LANDFILL OPERATORS PLEAD GUILTY

The Town of Whitecourt and Woodlands County, operators of the Whitecourt Regional Solid Waste Management Authority, have each pleaded guilty to one count under the province's Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act.

In an agreed statement of facts, the parties admitted starting landfill alterations without first receiving permission. The remaining charges against the parties were withdrawn.

Sentencing

The Town of Whitecourt was penalized \$69,630 for its role in the offence; Woodlands County received \$30,370 penalty. The funds from this conviction will be used for two creative sentencing projects. One portion will see \$15,000 set aside for training for landfill operation and management. A second proj-

ect, for which \$80,000 will be diverted, will study how poplar trees aid in absorbing and cleaning waste-tainted water from the waste cells.

ALBERTA RCMP REITERATES WILDFIRE SAFETY MESSAGING

Edmonton – While various wildfires across Alberta continue to challenge firefighters, our police operations continue to be focused on keeping Albertans safe.

HOME CHILD CARE PROVIDER AND HOME SUPPORT WORKER

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to inform constituents that Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship is launching 2 new pilots that will help caregivers who come to this country make it their permanent home.

The Home Child Care Provider and Home Support Worker pilots will open for applications on June 18, 2019, replacing the expiring Caring for Children and Caring for People with High Medical Needs pilots.

Caregivers will now only receive a work permit if they have a job offer in Canada and meet standard criteria for economic immigration programs. Once working in Canada, caregivers will be able to begin gaining the required two years of Canadian work experience to apply for permanent residence.

Through these new pilots, caregivers will also benefit from:

• occupation-specific work permits, rather than employer-specific, to allow for a fast change of employers when necessary;

• open work permits and/or study permits for the caregivers' immediate family, to help families come to Canada together; and

* a clear transition from temporary to permanent status, to ensure that once caregivers have met the work experience requirement, they will be able to become permanent residents quickly.

"This will provide caregivers

from abroad and their families with a clear, direct pathway to permanent residence," concluded MP Eglinski.

The expiring pilots will close to new applications on June 18, 2019. Caregivers who have applied before this date will continue to have their applications processed through to a final decision.

BLUE-GREEN ALGAE BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR LAC STE. ANNE

Submitted by Alberta Health Services

A blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) bloom has been identified in areas of Lac Ste. Anne. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

- Avoid all contact with bluegreen algae (cyanobacteria) blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.
- Do not swim or wade (or allow your pets to swim or wade) in any areas where blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) is visible.
- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.
- Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Lac Ste. Anne, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by blue-green algae. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Blue-green algae is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz or globs on the surface of water, blue-green algae can be blue-green, green-ish-brown, brown, and/or pink-ish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.



People who come in contact with visible blue-green algae or who ingest water containing blue-green algae may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms.

Weather and wind conditions

can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Lac Ste. Anne, until further notice.

Please note that areas of Lac Ste. Anne in which the bluegreen algae bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this blue-green algae Health Advisory is in place.

YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND SKILLS STRATEGY (YESS) FUNDING

RCMP MAKE ARREST AT EDMONTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Edmonton - On June 18 at approximately 7 p.m., the Edmonton International Airport Detachment responded to a call for service in relation to a male in distress in the airport parkade.

During the course of the investigation, it was revealed that the 41-year-old male from Edmonton was wanted on an outstanding arrest warrant. He was taken into RCMP custody and transported to the airport detachment. While in custody, the male became extremely agitated and the responding members were required to restrain him and take him through the airport to a police vehicle for transport to an Edmonton hospital.

During transport, an incident arose that required RCMP to stop roadside to subdue the male, resulting in a Conducted Energy Weapon being deployed.

Edmonton Police Service responded to assist, along with EMS. Once the situation was under control, members were able to continue transport the hospital.

The investigation into this incident continues by both the RCMP and Alberta Serious Incident Response Team. No further information will be made available by RCMP.

RESOLUTION OF ENVIRONMENTAL CHARGES RELATED TO WHITECOURT REGIONAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

Submitted by Town of Whitecourt & Woodlands County – July 10, 2019

The Town of Whitecourt (Town), and Woodlands County (County), as the joint operators of the Whitecourt Regional Solid Waste Management Authority (Authority), were each issued penalties pursuant to an offence under the Alberta Environmen-

tal Protection and Enhancement Act. The penalties resulted from charges pertaining to environmental upgrades initiated at the Whitecourt Regional Landfill in 2016 to extend the lifespan and capacity of the facility.

The Authority began work on the Whitecourt Regional Landfill Environmental Upgrades Project in 2015. The project, which will be completed in six phases, includes the development of new cells and a new leachate collection system which will extend the lifespan of the facility by 39 years. After identifying and resolving the process and communication issues which led to the charges in question, the Authority worked with Alberta Environment to amend the project approval, and successfully completed Phase 1

of the upgrades project in 2017. The Authority takes protection of the environment seriously and took immediate steps to improve its procedures to guard against the possibility of future issues arising. In addition, the Authority worked with Alberta Environment approval staff on the completion of the project to incorporate elements that meet or exceed current best practices, while ensuring the environment was protected at all times.

The Town and County will also collectively contribute \$15,000 for training landfill managers on leachate management, in addition to fines imposed on each of the Town and County that total \$5,000 under the Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act.

The Town, County, and Authority will all continue to work to meet the public's expectations that operations meet the highest standards of compliance and environmental protection are met.

er was remanded into custody. His first court appearance will be July 4, 2019 in Stony Plain Provincial Court.


The investigation is ongoing and further charges are pending.




