

NDP CALLS ON MINISTER DREESHEN TO SUPPORT LAC STE. ANNE FARMERS

Submitted by Alberta's NDP Caucus

LAC STE. ANNE - Farmers and agricultural producers need support after excessive rainfall caused flooding in the County of Lac Ste. Anne prompting local officials to declare an agricultur-

al state of emergency.

Flooding has resulted in damaged fields, county infrastructure and landowner properties and has impacted almost all crops in the municipality.

"It is critical that all agricultural producers know that their government has their back during a crisis like this," said Lorne Dach NDP Agriculture and Forestry Critic and MLA for Edmonton-McClung. "I am calling on Agriculture Minister Devin Dreeshen to act immediately to help the community deal with this state of emergency."

Farmers and Ranchers in Lac

Ste. Anne County are growing increasingly concerned about the fate of the 2019 crop year as rainfall continues. Livestock needs feed, and producers need a plan from this government to manage this emergency.

NATIONAL STRATEGY FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

OTTAWA: Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise constituents that the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness, the Honourable Ralph Goodale, announced the expansion of the National Strategy for the Protection of Children from Sexual Exploitation on the Internet.

These include:

- \$2.09M to intensify our engagement with digital industry leaders to help them maintain their focus, develop new tools online and support effective operating principles;
- \$4.9M to increase prevention activities, such as more research, public engagement, awareness and collaboration with partners; and

• \$15.25M to enhance the capacity of Internet Child Exploitation Units in provincial and municipal police forces, and initiatives to inform and upgrade the work of prosecutors.

This funding will support Public Safety's (PS) efforts towards the four pillars of the National Strategy: raising awareness of this serious issue; reducing the stigma associated with reporting; increasing Canada's ability

to pursue and prosecute offenders; and working together with industry to find new ways to combat the sexual exploitation of children online.

"All children deserve to feel safe, both online and offline," concluded MP Eglinski.

Current conditions have also created an inability for local producers to harvest livestock feed. High humidity and the inability to access waterlogged fields have severely limited the amount feed harvested to this point, with no forecasted change in sight. The small inventory of feed that has been harvested has been put up in poor condition with degraded feed value and potential storage issues.

There is increasing desperation among the Farmers and Ranchers within Lac Ste. Anne County as they continue to watch the daily accumulation of rainfall further inhibit the 2019 crop year.

Of the 2,005 households surveyed:
• 90% report being generally satisfied with their current home Internet provider, while customers of independent providers are more likely to

be very satisfied;

- 1 in 3 households that considered switching providers in the past two years actually made a switch; and
- 66% of households bundle their internet with at least one other service, but only 17% of those bundles

include wireless phone services.

"More choice between providers will allow many Canadians, especially in rural areas of the Yellowhead, to choose a plan that meets their needs related to cost, network speeds and quality of service," con-

cluded MP Eglinski.

These issues were investigated by Professional Engineers and determined to be caused by swelling of high plastic clay that the building is situated on.

Following this assessment, recommendations to regrade

and redirect surface water were implemented, and the slab heaving appeared to have stabilized. However, despite these remediation measures, the building has experienced an exacerbation of the problems.

As the resolution process with the appropriate parties may require legal proceedings, the County is limited in the information that can be shared until such issues and/or proceedings are resolved. As such, County Council and Administration are not presently able to respond to any information requests pertaining to the outstanding issues with the Administration Building.

The County will make every effort to provide updates on the situation, as approved by its legal advisors. Ratepayers are thanked for their understanding and cooperation regarding this matter.



NEW RESERVE INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT PROGRAM

WARNING - SCAMS USING CBSA CREDENTIALS

The Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) is warning the public about ongoing email, text messages or telephone scams in which people posing as officials from the CBSA are asking for personal information, including Social Insurance Number (SIN). The methods used by the scammers to communicate with the public, and the rational provided to justify being in contact with the victim, are varied, ever changing, but always designed to lure the public into providing personal information.

In some cases, these scams use false CBSA information. Telephone calls may display numbers and employee names that appear to be from the CBSA. Emails may contain CBSA logos, email addresses or employee names and titles to mislead the readers.

It is important to note that the CBSA never initiates a request for social insurance number and credit card number by telephone or email. If an individual receives a telephone call or an email asking for this information, or requesting payments from the CBSA, it is a scam.

It is important to be vigilant. These calls or emails should be ignored and reported to appropriate authorities. If you have received this type of call, please report it to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre.

The 4-H Mission is to develop youth as self-reliant, contributing individuals with marketable skills.

There are five requirements for members to complete their year - they must participate in a Communications Activity as well as a Community Service activity, complete a Project by handing in a Record Book, attend 70% of all club activities and attend the year end Achievement Day. Pretty simple, right? And 4-H offers so much! Members will have the opportunity to attend camps, to apply for Awards and Scholarships, to win trips and perhaps go on exchanges with another club in a different part of the country. And putting 4-H experience on a resume is a great way to get the interviewer's attention!

The members and their parents take an active role in how their 4-H club evolves. Our meetings are run by both the parents and the members; in fact, the executive positions are held by members. Not only do the members have a say in how the individual projects look, they also have the opportunity to decide on things like community service, fundraising opportunities and fun

days, amoung others.

Speaking of fun days: over the past three years, Lakewell members have gone to Camp Warwa and Camp YoWoChas for teambuilding days; we have been to Galaxyland, had a bowling party in Wabamun and a yearend party down by the Pembina River; there have been District Fun Days at East End Park In Whitecourt and the Curling Rink in Mayerthorpe. Each year the Members, Cleavers, parents and leaders have the opportunity to attend the Regional Lifeskills Fair, where they can choose activities from a large diverse menu that ranges from making Wood Signs, to Line Dancing to Car mechanics and beyond.

And the projects - they are not just about animals! There are over 40 projects in the 4-H library including Foods, Sewing, Quilting, Woods, Vet Sciences, as well as the more well-known ones such as Horse, Beef and Sheep. For the uncertain, there

is a project called 'Exploring 4-H' which involves picking 6-8 project areas and exploring each one. This particular project is one I find intriguing and would like to see some members chose this year.
