WESTLOCK RCMP ARREST TWO FOLLOWING POLICE CAR RAMMING

Charges have been laid following a violent police car ramming which occurred just after midnight on June 14, 2019.

Investigation following the incident led to the search of the stolen truck. RCMP seized contraband under the controlled drugs and substances act as well as a firearm, ammunition and break-in instruments.

24-year-old Hope Elizabeth Nixon of Spruce Grove is charged criminally with possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000 and fail to comply with the condition of an undertaking/recognizance. She is also facing three charges under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act of possession of methamphetamine, heroin and cocaine.

24-year-old Damian Devon Thomas of Whitecourt is charged with:

- Assault on police officer with a weapon (x2)
- Assault with a weapon (x2)
- Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle
 - Mischief over \$5,000 (x2)
 - Mischief under \$5,000 (x2)
- Unauthorized possession of a firearm
- Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000

PURSUIT WITH STOLEN VEHICLE ENDS IN CHARGES

Whitecourt, Alta. - 28th, 2019 Whitecourt RCMP with the assistance of the Whitecourt Integrated Traffic Unit were advised of a stolen vehicle approaching the area that was taken in an earlier carjacking that lead to a pursuit with RCMP in Valleyview and Fox Creek Detachments.

RCMP members deployed to intercept the vehicle as it approached Whitecourt. The suspect vehicle continued to drive erratically nearly causing collisions with other users of the road. There were multiple reports to police from concerned motorists who described the driving pattern as dangerous. The stolen vehicle was located by members in an unmarked police vehicle shortly thereafter.

A Tire Deflation Device commonly known as a spikebelt was successfully deployed by RCMP. The stolen vehicle continued on rims and with the help of a citizen in a tractor trailer unit the vehicle was forced into the ditch ending the pursuit and concern for public safety on the

highway.

The driver Tyler Daniel Burns (28) of Edmonton was arrested without incident.

Burns is facing the following charges from this incident:

- 1. Flight from a peace officer 320.17 of the Criminal Code
- 2. Dangerous Driving 320.13(1) of the Criminal Code
- 3. Fail to perform physical coordination tests 320.15(1) of the Criminal Code (Impaired Operation by Drug)
- 4. Possession of Stolen Property over \$5000 355(a) of the Criminal Code

5. Fail to comply with Recognizance - 145(3) of the Criminal Code

Burns remains in custody pending a bail hearing at St. Albert Provincial Court on June 3, 2019.

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STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

Did you know that as a high school student at OJSH, you can earn post-secondary credits and credentials? Dual credit programming allows high school students to take post-secondary, college or university courses and earn both high school and post-secondary credits for the same course. Students are able to graduate high school with their Alberta High School Diploma and, in addition can earn post-secondary credentials. The post-secondary courses are free for high school students.

Students spend their days at OJSH taking their regular high school classes such as English Language Arts and Biology but they also take specialized post-secondary courses. Most often, the post-secondary courses comprise half the student's day. Sometimes, the students enrolled

in dual credit must go off campus and travel to another educational institution to take their post-secondary credit courses.

Some of the more popular post-secondary programs that high school students can take are: Health Care Aide Certificate (Norquest College), Power Engineering Class 4 (Northern Lakes College), Oil Field Operator (Northern Lakes College), Service Rig Floor hand Technician in partnership with Northern Lights School Division, Office Professional Certificate (Norquest College), and Harley Davidson Technician (Grande Prairie Regional College / Fairview Campus). Other programs are also available. This year, OJSH will have three high school graduates who will have also earned their Health Care Aide credentials: MJ Wilcox, Natasha Kashman and Treasure Fowler. For the 2019-2020 school year, OJSH will have three students

taking the Educational Assistant program and one taking Oilfield Operator training.

In addition to dual credit programs, there are other exciting off-campus educational opportunities available to OJSH students. Two of the most popular options are RAP (Registered Apprenticeship Program) and the Green Certificate program. As with the dual credit program, RAP students are both full-time students and registered apprentices. Students divide their time between taking classes that will earn them a high school diploma or certificate of achievement and an approved work site. The RAP apprenticeship ends when the RAP apprentice finishes high school. The high school graduate/RAP apprentice is then automatically registered as a regular apprentice and credits earned while in the RAP program are applied to their apprenticeship. This year, graduate Clayton Wiebe – working at Western Star as a RAP student - will achieve his RAP certificate in Mechanics.

Careers Next Generation is another resource that schools can access. Every year OJSH welcomes Careers Next Generation to our school to speak to students about the career opportunities that they can access. Careers Next Generation provides internships, mentoring, camp, tours and workshops so students can explore options beyond the classroom. They can facilitate RAP placements. Although he graduated last year, OJSH student Jacob Tracy registered for school this semester and got a RAP from Careers Next Generation. He is with Utmost Electric in Spruce Grove.

The Green Certificate program uses an apprenticeship style of delivery in which students learn a specialized part of the agricultural industry in the field. Students are paired with knowl-

The program provides students with opportunities to earn a recognized credential leading to a career in agribusiness.

The Green Certificate Program currently consists of eleven specializations: cow calf beef production, dairy production, feedlot beef production, irrigated field crop production, sheep production, swine production, beekeeper production, equine production, greenhouse production and poultry production.

This school year, we had 9 students enrolled in the program, three of whom are graduating and have achieved their Green Certificate. Grade 12 students Bailey Bartel, Santina Bassanese, and Desiree Foster-Kemps have successfully earned their Green Certificates in Equine Production—they are now certified Equine Technicians.

If students want to explore future career choices over the summer, NGPS once again is offering Career Exposure at summer boot camps. Career Exposure boot camps give high school students a 'taste' of possible future

Choose your company carefully: Your playing partners can have a lot to do with how you play and how you socialize on the golf course. If you're out with friends, you can relax and enjoy the day knowing what to expect. But if it's a game with your boss or clients, always make sure to test the waters. Will they play by the rules or is it just a relaxed day? Are your clients there to play golf or do business?

Understanding the landscape on the first tee will alleviate any awkward moments later on.

Create friendly competition: Sure, there's already a scorecard, but you can add more competitive fun to your game by creating a little friendly rivalry. For example, try a little Bingo Bango Bongo - a points based game that awards a total score based on three kinds of achievement: Bingo – first person on the green gets a point; Bango – the player whose ball is closest to the pin

when all balls are on the green gets a point, Bongo –the player who is first to hole out gets a point. Add up the points and the person with the highest total for the round wins.



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WHITECOURT TOWN **COUNCIL UPDATE**

MAY 29, 2019

Whitecourt has received \$100,000 from the Enabling Accessibility Fund Grant to complete the Rotary Park Accessible Pathway Connection Project. The project was identified as a priority for Rotary Park during the development of the Sportsfield Master Plan. The project includes the construction of an accessible pedestrian pathway that will provide spaces for community groups and organizations to set up tents and displays during local events (e.g. Farmers Markets, Party In The Park, Canada Day). The spaces will connect to power; the pathway will include lighting; and charging stations will be installed for mobility devices.

The contract for the 2019 Street Improvement Program has been awarded to E-Construction. The Program includes rehabilitation of roadways and the paved trail network, utility cut restoration work, and the Driveway Replacement Program. Information on the construction schedule and locations will be posted online at www.whitecourt.ca and on



Whitecourt's Facebook page as details are confirmed.

The 2019 20-Year Capital Plan has been adopted. The Plan, which includes 132 projects, provides a vision for the longterm development of Whitecourt's infrastructure; land development; parks and trails; and, building and recreational/cultural facilities to meet the needs of our growing community. The Plan incorporates projects and timelines identified through engineering studies, planning sessions, workshops, budget deliberations, and public engagement activities.

The Vitalization Grant Program assists property owners in the downtown core and along the Highway 43 corridor to upgrade the façade of their building to meet the stone and wood architectural theme of the Whitecourt Vitalization Plan. Since the program's inception, \$142,000 has been allocated to local enhancements projects valued at over \$1.2 million. The following businesses have been awarded funds under the 2019 program:

- CDR Developments Inc. to install cedar accent boards and stone at 4819 50 Avenue.
- · Hendrickson Black Chartered Professional Accountants to install additional stone to the storefront of 5011 50 Avenue.



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
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


















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
