accessible bus. By 1992 they could not meet their financial obligations, due mostly to the monthly bus payments. They returned the bus to the dealer and dissolved the society. In 1992 ID# 14 and the board of Wolf Creek Pembina Transportation Society approached Wildwood Legion Branch 149 to provide basic transportation for seniors and the disabled. Several buses were used to provide service till 2007. In 2007 a 14 passenger

A Volunteer Committee oversees the day to day operation of the bus, "at arm's length" from the Legion operations. The bus goes to Drayton Valley on Fridays and to the Adult day program at the Health Unit on Wednesdays. Did you know the Community Connector Bus can be chartered for that special trip? Get your group together and we will do our best to accommodate

wheelchair accessible bus was purchased and became the first

Community Connector.

you. The present kilometer rate is .75 cents. (subject to change) Charters pay the kilometer rate plus the driver's wage, hotel room and meals if applicable. Operational Grant funding from Yellowhead County and Parkland County does not cover all the cost of operation. Our goal is to operate on a cost recovery basis and still be able to put money into a capital reserve fund for the next Community Connector III bus.

We will be doing our annual Miette Hot Springs trip later this year. This trip will fill up fast, so call our coordinator Zenobia at 780-727-2207 to book your seat! If we have enough requests, we could arrange a second trip. We will do overnight trips if requested. Do you want to go to on the Stettler train ride? Perhaps you would like to go to the Ukrainian Village or the Valley Zoo or give us a call with your ideas. We want your input and suggestions for social trips, keeping in mind that we like to have a minimum of 14 passengers to make a special trip feasible, to be fair to riders and cost of bus operations. Steering committee members are: Lori Rehn, Charlotte Winters, Zenobia Mocarski, and Terry Randall.

We are honored and privileged to serve the communities in our service area with the Community Connector II Bus. Thank you!

PARLIAMENT UPDATE – WEEK OF MAY 27, 2019

The following was debated in the House:

- Government Business No. 30 -- Extension of sitting hours and conduct of extended proceedings
- C-81 (Second Reading) -- Accessible Canada Act
- C-93 (Report Stage motions in Group No. 1) -- An Act to provide no-cost, expedited record suspensions for simple possession of cannabis
- C-97 (Report Stage motions in Group No. 1) -- Budget Implementation Act, 2019, No. 1
- C-98 (Second Reading) -- Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act
- C-99 (First Reading) -- Citizenship Act
- C-100 (First Reading) -- Canada-United States-Mexico Agreement Implementation Act
- C-418 (Second Reading) --Protection of Freedom of Conscience Act
- M-230 Energy Costs
- S-243 (Second Reading) --Fairness for All Canadian Taxpayers Act

On Monday, in the Finance Committee, we heard from witnesses during our clause-byclause consideration of Bill C-97 the Budget Implementation Act. Later, in the Standing Committee on Public Safety and National Security (SECU), we heard from witnesses during our clause-by clause consideration of Bill C-93, An Act to provide no-cost, expedited record suspensions for simple possession of cannabis. That evening, the government adopted the extension of sitting hours and conduct of extended proceedings. The House will sit from 6:30pm to midnight starting on Tuesday, May 28th until summer recess.

On Tuesday, I met with Ukrainian interns (Canada-Ukraine Parliamentary Program (CUPP)), who are volunteering in various MP offices to learn first-hand how our democracy works. During my meeting with them we discussed the role of Parliamentarians, issues presently before the House and much more.

On Wednesday, I attended the TELUS Days of Giving. This is the 14th Anniversary of this event

of giving back to the community where we work and live. I assisted with filling the backpacks for a school in my riding. Later that afternoon in the SECU Committee, we heard from witnesses on Cybersecurity in the Financial Sector as a National Economic Security Issue and later from witnesses on Motion 208, Rural Digital Infrastructure. That evening I attended the Wild Game Reception for Retiring MPs hosted by the Conservative Hunting and Angling Caucus (CHAC), where I was presented with an 'Honourary Lifetime Member' certificate.

FIVE TOP GOLF TIPS TO HELP BOOST YOUR GAME

(NC) When it comes to golf, it's the little things that can have the biggest impact on your game. Whether it's your first attempt, or 10th season, golf expert Bob Weeks has got you covered at the links this summer with these five tips:

Choose the right clubs: Regardless of your experience or skill level, choosing the right equipment can be the difference between duffing it and striking the ball straight down the fairway. It's important to work with a professional to get the clubs best-suited to your game and then, to have them custom fit. You should be fit for the length, loft, lie angle, shaft flex and even the grip size. If your clubs aren't custom fit, it will be like walking around in shoes that are the wrong size.

Get on the ball: Choose the right kind of golf ball for your game. While golf balls all look the same, it's what's inside that determines if it's right for you. Golf balls fall into two categories: distance or control. Distance balls are generally two-piece balls with a large core and a cover. They are harder and better suited for higher handicappers or beginners. Control balls, usually three- or four-piece balls, are softer and spin more meaning they will land on

the green and stop. More skillful players should use these.

Consider the elements: Weather is always a factor in golf and dealing with it must always be considered. For instance, in cold temperatures, the ball will travel shorter distances, so take more club. The opposite is true for warmer temperatures. If you're playing into the wind, swing easy as that will keep the ball from spinning too much and rising up into the breezes. And downwind, make sure to judge the intensity of the breezes so

you can choose the proper club. Your ball will roll further than normal on a downwind shot so take that into account.

Putting and chipping is priority: Lots of players like to boom their drives and will spend a lot of time on the range hitting their drivers. But if you want to improve your scores, you should spend more time working on your putting and chipping. Since most average players miss a lot of greens, the best way to save strokes is by chipping it close and making more putts. Focus

more on your short game than your drive and you will improve.

Play the 19th hole: Win or lose, there's no better way to celebrate than hitting the 19th hole. Less is often more in golf and the same applies when considering what to eat and drink after a round. Gardening is a rewarding activity that gardening enthusiasts can't wait to get back to once the weather warms up. Many gardeners find getting their hands dirty while tending to a garden can be a great form of escapism. In addition, growing one's own fruits and vegetables can be great for the environment.

Though it's easy to assume gardening is an activity exclusive to homeowners with their own yards, that's not the case at all. Container gardening can make it possible for anyone to garden regardless of where they live.

The benefits of container gardening go beyond making gardening accessible to everyone. Many plants grown in containers are less susceptible to disease than plants grown in the soil, which can reduce reliance on potentially harmful pesticides. Container gardens also tend to be easier to maintain than traditional gardens, making gardening more doable for people with especially hectic schedules.

Container gardening can be simple, and novices can consider these tips when planning and ultimately tending to their first gardens.

• Conduct a light audit. Walk around your home to determine where your plant can be placed so it gets as much light as it needs to thrive. Some plants need a lot of light, while others can thrive with a lot less. By conducting a light audit before choosing plants, you can deter-

mine if your home is most conducive to plants that require a lot of a light or those that need little light to get by.

- Make sure containers have ample drainage. The gardening experts at Good House-keeping note that drainage holes are essential when choosing containers. Waterlogged soil can be fatal for plants, so there must be ample drainage in the container. Don't focus too much on the size of the holes, just make sure that they allow excess water to drain out from the pot.
- Don't forget to feed your plants. Potting soil won't necessarily have nutrients that plants can access, so many container gardeners must fertilize the soil so plants can thrive.

Good Housekeeping notes that watering with diluted fish emulsion, seaweed extract or compost tea can help plants thrive. Feed once every two weeks to start, adjusting the schedule thereafter depending on how the plants respond.

• Seek advice. Local gardening centers can be great resources for novice container gardeners. Such centers can recommend plants with a history of thriving in the area as well as plants that might be more compatible when containers are placed next to one another.

Container gardening can bring gardening to any home, whether it's a light-filled private home or an apartment where sunlight is sparse.

KEEP KIDS SAFE WHEN MOWING THE LAWN

Warm weather beckons many people outdoors. Perhaps no group of people like being out in the warm sun more than children.

Children should be encouraged to spend time outdoors when the weather allows, as physical activity is one of the hallmarks of a healthy lifestyle. But parents must exercise caution when kids are playing in the yard, especially when the grass is being mowed.

According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, more than 9,000 children in the United States go to the emergency room for lawn mower-related injuries every year. Of the 800 children who are run over by mowers each year, 600 ultimately require amputations.

Many mower-related injuries

occur when children who are too young and/or too weak to operate a mower are asked to do so. The AAP recommends that only children age 12 and older operate push mowers, while riding mowers should only be used by kids 16 and older. No child should use a mower without first being taught how to operate it, and kids should always wear eye protection and close-toed shoes when mowing. In addition, parents should never allow children to ride as passengers while mowing the lawn.

Mower-related injuries are preventable if parents emphasize safety. The following are some tips, courtesy of the AAP, that parents can follow to ensure their kids do not become one of the

thousands of children who suffer mower-related injuries in a given year.

- Only use a mower with a control that stops the mower blade from moving if the handle is let go.
- Keep children out of the yard while mowing. Mower blades can shoot rocks, sticks or other common yard debris out in all directions, and these trajectories put kids at risk of injuries to their eyes and other parts of their bodies.
- Scour the yard for toys before mowing. Toys left in the yard can become trajectories if not removed prior to mowing, and chipped toys with sharp edges can pose a threat to kids even after the grass has been cut.

- Exercise caution if going in reverse. The AAP advises against pulling a mower backward or shifting into reverse unless absolutely necessary. If you must do so, look behind you to make sure no kids are trailing you or are nearby.
- Only mow when there is adequate daylight.
- Periodically inspect your mower. Periodic inspections of your mower can help you make sure guards, shields, switches, and other safety devices are in proper working order.

When mowing their lawns, parents must make safety their utmost priority to ensure kids do not suffer mower-related injuries.

2019 YELLOWHEAD COUNTY ROADSIDE VEGETATION MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

(April 24, 2019) – Yellowhead County Agricultural Services Department will be spraying roadsides within the county starting in April and shall continue until mid/late September, depending on weather conditions and length of growing season. Spot herbicide applications and other integrated management practices will be used throughout the County to control weeds and brush species.

Spraying of roadsides is done to control the spread of prohibited noxious and noxious weeds and re-growth of small brush. Most weed species are very prolific seed producers and can produce as many as 300,000 seeds per plant. These seeds can then germinate the following growing season or lay dormant in the soil for a number of years until growing conditions are favorable for germination. Many deep rooted perennials spread via the root system, therefore a single plant left alone can result in a heavy infestation in a relatively short period of time.

Weed infestations can invade and become the dominant plant species on any given parcel of land causing a number of problems such as:

- 1. They limit light and moisture availability to cereal and hay crops thus reducing yields and resulting in dockage
- 2. They pose a serious environmental threat to native vegetation and habitats in sensitive areas because of their competitive nature
- 3. They are expensive to control for adjacent land owners who are subject to their spread
 - 4. They are responsible for live-
