

EVANSBURG RCMP ISSUE PUBLIC SAFETY ADVISORY RE: TUBING ON PEMBINA RIVER

Evansburg RCMP are issuing a public safety message following an influx of search and rescue operations along the Pembina River.

This summer, Evansburg RCMP have already safely resolved several complaints involving stranded people along the Pembina River.

Visitors and residents of the

area who are wishing to tube the Pembina River are reminded to take extra steps and be prepared for their journey:

- Know the area, review maps and understand how long your journey will take
- Notify a responsible person where you are going, who you are with, and the route you plan on taking
- Dress appropriately for the weather, including use of a wet suit when necessary

- · Wear a life jacket
- · Avoid consuming alcohol
- Bring a cell phone and store it properly for the conditions

Corporal Brandon Tobin, Operations Supervisor at Evansburg Detachment says: "I've had a number of people tell me that they were under the impression that the river either ran in a circle or looped back around towards the Provincial Park, this is false information.

If you're planning on tubing on the river DO NOT enter the river at the Provincial Park Campgrounds, I can't stress that enough, The Park is where you must exit the river. If you enter the river at this location or float past the park, you WILL be stranded. In fact, last weekend Evansburg Detachment had to request assistance from the RCMP's Air Services to fly two stranded tubers out of the river bed. This incident tied up resources that may have been needed for emergencies elsewhere. We encourage people to enjoy the river, but do so responsibly. "

The funding includes:

• \$1.9 million over three years to the Canadian Hospice Palliative Care Association to help Canadians prepare for their future health care needs, including through public education and awareness, community workshops, and a renewed strategy to promote advance care planning. • \$2 million over three years to the Canadian Virtual Hospice to expand existing virtual services and resources for palliative care and grief support to meet the needs of underserved communities, including families caring for a dying child, Francophones, and LGBTQ2 communities.


• \$600,000 over two years to the Canadian Home Care Association to help improve delivery of palliative care at home and communication with patients, families, and caregivers.

At 4:30 there will be a magic show by John Darke. At around, 5:00 there will be commemoration of a Hills of Hope sign detailing the history of the original building as the Fallis School House. In addition, there will be acknowledgments of the contribution of the many members and partners who have contributed to the Association. This will be followed by a free BBQ at 5:30and then music by Mike White and Friends. In addition, there will be activities for the kids and cake later in the evening.

Laurence Waring, the president of the FCA, notes that "70 years demonstrates a measure of staying power and continuity in the association and its role in the local community." Recently, the hall has been substantially renovated. While there are still a few more projects to complete, over the last year the hall as a new metal roof, new flooring and several structural issues have been addressed. If you haven't been in the hall recently, this is a great opportunity to visit and see the improvements. One of the objectives of the FCA is to increase the usage of the particularly during the mid-weeks.

The FCA has been providing community-based programming for 70 years. In the recent past, the hall has hosted a number of community events including dances in the spring and fall, Christmas Concert, Fathers' Day Chili-Cook off and Mothers' Day Champagne Brunch. Members are treated to an annual Member Appreciation Dinner and can rent the hall on a discounted basis. A major fund-raising event of the FCA is the annual Show and Shine which will be on September 7th this year. Over the years the FCA has also sponsored several educational

forums. Recently the FCA has established a Community Engagement Committee which is looking to develop a number of programs and events that can help members of the local community understand and influence change around them. On August 21st, the FCA will be hosting a BBQ and Fire Smart session at the hall. This will introduce residents to the Fire Smart program and using the hall as an example learn how you can make changes to mitigate the impact of a wild fire on your own home. Also this summer, the FCA is offering a Kidz Zone every Tuesday morning for kids to come out and enjoy a variety of interesting programming. Finally, the FCA is working with program provid-


ers to enhance what is available through the hall. This summer Empower Events has run a week long half day Kids Cooking Camp and will be running a one day art camp Wednesday July



FARM FREEDOM AND SAFETY ACT: HAVE YOUR SAY ON FARM AND RANCH SAFETY AND WORKPLACE LEGISLATION.

Our government has initiated comprehensive consultations with farmers, ranchers, agriculture workers, and others as we move forward with the new proposed Farm Freedom and Safety Act.

The new legislation will address:

- Ensuring basic safety standards.
- Recognizing that a farm is unlike other businesses, and that farmers and ranchers require flexibility in meeting workplace standards.

- Minimizing red tape and the regulatory burden on farmers and ranchers.
- Requiring employers to have workplace insurance, but allowing a choice of market insurance or the Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) as long as basic standards of coverage are met.
- Exempting small farms from employment standards legislation.

We are committed to restoring balance, fairness and common sense to the regulation of Alberta's agriculture sector. Farm and ranch operations have unique needs that are unlike other industries. We need legislation that balances the unique economic pressures of farming with the need for common sense, flexible farm safety and employment legislation.

Alberta Agriculture and Forestry is leading a range of stakeholder consultation opportunities throughout the summer. Watch for Agriculture and Forestry Minister Devin Dreeshen at events in our community, and take that opportunity to connect with him and share your opinion.

INVESTIGATION INTO INJURY FOLLOWING 2018 ARREST

On June 14, 2019, ASIRT was directed to investigate the circumstances surrounding a complaint

that a woman had sustained an injury following an RCMP arrest approximately 10 months earlier.

On June 12, 2019, a 28-year-old woman filed a complaint with the RCMP that she sustained a broken arm during a Stony Plain RCMP ar-

rest that occurred on Aug. 25, 2018. The RCMP notified the director of law enforcement, as required under the Police Act, which led to ASIRT being directed to investigate.

With ASIRT's investigation underway, no further information will

be provided.

ASIRT's mandate is to effectively, independently and objectively investigate incidents involving Alberta's police that have resulted in serious injury or death to any person.



PREVENTING HEPATITIS B

World Hepatitis Day is July 28. Close to 300 million people around the world live with a hepatitis B infection.

It is potentially life-threatening and is spread through blood or body fluids from an infected person

What is it?

Hepatitis B is a liver disease caused by a virus. It is the leading cause of liver cancer.

What are the symptoms?

Symptoms include tiredness, poor appetite, nausea and vomiting, stomach and joint pain, dark-coloured urine and light-coloured stool and yellowing of eyes and skin.

Who is at risk?

Activities such as unprotected sex, sharing needles, tattooing or acupuncture put people at increased risk. In some countries, medical treatments and blood products may also be a source of infection.

Is there a vaccine to help prevent illness?

Yes, there is a vaccine available for all ages. A vaccine series against hepatitis B is 95- to 100-per-cent effective in preventing infection caused by the virus before exposure and for at least 30 years following immunization. DON'T LET GOLFING PAIN BE PAR FOR THE COURSE

(NC) A little know-how can help golfers avoid unnecessary injury. Considering the number of times a swing is repeated during a game, it's not surprising that the season often ends early for those who are not physically prepared.

Below are a few simple stretching techniques that can help prevent or reduce the impact of injuries:

Side bending stretch

- 1. Stand with feet shoulder-width apart.
- 2. Hold the golf club above your head with your arms straight.
- 3. Slowly bend to one side, without rotating, until you feel a stretch in the side of your back.
- 4. Hold for 15 seconds and repeat twice for each side.

Shoulder stretch

- 1. Hold the shaft of a golf club vertically behind your back.
- 2. Gently pull the club up with your top hand until you feel a slight stretch in the shoulder of your lower arm. Hold for 15 seconds.
- 3. Gently pull the club down with your bottom hand until you feel a stretch in the top shoulder and arm.
- 4. Hold for 15 seconds.
- 5. Reverse hand positions and repeat.

CHANGES TO CANNABIS LICENSING PROCESS

Submitted by Jim Eglinski, MP – Yellowhead

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, wishes to inform constituents that Health Canada is introducing changes to align the approach to cannabis licensing with the approach for other regulated sectors, such as pharmaceuticals.

Effective immediately, this will require new applicants for licences to cultivate cannabis, process cannabis, or sell cannabis for medical purposes to have a fully built site that meets all the requirements of the Cannabis Regulations at the time of their application, as well as satisfying other application criteria.

To support applicants, Health Canada:

- made available additional guidance on the licence application process and on the regulatory requirements regarding Good Production Practices and physical security measures.
- · is working to establish service

standards for the review of applications, which will increase predictability for applicants.

- will continue to provide enhanced support to Indigenous-affiliated applicants through its Indigenous Navigator Service.
- will implement additional measures to support applicants applying for a micro-class licence and,
- will work closely with new and existing licence applicants to ensure that they are aware of the new application requirements.

There are no changes to the regulatory requirements, and Health Canada will continue to inspect all facilities before a licence to sell products to the public is issued.

"New applicants should be aware that these changes are effective immediately," concluded MP Eglinski.




