


Oil by Rail cars contract which was made by the previous government. The Motion was defeated so that contract has been scrapped. It felt good to be your voice and to have a place at the table.

ASC FOCUSES ON EMPOWERING SENIORS IN JUNE

Nearly 40 per cent of Albertans age 55+ believe they have been approached with a potentially fraudulent investment.

CALGARY - June 6, 2019 - The Alberta Securities Commission (ASC) has launched a month-long senior outreach campaign across Alberta to recognize Seniors Month (June) and World Elder Abuse Day (June 15, 2019). Nearly 40 per cent of Albertans age 55+ believe they have been approached with a potentially fraudulent investment, as identified in an Investor Index Study commissioned by the ASC. The ASC's campaign is focused on empowering seniors to improve their financial literacy, recognize the signs of investment fraud, empower them to make wise investment decisions and encourage all Albertans to be aware of the signs and symptoms of elder financial abuse. In 2018, the ASC conducted an online quiz targeted towards senior Albertans, the results of which highlighted that over 50 per cent of Albertans 55 years of age and older didn't realize that if they had been a victim of a financial scam, they could be targeted again. This is an example of a "Recovery Room Scam" wherein the original fraudster often sells the victim's information to another scam, who then offers to recover their investment at a price. This may include paying taxes or a service fee, which is simply a fraudulent demand for more money and the victim loses again. It was also found that 61 per cent of respondents would consider an investment opportunity that 'guarantees' a legacy for their family, despite the fact that the promise of a 'guaranteed' return is an indication of a potential fraudulent investment. "Building relationships with seniors' groups is a critical part of our work to help Albertans advance their financial literacy and protect themselves from investment fraud," said Alison Trollope, Director, Communications and Investor Education. "This year, we are continuing to expand our reach, aiming to ensure all Albertans are empowered and have the knowledge to protect their retirement nest egg."

The ASC's 2019 activities aim to connect directly with seniors and their caregivers through a variety of community events, a financial

literacy quiz and seniors resources on Checkfirst.ca/seniors, including the Spot and Stop Seniors Investment Fraud fact sheet. Albertans can test their financial and investment knowledge and check if they are on the right track to protecting their financial future through the ASC's fun and interactive quiz called 'How Safe is Your Nest Egg'. The ASC is also a sponsor of the THIRD ACTion Film Festival in Calgary (June 7 - 9), which is focused on celebrating aging and the accomplishments of older adults to promote elder empowerment and an age-positive culture shift.

Albertans 55 years of age and older and members of seniors groups are encouraged to visit the ASC's

CheckFirst.ca/Seniors website for unbiased investor education information, tools and resources on recognizing and avoiding fraud and how to 'CHECK-PROTECT-INVEST' before investing. Albertans without internet access can call (877) 355-4488 to request printed copies of seniors' materials.

The ASC is the regulatory agency responsible for administering the province's securities laws. It is entrusted with fostering a fair and efficient capital market in Alberta and with protecting investors. As a member of the Canadian Securities Administrators, the ASC works to improve, coordinate and harmonize the regulation of Canada's capital markets.

A MESSAGE FROM MLA MARK SMITH: TRANS MOUNTAIN PIPELINE ANNOUNCEMENT

Mountain pipeline expansion.
Albertans appreciate the second
Federal government approval of
this project but clearly this only
one more step in a process that
has already gone on for way
too long. This approval is not
construction of the pipeline and
Albertans have spoken plainly
that they will not be satisfied

until this pipeline, and others, are built and the oil is flowing to tidewater and international markets!

The completion of the Trans Mountain pipeline is crucial to the Alberta economy. pletion of Trans Mountain will triple the amount of product we are presently delivering to Pacific tidewater. It is only then that Alberta will see any significant movement towards receiving fair market value for our energy resources. With a \$60 billion dollar debt only a creative and efficient use of existing tax dollars and the revitalizing of the Alberta economy will the government eventually be able to have the finances to help provide the services to help those who cannot help themselves or provide the education and health care that Albertan's both deserve and want.

This is a step forward but we should not celebrate until is oil is flowing through the pipeline. It must also be understood that it is in Alberta's interests and all Canadians interests that more than one pipeline must be completed. Not only must we look towards a northern pipeline to the BC coast but we need a pipeline to Atlantic Canada. This decision will not stop the importation of foreign oil from being shipped half way around the world to markets in Central and Maritime Canada when Alberta oil and natural gas should be meeting the needs of Canadians and Canadian markets.

This is an important step forward but we must temper our enthusiasm with some political reality. This announcement is not going to deter the US funded, radical environmentalists across this country, but especially in BC, from trying to stop the progress of the Trans Mountain pipeline. This Federal decision is not going to magically change the position of the BC government nor will it stop the ill-advised actions of the Federal government as it looks like it will pass Bills C-48 and C-49.

Bills C-48 and C-69 pose a real threat to Alberta interests and should not proceed as written. The Federal government should accept all amendments to Bill C-69 coming out of the Senate. The Federal government should scrap bill C-48 that would shut down all tanker traffic off the coast of BC but would not address similar traffic on the east coast of Canada.

So the Federal government announcement that the Trans Mountain pipeline will finally proceed is good news and let us hope that it is the first step towards ensuring that Alberta will once again become a partner in prosperity in this country we all love called Canada.

CHARGES LAID IN EIA SECURITY BREACH

The RCMP have laid charges against a male who breached security at the airport on May 29, 2019.

41-year-old Joel Edmund Garland of Edmonton is facing charges of mischief over \$5,000, endangering

the safety of an aircraft and uttering threats. Garland is scheduled to appear in Provincial Court of Alberta in Leduc on June 27, 2019.

BACKGROUND

Edmonton - RCMP at the Edmonton International Airport are investigating a security breach where a male passenger did not wait for

authorization to board his flight, and instead ran down the boarding ramp and on to the plane.

The plane was not occupied by any passengers at the time, and the flight crew was onboard in the process of completing their pre-flight briefings. The male uttered threats to the crew and, fearing for their safety, the flight crew safely removed themselves from the plane. The male then caused damage to a door on the aircraft before police arrived and took the male into custody without further incident.

A 41-year-old male is presently in police custody and charges are pending.

RCMP MAKE ARREST AT EDMONTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

CANADA REVENUE AGENCY

-- ACTION PLAN FOR SMALL AND MEDIUM SIZED BUSINESSES

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to inform small and medium sized businesses in the Yellowhead, that the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA), after consultations with businesses, accountants, industry associations, and CRA employees, has released a report outlining an action plan to deliver service and program improvements for small and medium sized businesses through 2021.

Some improvements include:

- Businesses will be able to sign up to receive an email confirmation when the CRA receives a document or a payment.
- Businesses will be able to upload up to ten documents at once in the Submit documents online service.
- A new "Pay" button in the online portals will allow businesses to pay outstanding balances with the click of a button.

- The Liaison Officer Service is being expanded to include incorporated businesses.
- The Dedicated Telephone Service for tax preparers is becoming a permanent program.
- More CRA correspondence will be available in the online portals.

The CRA is also working to ensure that businesses and accountants know when these improvements are available.

Businesses can receive a CRA security code by email, request a Liaison Officer visit, and provide their employees T4 slips in electronic format.

"I encourage all small and medium sized businesses in the Yellowhead to take a few minutes and go over the CRA Action Plan to see how it may improve your delivery service and your business", concluded MP Eglinski.










