"The hub will serve the community and surrounding area providing recreational, social and cultural needs for years to come, fulfilling the County's goals and objectives identified in our hamlet re-investment strategy."

Yellowhead County Mayor Gerald Soroka had this to say about the initiative: "Yellowhead County and Parkland County are both deeply invested in improving the lives of our residents—that's why we are equal funding partners in this project. We're proud to have such a close and fruitful partnership and prouder still to jointly build a better future for our communities."

"This is a great addition to the Hamlet of Entwistle," said Mike Heck, Chief Administration Officer. "It will be a highlight for the community that will feature an outdoor pool with amenities for people of all ages, the Entwistle Library, and leasable tenant space, which will generate revenue for the County."

Construction is expected to begin late June 2019. The Entwistle Community Hub is anticipated to open June 2020.

The old Entwistle outdoor pool was past its lifecycle and required an update. The new Entwistle Community Hub will be located at the same location as the original Entwistle outdoor pool (4916 51 St, Entwistle, AB).

COMMUNITY EVENT TO PAY TRIBUTE TO LAKE WABAMUN

On Saturday, July 13 from 3:30-6:30, the Fallis Community Association (FCA) is hosting an appreciation BBQ and reception for the Wabamun Area Stewardship Association (WASA). The FCA also wishes to acknowledge the many other groups and individuals, that contributed to the successful efforts this spring, to oppose the proposed development of a 300 RV lot Ridge

Water Resort "Enroute and Destination Campground", situated on the north shore of Lake Wabamun, near the hamlet of Fallis. The event will be held at the Fallis Community Hall located just north of Highway 16, on Range Road 52.

The "Connect, Appreciate, and Learn" event will allow a great opportunity to network with others interested in protecting Lake Wabamun. The event will foster education, increase public awareness

to adopt practices to encourage and inspire individual accountability, and instill the value of responsible development around water bodies. Resource information booths will be set up by WASA, Alberta Fish and Game Association, Ducks Unlimited, Parkland County's Alternative Land Use Services (ALUS) and Green Acreages programs, Nature Alberta Living by Water, Alberta Land Management Society, Agroforestry and Woodlot Extension Society, and other organizations involved in preservation and conservation. Kids activities, raffles, a 50/50 draw, bar services, a slideshow profiling Lake Wabamun, and bird house kits to build provided by the Fish and Game Association will be available. The event is the collaboration of the Fallis Community Association's Community Engagement Committee and WASA.

The Fallis Community Association (FCA) recently created the Community Engagement Committee to better focus on its objects as a society. The Committee's charter outlines the FCA's objective for the committee to provide leader-

ship, education and networking in the community. Running the Hall takes a lot of time and energy of the Board of Directors and the creation of the Committee is intended to allow the Association to become more involved in issues that impact the local community without diverting time and attention from current Hall activities. In meeting its objectives, the Committee could become involved in networking sessions, educational forums and supporting local community initiatives. WASA is a non-profit organization with Incorporated Society status, and their vision and objective is to promote proper advocacy and steward-ship of land development of Lake Wabamun and area. They are not against development, however it is recognized that unregulated population and recreational growth impacts the Lake and the reasons people use it and live there. The primary concern of WASA is to maintain the integrity of the Lake, the watershed, and the delicately threatened ecosystem for the present and for future generations. 



