RCMP ARREST MALE FOR NUMEROUS CHARGES IN MULTIPLE JURISDICTIONS

Spruce Grove, Alta. - On June 22, 2019 at 2:17 a.m., Parkland RCMP were dispatched to a report of a break and enter to a business located in the Spruce Grove Industrial Park. Entry had been gained to the business and a service vehicle had been stolen. The service vehicle had a tracking device. The vehicle was tracked to St. Albert, Alta. where St. Albert RCMP attempted to pull the vehicle over, but the suspect fled from police. The suspect drove the vehicle through multiple residential properties and then left the St. Albert area and proceeded to Morinville, Alta While in Morinville, the suspect committed several offences including, robbery, break and enter and theft. In a coordinated effort between Edmonton Police Service Air Services, Morinville, St. Albert and Parkland RCMP, the suspect was located and arrested without incident.

TRUDEAU LIBERALS FAIL TO SET CONSTRUCTION DATE FOR TRANS MOUNTAIN EXPANSION

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, today highlighted Justin Trudeau's failure to get the Trans Mountain Expansion built.

After a judicial hearing, Marler was remanded into custody. His first court appearance will be July 4, 2019 in Stony Plain Provincial Court.

The investigation is ongoing and further charges are pending.

"Incidents like this demonstrate how effective law enforcement is at working together to pursue those who threaten public safety and solve crime," said Inspector Mike Lokken, Parkland RCMP Detachment Commander. "Collaboration between enforcement agencies comes with its challenges, but everyone worked together and a prolific offender's crime spree was ended."



Edson and District Community Learning Society – Raelene Young, Community Liaison with the Edson and District Community Learning Society, presented to council regarding their new Settlement Services initiative. Ms. Young discussed the merits of the program to local residents, which offers help for newcomers to Edson, whether they are new to Canada or just the area. The initiative is meant to help newcomers find other services in the area, improve their English literacy through classes, aid them with filling out forms, and tutor them oneon-one. On the whole, the society hopes that this initiative will help create safe spaces for newcomers and root them into our communities.

presented to council in regards to his proposed venture. Mr. Martin seeks to build safe and sober housing for those recovering from substance abuse in the county and requested a letter of support from the county's council as well as funds for the down payment of his venture.

TC Energy - Cole Thomson, of TC Energy (formerly: TransCanada Energy), presented to council in regards to new developments within TC Energy's NOVA Gas Transmission Ltd. System. Mr. Thomson detailed new expansion (within the same footprint) of two compressor station projects and six pipeline sections. Mr. Thomson also reiterated the positive interactions between TC Energy's crew members and local communities as well as the local spending opportunities, community and social investment in the areas, and TC Energy's commitment to ensuring safe transportation on Hwy 16 and 40.

Baseline Road and Bridge File Tender – Council awarded the tender for Baseline Rd and BF 85347 (which includes grading, bridge file replacement, and other works) to Northern Road Builders LP in the amount of \$5,140,446.12. The work will cover approximately 9.8 km from Hwy 32 west to Range Rd. 145.

Landfill Bylaw Amendment – Council gave second and third reading to Bylaw 12.19 amending Land Use Bylaw 16.13, Landfill and Composting District. This amendment will require that a class 2 and 3 landfill be 1.5 km or greater from a residence. The provincial setback from a landfill to residences is 450 m.

Property Tax Agreement – Council moved to enter into a property tax agreement with Pine Cliff Energy Ltd. which must pay 50% of their 2019 tax amount owing by June 30, 2019. The remaining amount will be paid in 6 equal monthly instalments ending December 31, 2019.

The next Council Meeting is on July 9, 2019. The next Governance & Priorities Committee Meeting is on July 16, 2019. All meetings start at 9:30 a.m. in the Council Chamhers.

Seasonal allergies occur at the same time of the year, every year. Exposure to pollen and snow mold, a type of fungus on grass after snow melts, may cause allergic symptoms.

"Cleaning the inside of your nose with salt water, using a hu-

midifier in the bedroom and taking hot showers may help relieve symptoms," says Yvonne Ewanicke, a site manager at Health Link. "You can also try taking an over-the-counter antihistamine to relieve symptoms."

If symptoms continue, ask

your doctor if immunotherapy or allergy shots might help you. They help prevent and reduce allergies.

11 COMMUNITIES COME TOGETHER TO TACKLE ECONOMIC DIVERSIFICATION

Business diversification is a little like the weather – a lot of people talk about it but most feel not much can be done about it. However, it is essential to diversify our economy if we want to reduce exposure to the boom and bust cycles that Alberta knows well. Recognizing this, the communities of Swan Hills, Fox Creek, Whitecourt, Woodlands County, Mayerthorpe, Lac Ste. Anne County, Barrhead, County of Barrhead, Onoway, Alberta Beach and Westlock are working together to develop a cross-regional strategy to build a stronger, more diversified economy. The Strategy will help guide the efforts of these communities as they try to improve our Regional economy by bringing the right tools and resources to businesses.

Central to the project is Community Futures Yellowhead East – a federally-funded economic development agency whose mandate is to enable business growth and regional cooperation. Their General Manager, Michelle Jones is very excited about this project and said "Never before have I seen this many communities come together to resolve a common issue. This could well be a game-changer for our Region."

The project is being launched this week. 
